MEMORANDUM

HOUSTON NEGRO HOSPITAL  
Ground Plan Print

Referring to Mr. Bringhurst's memorandum of February 9th, with enclosure:

I would suggest the following additions before distribution of this print is made:

FIRST - Now placing the permanent name on the original building, that is, Main Building or whatever designation should apply.

SECOND - In like manner, the correct name of the building now called the Nurses Home, which I understand to be Houston Negro Hospital School of Nursing.

THIRD - Showing the driveway gate at the entrance from Francis Street.

FOURTH - Showing the east entrance or the one nearest the corner of Elgin and Ennis as IN, and the west entrance or the one nearest Elgin and Paige as OUT, the ambulance platform being designed with this in view.

FIFTH - Adding first floor elevations at the Main Building, the Nurses Home, Utility Building and the Pavilion as well as similarly for the proposed additional buildings.

This print is intended not only for its present use but also as a permanent guide for those who may have to do with additional construction; hence, adding the above will be helpful to those who may have occasion to study the plans, possibly years hence.

Finally, I assume that one or more of such prints will be placed in the cornerstone when such is laid.

In other respects, the print seems in order and entirely satisfactory.
