"We Killed A Bear" Says United Nations Spokesman

Referring to the farce in Korea in which a truce was signed which will probably last until the Reds reshuffle and strengthen their forces, John Foster Dulles went to great pains to give full credit to the United Nations for having "resisted aggression".

"For the first time in history an international organization has stood against an aggressor and has marshaled force to meet force" he said in Washington.

We wonder who he thinks he's kidding.

In the first place it was not a United Nations war since the United States furnished ninety per cent of the fighting men aside from the South Korean forces, and also most of the money to finance it.

In the second place the enemy who pumped the "aggression" and who pumped supplies into Red China daily to enable them to carry on the fight was sitting right there in the United Nations. Other nations in the outfit who claimed to be our "allies" were furnishing all the material to the Chinese Communists that Russia could not supply to aid in the killing of American soldiers.

And still we are expected to shut our eyes and pretend that the United Nations stood solidly "against aggression" when the plain unvarnished truth is that, outside of South Korea, the United States was practically alone in the fight and most of the other members of the United Nations were helping the enemy.

The movement in behalf of young Roosevelt is believed to have been sparked by his non-English-speaking constituents and is reported to have gathered great momentum along the New York waterfront.

With outrageous taxes, inflation, drouth and a threatened epidemic of stink bugs in our Fall gardens, surely the long-suffering American people will not be called on to undergo the horror of another Roosevelt holding forth in the public forums, flashing his buck teeth and wowing us with smart cracks.

As citizens, we have been derelict in our duty and have strayed away from the path of righteousness in discharging our obligations to the Republic but surely there must be some other way of punishing us for our sins.

Unless an aroused people can penetrate the thick skulls of Washington leaders, pound some sense into their muddled heads and prod them into patriotic action, this Republic is headed straight for the Cemetery of Dead Nations. In comparison with them, a Russian-born spy coming here to frankly ply his trade in the interest of World Communism, is a high type of loyal citizenship and a noble specimen of the human race.

For the enlightenment of those naive, carefree and slap-happy Americans who go merrily on their way with no concern whatever for the fate of their country, we wish we were able to relate the sordid story of betrayal, step by step, as it has unfolded during the past twenty years, but this is an impossible task.

Immigration Act to be Voided On Request from White House

The McCarran-Walter Immigration Law now in effect was the result of five years of conscientious research by members of Congress and various government agencies to set up a workable and fair method of preventing Communist spies from flocking here as they have done for twenty years.

The bill was overwhelmingly passed by both Houses of Congress and had the approval of all responsible groups in this country. It has been opposed and fought from the first by American Communists and fellow travellers including Americans for Democratic Action, National Council of Churches, the CIO and other similar bodies who can be depended on to come to the rescue when the privileges and prerogatives of anti-American forces are threatened.

The effectiveness of the Act is to be largely negated through the passage by Congress of a special bill which the president asked to be enacted which will open the doors to 214,000 more foreigners, many of them from behind the Iron Curtain.

The extraordinary reason advanced by the president for letting these additional refugees in was that it would serve as a weapon in fighting Communism.

Well, letting Communists come in to fight Communism is no more illogical we suppose than the policy of the racial propagandists and opponents of segregation who propose to eliminate Communism by adopting the practices which Communists advocate.

It's a great world if you don't weaken, but we must admit we are getting shaky in the knees.

They Eliminate One Agency And Set Up Another

We were strong in our praise of the administration for deciding to end the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, but it seems we were a little premature in our commendations.

They are going to end the RFC all right but in its place they are setting up another agency with authority to make loans up to \$200,000 each to small businesses.

It is explained that the president wanted the agency established in order to "help his administration achieve its objective of 'encouraging and developing small business'".

We respectively point out that small business got along all right for more than a hundred and fifty years without governmental props and any way, it was our understanding that this administration was going to take government out of private business.

UNITED NATIONS IS A SINISTER SET-UP

The United Nations is a "sinister and despicable symbol of new internationalism" Donald R. Wilson, former National Commander of the American Legion told a convention of the Kentucky Oil and Gas Association in Lexington recently.

In urging that this country abandon the U.N., Wilson said:

"It is time that we have done with this foolish plaything which has already robbed us of much of our power, has shattered our dignity and must soon leave even our honor in tatters."

AN AMERICAN PATRIOT HAS A PIPE-DREAM

One of the best Americans we know remarked to us wistfully not long ago that it would have been a glorious thing for this Republic if the Republicans at Chicago last year had nominated General Douglas MacArthur for president and Senator Joe McCarthy for vice president.

In that event, he pointed out, the road back to Constitutional government would have been direct and there would have been no Socialistic by-passes and detours and no appeasement of those who have brought the country to the brink of ruin.

That is only wishful thinking, of course, and it is pointless to indulge in it. We have to work with what we have and we can only hope and pray that enough patriots can make their influence felt in high places to the extent that it will off-set the effects of those who are working with redoubled efforts for the destruction of the American form of government.

TEXAS PRESBYTERIANS MAKE SENSE

The Dallas Presbytery, a church court composed of white Presbyterian churches, has instituted a movement which is expected to result in the building of a beautiful and modern church for Negroes in Dallas.

The Presbyterians have raised more than \$2,000,000 in this State to be used in furthering religious activities among colored people and to improve Negro education.

This denomination has apparently faced the issue in a common sense and realistic manner and is sincerely trying to aid the colored race without going off the deep end, as so many denominations have done, and accepting the Communist proposal for indiscriminate mixing of the races.

It is to be hoped that, in the South at least, this wholesome and sensible attitude will be adopted by other creeds and denominations who really want to help the Negro people, rather than aiding in the spread of Communist practices.

say they're stupid. They have outsmarted our leaders too many times for us to make any such foolish claim.

Their "peaceful revolution" carried on in this country for more than twenty years—but which made little headway until Roosevelt came on the scene—has successfully enlisted under their banner so many highly-placed Americans that no group or sub-division of our society is now free from the evil influence of these world conspirators.

If substantiating evidence of this is needed, we have only to consider the vicious attacks from hundreds of sources on the members of investigating committees of Congress who seek to weed out Communists from government and schools, similar denunciations of our immigration laws designed to keep out Communist spies and organized opposition to every measure proposed for the internal security of the United States.

In each instance, they have descended on Washington like a pack of coyotes howling to high heaven against infringement on "academic freedom," "civil rights" and "freedom of speech" as it affects Communists and fellow travellers but they never opened their big fat mouths in opposition to the betrayal of their country by these subversive rats.

All this has been going on for years and is nothing new and it is only the fact that subversive activities are being redoubled and increased in intensity which is chilling the hearts of good Americans with fear.

Roosevelt and Truman were so dedicated in their blind devotion to Stalin and so determined to shape our laws and policies of government toward his Marxist ideals that it was impossible for the opposition to break down Communist influence in Washington but we were given to understand that Eisenhower would reverse the trend and head us back toward the principles on which this Republic was founded.

His bitter attacks on the McCarthy Committee in the Matthews affair, his approval of the stacking of German libraries with Communist books by the State Department, his request for the admission of 240,000 aliens in violation of the McCarran-Walter Immigration law, his insistence that the Senate refuse to pass the Bricker amendment to protect our sovereignty, his appointment of left-wingers to high position and similar astounding actions, seem to rob us of any hope from that source.

It is possible, of course, that he is confused over the horrible mess created and bequeathed him by Truman and it may be that—God willing—he will yet make good on his pledges to the American people. Millions of his supporters hoped—and many believed—that he would prove to be a strong leader who would retrieve the government from the tragic errors of two Socialist administrations.

It is also claimed in some quarters that he is face to face with forces which he is unable to successfully combat, a contingency which Senator Jenner foresaw some two years ago.

At that time the Indiana lawmaker stated in a public address that no matter who was elected president, and regardless of how honorable he was or how good his intentions, he could not cope with the subversive Colossus so firmly entrenched in the city along the banks of the Potomac.

Personally, we have no patience with this viewpoint. It is true that Washington is seething with subversion and that national groups and organizations who function in behalf of Internationalism and World Communism stand ready to attempt the ruin of any public figure who opposes them.

But the American government belongs to the people and not to any class or group, minority or otherwise. Neither does it belong to the president or the members of Congress who are merely the servants chosen to administer its affairs.

If a sufficient number of plain, every-day, honest Americans are thoroughly awakened to the peril of continued infiltration of our institutions by Communists, they can put iron in the spines of our leaders and compel them either to act or step aside and let those take over who can.

In the meantime, we suggest that all good Americans pray for the president of the United States in the hope that he may acquire understanding of the serious responsibility facing him and the courage to cut away the dead timber surrounding him and replace them with red-blooded, patriotic and unafraid Americans who can insure the accomplishments which he solemnly promised but which he has, so far, failed to achieve.

The Federal government does not have a thin dime of its own and can only use the taxpayers' money to dole out relief and any one who takes this money is admitting his own inability to care for himself and is asking for public help which is charity regardless of what you call it.

And any one who thinks Washington politicians are going to put out money without any strings attached is touched in the head. That assumption is as silly as that of some school teachers who have insisted that we could have Federal aid to schools without Federal control of schools.

The ranchers of the West, and especially those of Texas, have always been the most independent and self-reliant of all God's creatures and to see them meekly trudging to Washington for help in a temporary disaster, is discouraging indeed to those Americans who have been hoping and praying that the day would come when Washington would keep its nose out of the private business of the citizen.

Farmers and ranchmen have had crop failures and other occupational hazards from the beginning of time and they survived the ordeal but now they run to Washington for "drouth relief" when it fails to rain and for "flood relief" when it rains too much.

If the State government can and will make loans to them, well and good, but we had just as well stop talking about Constitutional government until our most substantial and reliable class of citizens get it through their skulls that there are Constitutional limitations to the power of the Federal government and that it is not its function to underwrite the expenses of the individual; or to guarantee him freedom from various forms of bad luck which may assail him and his family including drouth, flood, rheumatism, seven-year itch or diaper rash.

"The agents of these destructive (Communist) forces are at work in America—operating through thousands of channels and in hundreds of ways. We have already endured many vicious attacks against our Constitutional form of government, against our institutions and against Christianity. Recent Administrations have completely tolerated the insidious influences at work among our youth, labor unions and government personnel. Some have laughed at the suggestion of danger—it is all right, it is proof of our freedom!—But as the power of these forces has grown, the people have been forced to face the realities and to become increasingly alert for 'Eternal Vigilance is the Price of Liberty', while a do-nothing attitude will hasten the complete downfall of our American way of life . . ."—National Republic.

The Failure to Pass the Bricker Amendment Is A Cowardly Betrayal of the American People

The Eighty-third Congress adjourned without passage of the Bricker amendment in the Senate which would void any treaty that conflicts with the American Constitution.

The failure to pass this amendment was a definite victory for subversive world forces who are working hard — and effectively — to destroy the sovereignty of the American Republic and make it a puppet state with the status of those nations who are now behind the Iron Curtain.

The most tragic and alarming aspect of the matter, and the one which makes thoughtful Americans tremble for the future of the country, is that this amendment would have been passed long ago except for a request from the president, delivered to the Senate by John Foster Dulles, that it not be enacted.

The reason given by the White House and Department of State for opposing this amendment is too ridiculous for any informed person to accept — their excuse being that these two agencies could not carry out our foreign policy if they had to submit all kinds of agreements with other nations to Congress which would be the case if the amendment passes.

We are willing to concede that this is another case where the president does not have the faintest understanding of the subject and that he is being led by others like a bull with a ring in his nose. In other words, he, of course, is not deliberately and knowingly holding up this legislation from a desire to break down our national sovereignty and make us subservient to a world organization.

But John Foster Dulles, who has worked hand-in-glove with Acheson, Hiss, Lattimore and other one-worlders for years, does know what it means and recognizes the danger wherein the United Nations can tear down the internal structure of this country by signing a treaty and securing ratification by our Senate. He knows full well that, as our Constitution now stands in which a treaty is superior to provisions in that document, that the United Nations can override all local and municipal laws and all state and national laws in this country.

The failure to pass the amendment represents an instance of arrant cowardice on the part of the members of the Senate who, after all, are the real guardians of the nation's security and the side-stepping of their responsibilities to the American people to an extent which has not been witnessed since Roosevelt used to browbeat them into submission and force them to pass anti-American legislation which any school child should have known was inimical to the interests of this Republic.

To show how complete and abject was the surrender of the Senate, we have only to remember that some sixty-five out of the ninety-six members of that body signed the Bricker amendment, thereby insuring its passage until sinister world forces stepped in and stopped it.

Alton Lennon is the new Senator from North Carolina and from some of his cracks on arriving in Washington, it appears that State has elected another Frank Graham. He says he doesn't like the way the McCarthy Committee is conducting its investigations into Communist activities. Neither do the Communists whom McCarthy is flushing out.

Oxnam Pops Off And Proves Nothing At All

It was pretty silly for members of the Un-American Activities Committee of the House of Representatives to issue a statement that G. Bromley Oxnam, left-wing church politician, was not a member of the Communist Party.

Of course he is not a member of the Communist Party. Nobody ever claimed that he was.

If he carried a card, he would be of no use whatever to the Cause. As a member of numerous Communist fronts, however, he has done more to help break down the American form of government than a thousand who pay dues and attend meetings.

It is a good time for Americans to get it through their heads that this Republic is in no danger whatever from actual Communists who openly admit their membership in the Party. All the damage this nation has suffered has been from the despicable, contemptible and cowardly non-members of the party in high position in this country who seek to initiate the corrupt policies of the Kremlin here.

One of Oxnam's ridiculous arguments to support his contention that he was a good, sound patriotic American was his statement that he has been president of the World Council of Churches. Ye gods. Why didn't somebody read him the resolutions of the World Council of Churches at Amsterdam some years ago where they went out of their way to denounce "Capitalism" on which our system of government is based.

Another argument was that he had held responsible jobs and commissions from the Federal government but nobody reminded him that Alger Hiss had too.

Oxnam blustered into the committee room, accompanied by his gallery and bringing his own applause, in the hope of bluffing the committee with his importance and following and the tragedy of it is that he didn't altogether fail.

If they had confronted him with his record, including passages from his own books denouncing Free Enterprise and urging National and World Socialism—which is practically identical with Communism—and had told him what was what instead of letting him pop off and play to the grandstand, the public would have been given a much more accurate picture of this gent and his activities for the past thirty years.

A consecrated man of God is deserving of all the reverence and respect which can be bestowed on a mortal being but a creature like Oxnam who uses the pulpit to advance subversive political theories, who openly defies legitimate investigating committees of Congress and advises others to do likewise, is entitled to nothing but wholesome contempt of his fellow men.

The Committee on Un-American Activities enjoys the respect and confidence of every American who has the interest of this country at heart, but in order to keep it, they will have to show more courage, independence and firmness the next time some pot-bellied Bishop comes charging in trying to overpower them with his interrogated portance and intimidate them or refuse the applause of his fellow members in the Communist gang.

England Boasts of Increasing Trade With Communist China

With typical British arrogance, the London Board of Trade has released a bulletin which practically boasts of their increasing trade with Red China despite, as the bulletin says, "American congressional complaints".

Furthermore, it was reaffirmed that it will be Britain's policy to continue this trade and to develop "such non-strategic trade with the Peiping government and any other Communist nations."

At the same time it was announced that a team of British business men will come out of China soon with contracts worth \$36,600,000. This will be in addition to \$15,680,000 worth of business between the two countries during the first five months of this year which they brazenly pointed out almost trebled their business for the same period last year.

So there we have the picture and we can take it or leave it. There is no such thing as "non-strategic" materials and every dollar's worth of products sent to Communist China from Britain or any other country was used, in one form or another, in the killing of American soldiers.

What will we do about it?

The procedure so far — and there is no indication that it will be changed in the foreseeable future — is to repay this treachery with additional loans to our English "allies" and, by that token, reaffirm our national policy of aiding our enemies to kill our own soldiers.

What, we wonder, will it take to jolt us into a realization of the criminal stupidity of our national leaders who are proving increasingly that they are nothing more than puppets in the hands of world planners who seek the destruction of the American Republic.

EXTRA! ECONOMICS PROFESSOR WRITES A SOUND TEXTBOOK

One of the reasons our country is in the deep, sorrowful trouble that faces it today is because the American people have sat back with their teeth in their mouth for twenty years, have said nothing and acted like dumb oxen as slick scoundrels in Washington surrendered our rights and liberties one by one, buried us under a tax burden from which we will never emerge, dabbled in Socialism and meddled in foreign affairs which were none of their business until they had earned us the contempt of all the rest of the world.

Wherever it was that we intended, in our subconscious mind, to go we did not get there. Instead we plunged down a twenty-foot stairway and landed in a heap at the bottom.

There is an old legend that when people walk in their sleep they can go anywhere with unerring accuracy and that they can even walk a ledge of a tall building and return to bed without harm, but don't let anybody kid you. "It just ain't so."

That no neck, arms or legs were broken or no skull cracked is due to the mercy of the Creator who watches over imbeciles and sleepwalkers.

We were in the hospital five weeks, the first two of which are somewhat hazy in our memory but now we are out and the doctors say that in two or three months we will be good as new. We hope they're right but we doubt it because we were pretty good when we were new, and we sure don't walk nearly as fast now as we did before the tumble. A sprained back was the worst injury.

There is nothing funny about a serious accident to a normal person but of course an amusing side of it would occur to us.

It happened at two o'clock Sunday morning and our arrival at the emergency entrance of a large hospital coincided with that of several week-end drunks.

The fact that in our plunge down the stairs we had, somehow, cut a gash on our head which was bleeding profusely and that one of our eyes had been bammed against something and was practically closed didn't help matters any.

We remember thinking as they gently unloaded us from the ambulance that any stranger casually passing who didn't know us would have sworn that we had drifted in with the rest of the Saturday night brawlers.

Of course such a silly thought would not have occurred to most people but we are thankful for our sense of humor. It comes in handy in our work.

GOVERNMENT "GETS OUT OF HOUSING BUSINESS" BY AUTHORIZING TWENTY THOUSAND MORE UNITS

During the presidential and congressional campaigns last Fall, there was much talk about the government competing with private business and it was implied that Washington would get out of the real estate and construction business once the right officials were elected.

The House of Representatives tried valiantly to close down the housing program under which the Federal government (meaning the taxpayers, of course) has been assisting States and cities to provide homes for low-income families. In that body they voted to put an end to this Socialistic program by shutting off all further loans and contributions. This would have saved taxpayers \$795,000,000.

The president, however, who, for some unfathomable reason, talks one way and acts the opposite, requested the Senate to revive the program and asked that 35,000 low-cost units be started in the current fiscal year.

Senator Taft fell in line and led the fight in the Senate to restore the housing funds with the result that a Senate-House Conference Committee has recommended that 20,000 low cost units be built, which is 15,000 less than requested by the president.

And so the Federal government is getting out of the Housing business by building 20,000 more houses with taxpayers money.

Senator Taft's efforts in behalf of this Socialistic legislation were exerted some time ago and before he went to a New York hospital to have his hip examined.

There Is No Such Thing As "Must" Legislation

One of the most irritating expressions of the day is when measures for enactment by Congress submitted by the White House are referred to as "must" legislation.

It is possible that newspapers are to blame and that the term does not originate in the office of the chief executive but, at any rate, it was fervently hoped that the expression had passed with the New Deal.

There is no such thing as "must" legislation in a Constitutional Republic except as it refers to such proposals as a majority of both Houses of Congress decide is in the best interests of the people and pass accordingly.

In fact, we seem to remember that some of the biggest business men in the nation teamed up with labor union racketeers in playing ball with the New Deal and the Fair Deal when those economic atrocities were riding the crest.

The courage, integrity and patriotism which must be commanded if the Republic is to survive will not be found exclusively among representatives of big business or leaders of labor unions.

We are against the domination of government either by big business or big labor and we maintain that favoritism to either group on the part of a State or National administration is un-American, immoral and a flagrant abuse of power.

We are opposed to the reckless squandering of the taxpayers' money by incompetent, irresponsible and improvident public officials and we contend that taxes should be levied for purposes of revenue only and not to punish the rich, reward the poor or redistribute the wealth.

We are firmly committed to the principle of States Rights and we hold that the people of any part of the United States are entitled to maintain their own social customs and traditions without interference from politicians seeking votes to perpetuate themselves in power.

We are unequivocally in favor of Free Enterprise as opposed to government ownership of business and insist on the responsibility of every American to seek to improve his social and economic condition through initiative, energy and thrift rather than leaning on the arm of government for support.

We concede to every man the right to work and the opportunity of profitable employment regardless of whether he does, or does not, belong to a labor union.

On the other hand, we claim for the employer the irrevocable right to hire and fire his employees without instructions from any government agency, or intimidation by Federal Police.

We feel that at this crucial time in history, it is imperative that newspapers and other groups seeking to influence public opinion should exert every effort within their power to help preserve our republican form of government, our Free Enterprise system and American way of life. We call our energies to that end.

What About The "Methods" of The Subversive Skunks Who Defy Committees of Congress?

American Reds, both in the Communist Party and out, are always screaming their heads off about the "methods" employed by Chairmen of Congressional Committees who are investigating Communist infiltration of government and seeking as best they can to find out how extensively these filthy vermin have been allowed to permeate government agencies.

Suppose we just take a look at the "methods" employed by some of the witnesses before these committees who wriggle, squirm and lie to avoid admitting their part in the damnable plot to overthrow the American government in which apparently hundreds of government employes have taken part.

Every single one of them follow the same pattern and refuse to answer and thwart the committee at every turn as they have been instructed to do by the Reds in the legal profession who coach them.

A typical example is that of Henry H. Collins, Jr., whose testimony or rather refusal to testify, takes up a whole pamphlet recently issued by the Sub-committee of the Committee of the Judiciary of the United States Senate of which William H. Jenner is chairman.

Before questioning Collins, the Committee had irrefutable testimony and documented evidence that he was a member of the Harold Ware Cell of the Communist Party which operated so successfully in behalf of Russia during World War II when Alger Hiss was riding high, wide and handsome in Washington.

In spite of this affiliation, Collins held down one government position after another and was recommended for many of these jobs by such highly-placed officials as James E. Murray, United States Senator from Montana, and James E. Kilgore, United States Senator from West Virginia. Starting in with Roosevelt's NRA, Collins remained with that outfit until it was outlawed by a Supreme Court decision.

Then he latched on to a soil conservation job in the Department of Agriculture which was honey-combed with employes of the same ideological stripe as Collins.

From there he was promoted to the Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor where he remained for a couple of years.

His next assignment was with the Tolen Committee, a special committee of Congress set up to investigate some silly subject like "Interstate Migration of Destitute Citizens". While an employe of the executive branch of government, he was "loaned" to this committee, a point which the Jenner Committee was careful to bring out.

Following that he was "loaned" to the Small Business Committee of the Senate; then he was "loaned" to the Kilgore Committee which was a sub-committee of Military Affairs on Technological Mobilization; following that he went into the United States Army after Senator Kilgore had released him with "regret"; like so many other fair-haired boys in the Army during the Roosevelt Dynasty Collins got ahead fast, becoming a military-government officer with the rank of major; when the war was ended he came straight as a homing pigeon back to Washington and landed a job—guess where? In the State Department, naturally, where he was placed in the "Division of Occupied Territories" of which he at once became "Chief".

Following his disassociation with the State Department he became Executive Director of the American Russian Institute for two years which was one affiliation he didn't deny, since his name had appeared on the outfit's stationery.

From then on the Committee counsel read one charge after another about his Communist connections, made by former Communists who had worked with him in the Ware Cell but he became tongue-tied

Senate Passes Bill to Protect Dignity of Flag

An example of the disloyalty, if not downright treason, which is rampant in this country was demonstrated recently when a bill was passed by the Senate and sent to the House forbidding the display of the United Nations flag in a position equal to or superior to that of the flag of the United States.

The bill was opposed, believe it or not, by individuals and newspapers who feel that the United Nations rag should be given equal, if not higher, rank, than that extended the emblem of their own country.

When we consider views like this expressed by those calling themselves Americans, we realize how deadly has been the propaganda of the last twenty years against this country, its form of government and its institutions.

Those who introduced the legislation to uphold the dignity of the Stars and Stripes were referred to as "flag wavers" and maybe they are but, thank God, they are waving the flag of their own country and not the spider web emblem of the international conspirators in the United Nations.

A book called "Reds In America" published way back in 1924 and whose author was R. H. Whitney, is interesting because many of the personalities it mentions are in the picture still. One of them was Carroll Binder who was shown as one of the central figures connected with the Federated Press, a Communist newspaper having an office in Moscow and branches in this country. Binder is now on the Roster of Membership of the United States National Commission for UNESCO.

We don't see why there should have been any commotion over an investigation of the Central Intelligence Agency. There is nothing sacrosanct about a government agency and especially one which has had some questionable character associated with it, and still has for that matter. We don't have Gestapos in this country — yet. They should be subjected to the same scrutiny by proper authorities as other agencies of government.

Bill For Military Dictatorship Is To Be Revived In Congress

Last year, the Congress overwhelmingly rejected a law calling for Universal Military Training.

The defeat of this measure was due to patriotic groups and to organizations of mothers who recognized the bill as having been drawn by persons unfriendly to the United States and who saw in it an effort to establish military dictatorship here.

Now the president has ordered the National Security Training Commission, whatever that is, to review the bill to determine if it could be put over now.

To get the Security Training Commission working again the president has named three men he wants to serve on it. One of them is a Massachusetts college professor named Karl T. Compton, Warren Atherton a San Francisco attorney and a Julius Adler of New York. For some reason which was not explained the president said he wanted Adler to serve as Chairman.

We predict, and hope for the same fate for this bill which it met at the hands of the last Congress.

DALLAS FAIR PRESENTS COMMUNIST FRONTIER ON ITS SUMMER PROGRAM

The management of the Texas State Fair at Dallas went ahead with plans announced early in the Spring and employed Jose Ferrer of Hollywood, member of more than a dozen vicious Communist front organizations, to sing in their summer musicals.

Ferrer's subversive affiliations were called to the attention of Fair officials by prominent Dallas citizens who protested the employment of the left-wing actor whose activities in organizations set up for the overthrow of the American government are listed in the files of Investigating Committees of Congress and the California Legislature. Their objections were brushed aside.

In insisting on hiring Ferrer, Fair officials were strictly within their rights and if they had wanted to bring Earl Browder to Dallas to entertain Fair Park patrons, they were at liberty to do so.

It must be rather discouraging though to patriotic Americans in the entertainment world who are loyal to American ideals and who have kept aloof from subversive groups and activities, to be passed up in favor of those who openly flout American institutions and who brazenly register their preference for Russia as opposed to their own country.

We wonder if serious Americans don't often ponder these days on whether it is worse for their country to be betrayed by vicious leaders who wilfully sell us out or by well-meaning and weak-minded ones who do us in without realizing it. Which reminds us that the age-old question has never been answered—"Who is least to be trusted, a knave or a fool"?

Korean Fiasco Renews Question of How Long A Nation Can Survive Without Strong Leadership

As we turn in our copy a "truce" has been signed in Korea.

No one seems to know what this means, including those who negotiated and signed it.

It is the first experience of the United States in starting a fight and then backing up, appeasing other nations and making concessions to the enemy so there is nothing much that can be said except to remark the great tragedy wherein twenty-five thousand American boys needlessly died and thousands more are wounded and missing in action.

The whole procedure was so cockeyed, crazy and indefensible that it was probably inevitable that it end with neither side winning and with the principal losers being the mothers whose sons won't come home.

In the first place it was a war which we were not allowed to call a war even though rivers of blood stained the battlefields and the young lads sleeping there are just as dead as if they had given their lives in the most orderly, authorized and orthodox conflict.

It was a war which was never declared by Congress and one which was called by a president who ignored the Constitution and assumed the prerogatives which belong only to the duly elected lawmakers chosen to represent the American people.

It was a war in which a great American general was recalled from duty because he was winning it.

It was a war in which ammunition bought and paid for by American taxpayers' money was sidetracked and withheld from our fighting men in their darkest hours and direst need.

It was a war in which officers were instructed to send their troops into battle to fight and die but not to win and where soldiers were compelled to fight with their hands tied behind their backs.

It was a war in which some of our ships and those of our "allies" were employed for the transportation of supplies and material to the enemy to be used against American forces.

And now we have signed a "truce" after almost two years of negotiation with barbarians who are devoid of conscience, honesty and human mercy and who are probably laughing now at our leaders for their gullibility and lack of wit.

The whole fiasco makes us wonder anew just how long a great nation can continue to survive without wise, strong and able men to sit in its councils, make its decisions and guide its destiny.

During the campaign last year the president and his speakers stressed the need for a return to the two-party system and we imagine that real Republicans got the impression that he would solidify and strengthen the Party by depeading on those whose loyalty was unchallenged and whose Republicanism was unquestioned to guide his administration and shape its policies.

Instead he has seemed to delight in surrounding himself and calling into his councils those who are neither Democrats nor Republicans but who run with the hare and trail with the hounds.

We are thinking now of his recent invitation to Barney Baruch, and other political hemaphrodites — who don't care who is president so long as they can have entry to the White House — to dine with him and participate in a confidential political conference.

Maybe this is what he is pleased to call a middle-of-the-road policy but there was no suggestion in his campaign speeches that bonafide members of his Party would be sidetracked in favor of opportunists in both Parties who have no understanding of, nor respect for, the principles of either Lincoln or Jefferson.

What became of California's laws against mixed marriages and ownership of land by aliens? They were wiped out by provisions in the Charter of the United Nations, the despicable world conspiracy which seeks to set up a super government and take over all nations of the earth. The failure of the Senate to pass the Bricker Amendment to the Constitution of the United States which protects our sovereignty is a case of deliberate and criminal negligence.

David Dubinsky, president of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union, is now working for a thirty-hour week for his members with increased pay he said in a recent public statement. Brought to its ultimate conclusion, this line of reasoning means that the "Ladies" will eventually refuse to work at all while demanding a one hundred per cent increase in pay. In Minneapolis in June, delegates to the general assembly of the Presbyterian Church of the United States went round and round over a resolution which would have changed the wording in the Lord's Prayer. Those favoring the change insisted that the "intent" of the Lord was inaccurately interpreted in the Prayer as it stands and they proposed to do something about it. The resolution was defeated which was considered quite a victory and indirect slap at the "liberals" in the ministry who emasculated the whole Bible in the new Standard Version.

In New York recently it was revealed that the Upholsterers' Union of the American Federation of Labor are no longer members of the Americans for Democratic Action. They withdrew from the ADA, it was learned from a report of the General Executive Board of the Union, because of ADA's position which "is almost identical with the Communist Party Program, and the demands of Soviet Russia in the United Nations."

WEST TEXAS CHURCH GROUP TAKES COURAGEOUS STAND

Out at Albany in West Texas, the Matthews Memorial Presbyterian Church has adopted a resolution which leaves no doubt where this group stands on Communist infiltration among the clergy.

Included in the resolution was this very definite statement of position by the church authorities:

"Resolved that we go on record that we do not believe the First Amendment to the Constitution grants immunity to any citizen, be he clergyman or not, to the provisions of paragraph 1 of Section 3 of Article III of the Constitution or to any law relating to subversive activities against the government of the United States, and be it further resolved, That we urge that the proper department of government be required to investigate thoroughly any evidence of subversive activities among any of the clergy or lay officers of any church or other religious organization in the United States and that any one who should be found guilty under due course of law be punished".

The patriotism and American spirit which prompted the Albany minister and his congregation to denounce Atheistic Communism in American churches is, we believe, typical of the great majority of religious leaders in the United States but the seven thousand subversives in the pulpits of America are polluting the minds of hundreds of thousands of Americans each year and they should be stopped dead in their tracks.

Aside from our admiration for the courage of the Albany congregation, there is a more personal reason why we are proud of their action. We were born in the country a few miles from Albany and our father, who was a devout Presbyterian, is buried there.

Press reports suggest that Paul Hoffman, the agile "Liberal" who manages to play in with each national administration, may be given a high top-secret job soon by the president. If that's true, we think that Acheson, Harriman, Lattimore and other Pinks of the Truman regime should also be given assignments and just make it one big, happy family.
