



## Major OP-II Turnaround Now Underway



This is the COL-250 fractionator for pyrolysis where cracked gas oil from the furnaces is fractionated into pitch, heavy gas oil, light gas oil, gasoline and olefins. The olefins then goes to Light Olefins for further separation into hydrogen, methane, ethylene, ethane, propylene, butadiene and gasoline.

The third major turnaround of the Olefins Plant II, since its completion in 1970, is now underway.

The turnaround's peak load period involved over one thousand operators and craftsmen. This project includes nearly two thousand specific job sequences ranging from simple cleaning chores to the rebuilding of major components within the Olefins Plant. Additionally, major tie-in work is being done to facilitate the addition of Olefins Plant III.

Olefins II produces more than one billion pounds per year of ethylene, along with quantities of propylene, butadiene, isoprene and benzene. These "building block" chemicals are vital to the housing, clothing, automotive, food processing, aviation and health-care industries.

## Carpooling Saves Money And Hassling

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration estimates a driver can save between \$281 and \$654 a year on a 20-mile daily round trip if he or she carools. To get an idea of what you might be able to save, try this formula:


Estimate the amount of money you spend on gasoline for your daily trip to and from work. Then multiply this by 21, which is the average number of days most people work each month. This will give you a rough idea of how much you spend each month. Now divide this total by the number of individuals who could be carpooling with you. The answer is what you and they could be saving by carpooling.

Aside from the savings, you would no longer be hassled with the every day driving to and from work. Carpooling permits you to sit back and leave some of the problems of driving to others.


The two Purchasing employees who won the first carpool drawing held October 12 are doing just that. They are


