### Thousands Pay Tribute To Chief Justice

The late Chief Justice Fred Vinson's complete lack of respect for fundamental principles of the American system of government was demonstrated many times in his rulings as a member of the Supreme Court, but he was per-sonally popular and enjoyed a wide circle of friends who held

him in the highest esteem. His funeral in Washington re-cently was attended by thousands of prominent and highly respected citizens from all sections of the

country. Harry Truman was also present.

## **Legislation Based On Theory Of A Superior** Race Is Passed By The Israeli Parliament

Last month the Israeli Parliament passed a law which makes it illegal for the people of that country to intermarry with Gentiles. Good for them.

Of course, in enacting this leg-islation, the people of Israel, through their elected representatives, have announced to the world that they consider them-selves of a superior race. That's

all right, too. Any race whose members have the pride and self-respect they should have want to keep their particular racial group inviolate from mongrelization through mixture with other strains.

Theirs is a race which has always been exclusive so far as their own people are concerned and now that they have officially taken this firm and determined stand in the interest of self-preservation, it is to be hoped that their good example will be followed here.

In direct contrast to the proud spirit of the Israeli people, here in the United States there are constant and effective attempts bring about mongrelization through attacks on segregation and efforts to compel by law the indiscriminate mixing of the white and colored races.

Since Israel considers it degrading for their citizens to intermarry even with the people of other white races, it is obvious that they must unanimously agree that

the forced social mixing of persons of different colors, with its inevitable consequences, is the ultimate in human depravity. In view of the fact that the

people of that country have close ties in the Unied States through hundreds of thousands of relatives and friends, they have a wonderful opportunity to repay a debt of gratitude to a nation which befriended them in their hour of need.

They can do this by communicating their racial views to their American contacts and enlisting their support in helping to pre-vent the tragedy of mongreliza-tion here which the people of Israel had the wisdom to forestall by law.

Since the new state of Israel has begun its national life by instituting a rigid moral code, it goes without saying that they should be only too happy to help set up the same high standards in a country whose support and financial contributions enabled them to found their own nation and formu-late their social customs according to their own desires.

In the meantime, we are in the pitiable position of having launched a new nation on its course in history whose people had the foresight to employ legislative enactment to preserve the purity of their race while we seek to invoke the same machinery in achieving the corruption of our

in the national economy through the performance of their professional and personal duties the same as all other citizens, just what part they, as a group, were assigned in helping to overhaul the American government, re-defining its proper functions and enlarging its scope of re-sponsibility, was not made clear.

It has been suggested by irreverent persons that perhaps their service to the cause will consist of spotting Reactionaries among Pull-man passengers, creeping up on these sleeping Fascists, yanking the pillow from under their head, hiding their shoes and throwing their pants out the window.

The National Association for Advancement of Colored People was also ably represented at the organization ceremonies of ADA by its president although we were unable to find any envoy having similar interest in the advancement of white people listed as being present. The heads of the International Garment Workers Union, the

United Automobile Workers and allied groups were on hand to give the benefit of their advice and counsel in the matter of discarding the principles of Lincoln and Jefferson and replacing them with ideologies more befitting the modern concepts of progressive citizens in a new world order

"The New Deal Program must be expanded" read the first line of the first pronouncement issued by ADA following its organization although how they would go about expanding something that already covered everything from providing free nose rings for Bantu tribesmen in the African Bush to guaranteeing riparian rights to the operators of irrigated skunk farms in the

Euphrates Valley, was not explained. Further evidence of how strongly ADA frowns on Communism and Soviet sympathizers is offered by its roster of members which is identical, many instances, with that of the subversive organizations listed in the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities and in the official records of the Department of Justice.

The window-dressing sector of ADA is composed of those who have never been listed officially as members of Communist Fronts and who have been able to successfully disguise their left-wing activities as liberal political action but their views are known to parallel in all essential points those of the shady characters who use the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution as a shield

This sector takes in those whose secure position in political circles makes them exempt from the embarrassment of official investigation to which lesser lights are subjected and includes such high-bracket leftists as Eleanor Roosevelt, Hubert Humphrey, Averill Harriman, Herbert Lehman and scores of other professional bleeding hearts. One of their prominent members who had official ADA approval of his

candidacy for membership on the New York City Council is credited with membership in sixty-nine different Communist Fronts and who, because of

his age, can't offer the alibi that his grandpa made him join. Another ADA member and effective behind-the-scene worker is shown in the Daily Worker, official Communist Party organ, on February 7, 1936, as a member of the Communist Party.

Another member who takes a prominent part in its affairs is an ex-convict who served a prison term for draft-dodging in World War I and who

has proudly described himself as a "philosophical anarchist." Still another who helped to set up ADA, a Harvard University Faculty member, said in a magazine article: "The faults and injustices in our present system make even freedom-loving Americans look wistfully at Russia.

These instances could be multiplied indefinitely as there have been few Communist Fronts set up in this country to which some members of ADA do not belong or have not belonged in the past and not many types of subversive activity in which some of them have not been engaged.
Also, it is hard to reconcile their alleged aversion to Communism with their official stand on public issues.
They have demanded the right of Communists to organize student groups on the campus of all American colleges; they condemned the Mundt Communists."  While ADA is one of the most influential organizations of its kind devoted to breaking down established American institutions, there are many other groups with similar objectives who are chiseling away the rights, freedom and sovereignty of the American people.
 That we have survived thus far as a free, independent and Christian nation against repeated assaults of these combined forces, can be attributed only to the grace of a merciful Saviour who, even as He tempers the wind to the shorn lamb, protects frail mortals from the evils of their own weakness, errors and folly.

### **Treason is Still Treason** No Matter Who Commits It

We are mindful of the fact that in the United States in recent years the crime of treason has been not only tolerated but encouraged until it is no longer regarded as a much more serious offense than violation of the traffic laws.

Just the same it is shocking to learn of the official attitude of this country toward American GI's who became converted to Communism while in custody of Red China as war prisoners, and who prefer to exist in slavery with their captors rather than return to the freedom of their native land.

In Panmunjom a Brigadier General A. L. Hamblen representing the "United Nations Command Teams" and who is authorized to speak for this country has assured these disloyal Americans that "being a Progressive is not considered a crime in the United States.

In Tokyo General Mark Clark chimed in with this official statement of policy: "I would remind them of the American tradition of freedom-the freedom for which they fought before their capture.'

The right of Americans to betray this country and its institutions under the guise of "liberalism" has been recognized ever since 1933 by the White House, by govern-ment agencies and by Congress and now the army brass puts its stamp of approval on treason among the troops.

We can understand how cap-tured American soldiers would have said anything, done anything and promised anything to their savage masters while prisoners of war in order to save their lives. They could, as many did, outsmart the heathens in this way and re-pudiate it on their return home.

But those few who deliberately accepted Communism and elected to remain in enemy territory should be regarded as common traitors and so treated if they should ever decide to return.

We learn that a "Food Industries Coordinating Committee" in Washington proposes for the Department of Agriculture to continue to buy butter at the national average support price of sixty-five cents per pound and to permit its resale at a reduction of ten or fifteen cents per pound into normal marketing channels.

If the Federal government would attend to its own business such as delivering the mail, levying imposts and the other limited functions which the founders delegated to it, we would not now be confronted with the threat of war, Socialism and na-

tional bankruptcy. We have read the Constitution from cover to cover many times and from cover to cover many times and we have never yet found any provi-sion in that document which author-izes the Federal government to buy butter, lipsticks, safety pins or any other commodity not necessary to the conduct of its legitimate business.

not a very good politician but I am a very obedient one." We'll say he is. He proved this fol-lowing his nomination for president last year when he knuckled under to Harry Truman, the CIO, the ADA and the machine bosses generally and servilely carried out their orders in

All this, too, after being touted as an independent thinker who had no obligations to the Fair Deal gang whatever.

#### France Is Typical Example A Sure Way To **Of Power Of Communism** End All Wars In France recently, a demonstra-

tion of Communism in practical operation pointed up a clear picture of the power of Russia to bring about national chaos by remote control. The instruments through which

the Soviets operated in attempts to demoralize the French economy were the powerful labor unions headed, in many instances, by a dangerous and lawless element.

In a paralyzing strike throughout that country the unions illustrated what Stalin and Lenin meant when they said that workers could bring about the downfall of "Capitalism" by concerted action without blood-

Not that France had much "Capitalism" to fall since it is mostly a Socialized set-up with nationalized industry and a totalitarian economy, for the most part, based on the same Cacibitit activity activity and a totalitarian economy. Socialistic policies which prevail in most countries outside the United States, and which is fast gaining foothold here. Those who are inclined to change

# FALSE AMERICAN PEOPLE GROSSLY DECEIVED BY PROPAGANDA ON OBJECTIVES OF UNITED NATIONS

The story of the world conspiracy as embodied in the United Nations has been told to the American people many times but no clearer picture of this subversive organization has been drawn than that presented by Honorable Usher L. Burdick, Congressman from North Dakota.

Addressing a large gathering in attendance at a meeting of the American Flag Committee in Philadelphia, Mr. Burdick, with refresh-ing candor and honesty, said in part: As I am a Member of the House and

not of the Senate, I was never called upon to vote on the approval of the Charter of the United Nations. T knew the principal authors of this Charter were a Russian representative and Alger Hiss, of the State Department. This conspicuous authorship was full notice to me, and should have been to all others, that a program was being formulated that was inimical to the interests of the United States

After the San Francisco Convention, where the Charter was approved, I was more certain than before that the people of the United States, if they understood all the proposals set forth in the charter, would not approve the document.

When the matter of the approval of the charter came before the Senate the same universal appeal for world peace was stressed and it was made to appear that this peace depended upon the support to be given to the charter. Under this state of feeling the document was approved by the Senate of the United States, with the dissent of only two Senators in the whole body. To North Dakota and Minnesota goes the credit of having the two Senators who saw in the charter the sinister purposes which

the charter the sinister purposes which later appeared in the open. Those who sponsored the approval of the charter and continued support to the United Nations issued assur-ance after assurance that there was nothing contained in the charter, and nothing intended by the United Na-tions that would in any way interfere with our own national sovereignty. The public of the United States was bombarded with pamphlets and leaf-lets, the radio boomed with speeches advocating the united support of our people to this "great document for peace." False propaganda advocat-ing the support of this program for peace was peddled to our higher insti-

ing the support of this program for peace was peddled to our higher insti-tutions of learning, to minor colleges, and to the common schools. Many ministers who prayed for peace, were taken off their guard and openly supported the United Nations, and in many cases the mulpits because for supported the United Nations, and in many cases the pulpits became for-iums for the United Nations. The irony of this whole procedure was that the people of the United States were paying in taxes for this whole propaganda enterprise of deceit. When I first read the charter I saw

in it an attempt to form a world government, and if possible, to make the United States merely a subserv-ient member of this world organiza-tion. We were told again that these fears were wholly unfounded. We were advised again that all the United Nations wanted was to work for world peace, and that no individual nation would be interfered with. But startling things were to hap-pen. First of all was the Fujii case in California. In this case the district court held that the local law of Cali-fornia (preventing Japanese nationals fears were wholly unfounded.

fornia (preventing Japanese nationals from holding land) was void because it conflicted with the charter of the United Nations. Here we had the first lesson in imposing upon local com-

munities the will of the United Nations.

The next startling case was the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States in the Truman steri seizure action. There is nothing in our Constitution to authorize the seizure, but the Chief Justice held it was valid for the reason that the United Nations Charter gave such authority. It is easy to see the importance of this decision, for if the majority of the Court had adopted the views of the Chief Justice the Con-stitution of the United States would have been overruled by the Charter of the United Nations. . . . The Declaration of Human Rights,

issued by the United Nations, was circulated by the millions of copies in the United States; and the prin-ciples therein contained were not very That was the docu objectionable. objectionable. That was the docu-ment that was circulated and publi-cized, but the Covenant of Human Rights, headed for the Senate, was an entirely different document. In it an entirely different document. In it an attempt was made to redefine free speech, a free press, and free religion; and this document, ignoring the pro-visions in our Constitution, undertook to say that everyone was entitled to the privilege of free speech except as limited by law, and except as it might interfere with the purposes of the United Nations. This was such an open and notorious attempt to change our and notorious attempt to change our Constitution that the public became alarmed, and the covenant was with-

alarmed, and the covenant was with-drawn from the Senate. For many months the United Na-tions has been working on the pro-visions of a World Court, in which jurisdiction over what the United Nations is pleased to call a crime is lodged. If, perchance, I made a speech in North Dakota against the insidious attempt of the United Nations to inin North Dakota against the insidious attempt of the United Nations to in-terfere with our local affairs or to surreptitiously change our Constitu-tion, that would be a crime as seen by the United Nations. I am arrested, and where am I tried? Is the trial to be held in North Dakota, under the provisions of the Constitution of North Dakota and the Constitution? North Dakota and the Constitution of No, I will be tried wherever the World Court determines. Thus I, as a citizen of the United States, whose ancestors came here 330 years ago, can be taken out of this country and

can be taken out of this country and tried in a foreign country, with no protection under the Constitution of the United States. Is that what the people of the United States want? Their next move was the propaga-tion of UNESCO, the United Nations Economic Scientific, and Cultural Or-ganization, in which our children were to be memorated for membershin in a ganization, in which our children were to be prepared for membership in a world government, and it was made specific that loyalty to the United States and reverence for our great leaders like Washington and Jefferson leaders like Washington and Jerferson was detrimental to fidelity to a world government. They propose to destroy a strong national spirit and respect for the institutions of the United States and replace them with loyalty to a world government. Is that what the people of the United States want We the according for UNESCO is Yet the propaganda for UNESCO still going on unabated and paid for by the taxpayers of the United States. Up until this year, while I fully

believed the United Nations had for its main purpose the establishment of a world government, nothing was done in the open in this direction. Now comes the unvarnished truth of this effort.

The House of Commons of England appointed a committee to study the question of whether or not England should join the Confederation of World Government. There have already been two such conferences on this matter, and the second one reported January 21, 1953.

This movement toward a world government is starting to rise not only in England, but in the United States we have had speakers traveling across this country holding meetings and advocating it. I have always seen in the Charter of the United Nations the framework of a world government; hence, it is evident to me that the United Nations is behind this whole scheme

Not many Americans can believe what this report says the United Nations is trying to do. For years now I have been stating that the ultimate objective of the United Nations could not possibly be less than the estab-lishment of a world government. I could see what was intended from speeches and articles, and although no outright statement was made of no outright statement was made of an intended world government the conclusion I reached was correct. Now the situation has cleared. The curtain is up, and the players behind the scenes come forward as leaders

of a declared play for world govern-

ment. The remarks made by the leaders of the United Nations — American leaders — that the people of this country should not be alarmed over anything the United Nations is doing because they are only working for world peace, were not accepted at the for whether the time they were

world peace, were not accepted at their face value at the time they were made; and now I know they were deliberately lying.... Anyone charged with crime here in the United States has all the safe-guards against injustice available to him. He must be tried by a jury of his peers; he must be confronted with the witnesses against him: and the the witnesses against him; and the place of his trial is that where the crime is alleged to have been committed

In this new world government all In this is repealed and our courts are annulled. In place of them—from the lowest to the Supreme Court of the United States—the world government intends to create a world court and establish its own criminal code; and in case an individual is charged with a crime he will be tried wherever the world court says he will be tried. The London Conference ed Nations. proposed two ways of doing this: First, by a revision of the whole Charter of the United Nations; or, second, by amendments to the charter

So after all the real purpose behind the organization of the United Nations has come to light. Its very purpose was to organize a world govpose was to organize a world gov-ernment under the false guise that such a structure would result in world peace; and hence it is that its first objective is the building of this world government. Bishop Dagwell has, of course, been cited as a member of several Com-munist fronts and his name has ap-peared in the Daily Worker, official Communist publication in the United States, showing his activity in con-nection with such organizations. During the campaign Portland newspapers carried vicious attacks on Rev. Riddick by Bishop Dagwell, but not only refused to print Rev.

but not only refused to print Rev. Riddick's reply as an interview but also refused to accept a paid adver-tisement embodying his answer to the Bishop.

George Dixon, one of our favorite columnists, sees nothing but irony in the fact that Harry Truman will get special treatment from the Treasury in the matter of tax payments on his memoirs. It is, he claims, a flagrant miscarriage of justice.
