Complex blood donors establish new record

A grand total of 472 blood units were donated by DPMC folks during the recently completed fall campaign.

"That breaks the previous record of 469 donations during the fall of 1981," states Kali Schneider of Personnel Services, who served as coordinator of the fall-1982 drive. "And, it should be a source of great satisfaction for all of us to know that more than 800 patients already have been helped by our donations," she enthusiastically adds.

Explaining how 472 units of blood can help more than 800 patients, Schneider points out that whole blood consists of several components that perform different functions. Among those components are red cells, plasma and platelets.

The DPMC blood donors not only helped more than 800 patients, but also did a favor for themselves and fellow Complex employees. That favor is continued coverage under Life Plan Two, for which the Complex remains eligible because our people donated a total of 928 units during the two blood drives of 1982, and that exceeds the minimum 25 percent of employees required by the plan.

Life Plan Two provides two levels of coverage for DPMC folks who require blood. Those who have donated blood are covered for both recruitment fee and processing fee. Non-donors are covered for

recruitment fees.

Looking at the blood drive of fall 1982 geographically, a similar number of units came from the North and South sides of the Complex. Donations numbering 226 came from the South Side on November 1, 2, 3, and 5. On the North Side, 246 units were collected November 8-11. Of course, there was some donor travel back and forth to

solve individual scheduling problems.

The overall 1982 total of 928 units donated is also a record high for the DPMC blood drives, which go back to 1973.

As for the latest campaign, Coordinator Schneider says: "Our donors are performing a vital service for the community by giving of themselves to help others in need."


