

Mr. F. E. Packard executive vice president of the Western Tax Council expresses confidence that the end of the long fight in sight with victory assured

Discussing the movement from its begin ping Mr. Packard said:

Since 1939, the Western Tax Council with headquarters in Chicago, has urging state legislatures throughout Inc the nation to pass resolutions calling upon Congress to limit federal income taxes to 25 per cent of an individual's income, and at the same time reduce all other income taxes proportionately. The limitation, of course, would apply only in peacetime.

To many people this unique tax-limitation campaign has seemed like useless labor, since state legislatures have no con-trol over federal taxes. However, the Con-stitution provides that if two-thirds of the states so petition Congress, it must submit a constitutional amendment to the people Thus, if 32 states officially endorse a Conwithutional amendment limiting federal taxes to 25 per cent of net income, Con-gress must submit such an amendment for ratification. If three-quarters of the states subsequently ratify the amendment, it becomes part of the Constitution.

Is this a long and cumbersome pro-cedure? Obviously, it is. Yet since 1939, the Western Tax Council has convinced 25 state legislatures that a 25 per cent ceiling on federal peacetime income taxes would be desirable. If 7 more states fol-low their lead, the stage will be set for the Constitutional amendment. The West-ern Tax Council believes that once the amendment is actually proposed, it will be quickly ratified.

However, when the governing forces of a nation touch rock bottom in political immorality as those in control in Washington have now done, patriotic citizens are not likely to be as much concerned in repairing party fences and restoring party prestige as they are in pitching in and saving the Republic with the best weapon at hand. Any way, it is futile and stupid to assume that the State of the Union can be returned to a stable basis by simply voting for an opposition candi-date merely because he happens to be nominated on the Republican tight.

To proceed on that premise is to ignore the tragic fact that the taint of Radicalism has permeated the Republican party in only a relatively smaller degree than it has dominated Democratic party ranks.

Abolishing the United States in favor of a world government is no less an act of treason when sponsored by a Republican Party platform; Federal aid to education and socialized medicine lose none of their repul-siveness because Republicans urge their adoption; FEPC legislation be-comes no less an immoral and un-American policy of government when championed by a Republican candidate.

Patriotic Americans are as bitterly opposed to a Socialistic Federal government administered by Republican New Dealers like Warren, Stassen, Dewey, Dulles, Duff, Tobey, Saltonstall, Morse, Ives, Lodge, Aiken, Mar-garet Chase Smith and other Radicals as they are when it is directed by the Pendergast mob.

Clearly, if Constitutional government is to be restored it will be through the combined efforts of the best element in both major parties.

We have now come to the place where a citizen is no longer a Repub-lican or a Democrat but is either for this country and its institutions or he is against them and it is only on this basis that the Federal government can be retrieved from the political vandals who now dominate it.

Any way, if there is enough statesmanship, vision and courage among the conservatives in either party, or in a coalition of both, they had better get their heads together now and plan to, in some way, offer a candidate of such giant stature that he can corral the vote of this newly-awakened contingent of aroused Americans, for 1952 will be the last go-round. the Federal Council officials are con-nected with the new set-up. These two Councils have been charged by many groups and individ-uals with being responsible for the infiltration of Socialism, Communism and other alien ideologies into the churches and other religious institu-

The action of the ministers in New York in alerting the people to the danger of the National Council is encouraging to the National Council is en-couraging to those of us who have been sounding this warning for al-most two years, first in regard to the Federal Council and, later, its suc-cessor, the National Council.

### **Government Should Be Prohibited by Law** From Competing With **Private Business**

Tucked away in a Senate Committee somewhere is a resolution by Senator Herbert O'Conor of Maryland proposing the twenty-third amendment to the Constitution, which, if adopted by a two-thirds vote of Congress and ratified by threefourths of the States, would be one of the sanest and soundest steps taken by American lawmakers in twenty years.

The resolution is meant to stop the ever increasing encroachment of the Federal government on private business and reads as follows:

"The Government of the United States shall not engage in any business, profes-sional, commercial or industrial enter-prise in competition with its citizens, except as specified in the Constitution.

Sponsoring the movement is the American Progress Foundation of Los Angeles of which Mr. Willis E. Stone is chairman

Much as we would like to see the amendment as we would like to see the amend-ment become a part of the Constitution, we do not believe Congress, as presently constituted, will submit it to the State legislatures for ratification.

The Fair Deal contingent in that body knows that setting up more government operations in competition with private business means more jobs to dole out and more jobs mean more votes to keep the Fair Deal in power. They would not be inclined to break the vicious circle which operates to their benefit.

Fortunately, the Constitution provides another method by which that instrument may be amended. Two thirds of the States may be amended. Two thirds of the States may memorialize Congress to submit such a resolution and when these thirty-two states have done so, it becomes manda-tory on Congress to submit it back to the States for ratification. When three fourths of the States have ratified it, it becomes part of the Constitution.

That is the method employed in passing resolutions demanding repeal of the Six-teenth or income tax amendment and recently the twenty-fifth State acted favorably on that, leaving only seven more adopt it.

No good citizen would oppose either of these two proposed amendments and the only opposition to be offered would be from those who put political expediency above the national welfare.

# **Californian Wants Only Americans On Deck**

J. Lester Miller, a San Jose, Californit, attorney who spends every available hour in working in behalf of Americanism feels that a new political set-up is necessary to bring about a return of Constitutional government.

"Weep No More My Lady" was written and published following a trip of this International meddler to North Carolina which she later described in her column as a "charming place of magnolias, lavendar and old lace," but indicated that she never went into that part of the country and came away without a "certain sense of sadness" for the poverty and unhappiness there to which "one must shut one's eyes". "Weep No More My Lady" must have set her back on her heels for subsequent columns steered clear of the subject of the South's unhappiness and poverty-The Editor)

I propose to talk like a Southerner . . . and at the same time an American: a Southerner and an American who glories in the fact that each allegiance complements the other and adds double luster to a heritage beyond compare.

I have no intention of waving unduly the Confederate flag.

We are all agreed . . . or I imagine, most of us . . . that the Lost Cause was better lost.

I am glad, as was Henry W. Grady, of Georgia, that eloquent spokesman for the South just before the turn of the Century, and quoting him now: "I am glad that omniscient God held the balance of battle in His Almighty Hand and that human slavery was swept forever from American soil and that American Union saved from the wreak of meri the wreck of war.'

We are today one Nation, and newhere does national loyalty burn with a purer flame than south of the Mason-Dixon line.

But, although we follow, and proudly, the Stars and Stripes, we still honor and revere the Stars and Bars.

We shall never forget that emblem.

And, by the same token, as long as time shall last we shall never cease to hold fast in our hearts all of love and veneration for those brave men who followed the immortal Lee as members of that mighty host of heroes whose banners, even in defeat, were tipped with glory.

And by the same token, too, there is enshrined in every true southern heart the same love, the same veneration, for those brave women of the Confederacy who, through the four dark years of war waited anxiously at home, often with the bayonet of the invader at their throat, and when the fighting was over, when the verdict had been sealed at the cannon's mouth, marched hand in hand with their men—those who came back—through the twelve long and terrible years that were the Gethsemane of Re-construction; that Gethsemane during which the prostrate South was a conquered land at the mercy of a horde of carpet-baggers and renegade Southerners who grew fat and sassy as they fed like jackals upon what they thought was the carcass of a civilization

War, as Sherman said, is hell . . but it's a hell that has about it a certain dignity. War, as Sherman said, is hell . . . but it's a hell that has about it a certain dignity. There was nothing of dignity about Reconstruction. There was only the studied, deliberate debasement of a proud and defenseless

people as old Thaddeus Stevens and his gang set out to murder the South in the first degree. Their murderous assault, prompted by greed and revenge, was cold-blooded degree. and pre-meditated. They worked night and day at the job of killing the South for twelve long and bitter years.

They almost succeeded.

Only the vitality of a civilization and a culture that simply refused to die kept South alive.

In addition to a wrecked economy the whole social structure of the South, built through generations, was in turmoil. The bottom rail was on top, held there by a Federal bayonet.

There's no need to review in detail that saturnalia of official corruption and waste during which the new rulers, strutting like peacocks, set out deliberately to turn to their own personal profit every cent of taxes that could be wrung from the people of a prostrate land.

There's no need to review the looting not only of the public but of the private

There's one thing, however, that seems to me rather significant. That is that while a lot of white despoilers got filthy rich—not a few present-day fortunes in the South, and in the hands of folks who fly mighty high on occasion, were made possible by the fact Grandpa was a hard-working carpet-bagger or scalawag

were made possible by the fact Grandpa was a hard-working carpet-bagger or scalawag or buffalo blessed with no more conscience than a goat and with a keen eye for a nice plantation or a well-paying Federal job—while a lot of white despoilers got filthy rich, mighty few Negroes gained any real economic advantage from Reconstruction. Their False Friends, even as today, made a lot of glowing promises other than forty acres and a mule. They patted the liberated slaves on the back and ate with them and slept with them and danced with them and invited them into their homes. They talked mightily about social equality. But when the payoff came when the sceneric of the South had been picked

But when the payoff came, when the economic bones of the South had been picked clean and the Southern patriots managed finally to drive out the vultures, it was the Great Friend, the Great Reformer from the North who got the loot and the Southern white man and the Southern Negro who were left holding the bag. And what a bag! It was filled to the top and packed down with broken hopes and bitter memories. But that's enough about Reconstruction. It's dark water over the dam of history. But there was no Marshall Plan for the South 86 years ago. Instead of bearing gifts, our conquerors came in hordes demanding tribute and when, only 74 years ago, we finally managed to drive the rascals out, the South was bankrupt. We had almost no manufacturing.

The only thing we had was the land, much of it mortgaged and all of it bled white by generations of wasteful farming practices, saddled by grim necessity with the mill-

stone of a share-cropping economy. Henry Grady wasn't just romancing when he told, some sixty short years ago, of that funeral he attended in Pickens County, Georgia. He was telling the bitter truth not only of Pickens County but of almost every other county in the South. The grave, said Grady, was dug through solid marble but the marble headstone was from Vermont. The burial was in a pine wilderness, but the pine coffin came from Cincinnati. An iron mountain overshadowed the graveyard, but the coffin nails and screws came from Pittsburgh. Hardwoods and metals abounded, but the corpse was hauled on a wagon made in South Bend, Indiana. A hickory grove was nearby, but the pick and shovel handles came from New York. The cotton shirt on the dead man came from Cincinnati, the coat and breeches from Chicago and the shoes from Boston. The folded hands were encased in white gloves that came from New York and

The folded hands were encased in white gloves that came from New York and around the poor neck was twisted a cheap cravat from Philadelphia.

The country so rich in undeveloped resources, says Grady, furnished nothing for the funeral but the corpse and the grave in which it awaited the final Judgment trump. And the poor fellow lowered to his rest on coffin bands from Lowell carried nothing into the next world as a reminder of his home in this one save the halted blood in his veins, the chilled marrow in his bones and the echo of the dull clods that fell on his coffin bld

What a magnificent change we have wrought in less than two generations! What a magnificent change within the living memory of many of us gathered here tonight!

Since 1939 the South has increased its per capita income by 236 per cent as com-pared to an increase of only 183 per cent in the rest of the country.

Dr. Paul Chapman, associate dean of the College of Agriculture of the University of Georgia, says the decade that ended with 1949 saw an increase in the annual spend-able income in the South, after paying living expenses, of more than 375 per cent.

able income in the South, after paying living expenses, of more than 375 per cent. Never in the history of the nation—never in the history of any nation—has so great a gain been made in so short a time. Between the years 1939 and 1947—according to the Census of Manufacturers, and the rate has been accelerated since 1947—16,000 new factories were built in the South. This was a gain of fifty per cent as compared with 36 per cent for the rest of the nation. An average of seven new industrial plants, says Dean Chapman, have opened their doors for business in the South every working day during the past ten years; and for every million dollars that went into the building of new plants by new corporations, 15 million dollars went into expansion of plants already in operation. This industrial expansion has created in the South since 1940 approximately 1,250,000 new jobs in manufacturing. The United States Chamber of Commerce reports that for the five-year period 1944-1949 the national gain in new business establishments and related enterprises was 30 per cent. For the Southeast during the same period, the gain was 43 per cent; for the Southwest 45 per cent. In all phases of business, wholesale, retail, service, financial, real estate, insur-ance, transportation and all others, the South has outgained the Nation during the post-war years by 14 per cent.

The South leads the Nation in the percentage of electrified farms and in the in-stallation of rural telephones.

There was a time, and not so long ago, when the South was a vassal of Old King Cotton. Cotton isn't king any more. It has gone the way of a lot of other monarchs. We still raise a lot of cotton . . . but Southern farmers for a generation now have been going in more and more for diversification. Thousands and tens of thousands of old cotton acres are green now almost all the year 'round with lush pasture grasses and in a lot of pastures you'll see great herds of fat beef and dairy cattle. We have taken the textile industry away from New England, the furniture busi-ness away from Michigan and the, oil business away from Pennsylvania. We are cutting deeper and deeper into the shoe business of Massachusetts and one day, if things keep on going the way they are now, we'll take the beef business, what isn't already in Texas, away from the Middle West and the dairy business away from Wisconsin. We have as you know taken the Hydrogen Bomb building business away from everybody. We aren't claiming that the South is a land where everybody has a money-tree and all he has to do is go out and shake it every morning and pick up the dollars. Government economists have gone into a trance and estimated the annual per capita income in the South in 1949 at \$981 as compared to \$1,524 for the rest of the Nation.

Nation. We still have a long way to go... but we're gaining, and gaining fast. In this advance both Negroes and whites, working together, have prospered. The advancement of the American Negro has been without parallel in human history. Only 86 years ago he was a slave without property, without education, with-out tradition, a chattel to be bought and sold.

Today as one rides along Southern roads—and they're paved roads, incidentally, in most instances—he can see at frequent intervals prosperous farms owned by men whose ancestors, less than three generations ago, were slaves. He sees Negro schools and colleges; not as many as there should be, it's true, but more are being built. He sees negro

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Hore are being built. He sees prosperous Negro stores and churche's and homes. In the South one can see instances without number of Negro men and Negro women living in peace and dignity with their white neighbors. It's true that one will also see Negroes living like animals in slums . . . slums almost as bad as those in Harlem and within a store's throw of the nation's capitol to W. diversity of the store of the in Washington. But in our Southern slums, as in slums everywhere, you'll also find white families

living upon the same scale

In our Southern society, as in society everywhere, ability and honesty and integrity

and enterprise—or the lack of these qualities—determine to a large degree how high one eats upon the hog.

No one-that is no one with any real integrity-will insist that our racial relations are as they should be.

They're far from it in the South, as they are in the North and just about everywhere else.

We are making progress—real progress—toward better racial relations in the South. We have made here... and history bears out this statement... more progress in racial understanding and cooperation and in a shorter time than in any other area in all the world.

Nowhere else since time began has an alien race, shackeled in slavery, made such an advance—economic and social and cultural—as has the Negro in the South within the space of a single lifetime.

To what is this progress due?

It's due in part to the Negroes themselves . . . but it's also due and in no small measure to the understanding and help and cooperation and financial assistance and advice of the Southern white man.

Despite this progress . . . despite this outstanding record . . . there still remains a certain type of damyankee, a certain type of renegate Southerner, a certain type of political carpetbagger hell-bent as were their forebears on reconstructing us.

There still remains that great claque of holier-than-thou reformers that persists There still remains that great claque of holier-than-thou reformers that persists in shouting through the press, on the movie screen, over radio and television, and even on the floor of the Congress\_of the United States the age-old slander that the South is a backward land peopled in the main by low-browed hoodlums, shufflin' down the road with a mint julep in one hand and an old piece of rope in the other, going some place to lynch some Negro who, if he got his just deserts, would be elected Governor. That old story has been going the rounds ever since Harriet Beecher Stowe took pen in hand and wrote Uncle Tom's Cabin. This is the same Mrs. Stowe, incidentally, who just one year after the War was over moved South bag and baggage to a planta-tion in Florida.

It's significant, it seems to me, that Mrs. Stowe never wrote a sequel to Uncle Tom after she moved South and could observe conditions at close range.

But she did write some observations to her brother, Henry Ward Beecher, in the North.

"Corrupt politicians," she wrote, "are already beginning to speculate on the Negroes as possible capital for their schemes".

How true in 1866!

Negroes as possible capital for their schemes". How true in 1860: And how true, unfortunately, in 1951: Only abysmal ignorance or deliberate political scheming—and I suspect it's a combination of both—could possibly explain the continued caping criticism by these merchants of discord—both male and female—of just about everything south of the Mason-Dixon line while they ignore even worse conditions in their own back yard. I propose that we do something about it. It may even dry the eyes of a lot of Southerners who are too prone to weep along with our mis-

dry the eyes of a lot of Southerners who are too prone to weep along with our mis-guided critics. It may possibly even open the eyes of Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt. The South is no longer bankrupt. We have the money and a lot of it. There are any number of Southern corporations, any number of Southern business men who could pay most of the freight with tax dollars that now go down the drain of wasteful Federal spending in Washington. If the American Tobacco Company can spend millions of dollars every year selling cigarettes, if General Motors and Chrysler and Ford can do the same to sell auto-mobiles, if General Electric and other corporations can spend millions every year selling radios and refrigerators and washing machines and television sets . . . then the South, I submit, could very well spend millions to tell the true story of Southern progress. progress.

It would prove, I believe, an excellent investment. Let's quit taking it sitting down!

The exception was the talk of Senator Harry F. Byrd who spoke in Atlanta and laid down the ultimatum to sound Democrats as to the program which must be followed if the party of Jefferson and Jackson is to be restored to respectability.

Senator Byrd's suggestion for purifying what he called "the Truman Democratic Party" were:

"The South is not impotent. It is true the South is a minority in the Democratic party, but no Democratic President can be elected without the votes of the Southern States.

"In 1831 the two-thirds rule was estab-shed. It was repealed in 1936. The twolished. thirds rule was a protection to minorities in the Democratic party just as the Constitution is a protection to minorities among our citizenship. The South should demand the restoration of the two-thirds rule in the 1952 national convention before candidates are voted on.

"We can insist on a resolution reaffirm-ing support of States' rights by the Demo-cratic party. At the convention in 1948, controlled by Mr. Truman, such a resolu-tion was defeated by a record vote.

"We can insist upon the adoption of a platform that does not advocate unconstitu-tional or socialistic measures.

"The South can still be a great and mighty force in the Democratic party if it has the will to do it. The South has been treated as a stepchild by the Truman Democratic party too long.

"We can insist upon a return to the principles of Jefferson and Jackson. The answer of the Fair Dealers will be that answer of the rait benefits will be that this will be going back to the horse and buggy days, but I say that the true principles of our constitutional democracy are immor-tal and those fundamentals can not be dimmed by age or distorted by demagogues.

"Let me say I am the kind of Democrat who wants, above everything else, to see the real Democratic party preserved and strengthened. I am the kind of a Democrat who intends to oppose to the utmost of his capacity measures that are unconstitutional, socialistic, and destructive of the principles government established by our fore-hers. I am an old-fashioned Democrat of fathers who believes in a rigid standard of honesty in our public officials."

My views on the subject, of course, very definitely favor a My views on the subject, of course, very definitely lavor, uniform distribution of all money and property on the humani-tarian theory of "taking from each according to his ability and giving to each according to his need" but, for obvious reasons, \$ was quite embarrassed when I was asked to preside over the session having this policy under consideration.

Naturally, I feel that if we are to attain our global objective of social justice for all, we must deny the right of any one person to possess more of this world's goods than another.

At the same time, I am not yet in position where I am willing to surrender my own personal fortune in the interest of the general welfare. Although a staunch advocate of the re-distribution of the financial assets of

others, I feel that, in my case, it is necessary that I be allowed to keep the millions of dollars I have been able to accumulate in order that I may continue to travel over the world and point out the responsibility of every one else to join in a universal share-the-wealth program. I feel that my position in this matter is perfectly logical since my concern is

solely for the greatest good to the greatest number, but I was afraid that Reaction-aries might regard my attitude as a little inconsistent and that they might even insist that I either divide my own money with the under-privileged classes or quit trying to compel others to do so.

For this reason, I did not think it wise for me to preside over the session which was called to pass on the matter and so I suggested instead, the name of Mr. I. Will Steele, treasurer of a labor organization, who was unanimously chosen as chairman for the evening.

Since we were unable to reach any decision, the subject was postponed and will

be taken up for further consideration at some future date. At the next night's session, I was very happy to find that less controversial problems were on the agenda for solution and that the matters listed for discussion were those on which it was easier for the delegates to reach harmonious agreement. These included unanimous approval of a bill soon to be introduced in Congress

These included unanimous approval of a bill soon to be introduced in Congress which will provide that the United States government make an outright gift of fifty million dollars worth of banana splits to starving Himalayan hop growers who have suffered serious economic losses as a result of a widespread epidemic of hoof and mouth disease among East Indian water buffaloes. Another constructive action taken at this session was one providing for setting up the mechanics for a proposed International Matrimonial Service for the young people of the world which will sponsor a program of organized courtships, planned wedding, and supervised hongement.

A lot of our Bishops and other leaders have turned from Evangelism to Socialism. They do not believe in profits in business, the economic system under which all of our churches, schools and hospitals have been built. schools and hospitals have been built. They draw their salary from gifts made by the Methodist people, out of profits of their business. # Here's Hoping The New Texas Election **Bill Gets The Job Done**

A bill which its sponsors claim will bring about fairer elections in Texas has been signed by Governor Allan Shivers.

As the governor points out, the measure contains both good and bad features but it is to be hoped that it serves the pur-poses for which it was designed.

There is one feature of it, however, which seems to us to defeat any attempt to clean up election practices in certain controlled counties of South Texas.

Introduction of the bill was primarily influenced by the cute little custom of political boss, George Parr of Duval County, in always waiting until several days after an election to find out how many votes his favored candidate needed and then gallantly coming across with them.

The new law will permit the attorney general to prosecute frauds like this pro-vided more than one county is involved. While Boss Parr controls or heavily in-fluences the votes in some half dozen counties, all he actually needs to put his candidate over is one county and the bill clearly leaves him this margin for operating his controlled ballot plan.

It is because of the noxious and corrupt practices in Boss Parr's realm that Texas now has one United States senator who was not elected by the people and who is serving in that capacity through the grace of the Duval County magician who reached in an empty ballot box five days after the polls had closed and pulled out enough votes to put him over after the qualified voters of Texas had elected his opponent.

### **Birmingham Housewives'** Slogan Is "Hurry Harry Home"

Housewives in the Alabama city of Birm-ingham have organized a 3-H Club, a unique political organization whose anmounced purpose is to "safeguard" the White House in 1952 from Harry Truman or another "Pendergast playmate."

Mrs. Eli Allen heads the new group and has taken the wise position of refusing to endorse any particular candidate. "Our club is merely against Truman and any one else of like political philosophy," Mrs. Allen.
