



H. E. WALKER TRANSFERRED TO HEAD OFFICE;
TO BE REPLACED BY A. S. LEHMANN OF
WOOD RIVER

Refinery Manager L. T. Wilson announced yesterday the transfer and promotion of H. E. Walker to the position of Manager, Planning and Analysis in the Head Office Marketing Economics Department.

Since November 1961, Walker has served as Refinery Superintendent here at Houston. His replacement will be A. Spencer Lehmann, currently Chief Technologist at the Wood River Refinery.

The moves will become effective in March.

For Walker, his new assignment returns him to his hometown - New York City. A graduate of Columbia University, Walker holds both the B. S. and M. S. degrees in Chemical Engineering.

He joined Shell in June 1941 at the Wood River Refinery, later held various technical assignments in Head Office and The Hague, Holland, before returning to Wood River in November 1950 as Assistant Manager of the Alkylation Department. In 1953, he was named Assistant Chief Technologist at Wood River and a year later Chief Research Technologist at the Houston Refinery. He remained at Houston
