

- OUT LINE FOR COUNTY CAMPAIGN-

Preliminary Work:

-
- I. Secure list of County Precincts.
 - II. Locate a Suffragist in each Community.
 - III. Run Suffrage articles with special stress on state organization in each paper in county.
 - IV. Keep Suffrage literature in the county rest-room.

Campaign

-
- I. Definitely outline the route; towns to be covered; day and hour of meeting.
 - II. Run news stories in all county papers and city papers circulating in county.
 - A. First, story, on the speakers, about two weeks before campaign; Use their pictures if possible.
 - B. Second: story, Schedule of campaign and comments on the speakers and members of party.
 - III. Send posters to local women to be put up, one week before meeting.
 - IV. Ask local women to secure hall for meeting; Appoint Chairmen and 'Phon prominent people a "special invitation"
 - V. Meetings:

In towns of any size it is advisable to hold two meetings- A public meeting and an organization meeting. In smaller towns organization can be effected after the public meeting.
 - VI. Plan a county rally at the county seat to close campaign and urge friends from over the county to attend. In pleasant weather an open air meeting is good.

Follow up Work

-
- I. The county chairman should keep in touch with all precinct organizations. Send them speeches; literature and generally over-see and advise.
 - II. A county organization with delegates from each precinct should be found and county officers elected. Com., Pres., Legislative, Education and finance.
 - III. The county press chairman should keep the county papers supplied with items of state or national interest. The local chairmen should supply her with news of all local activities.
 - IV. County meetings should be held at regular intervals.

Special Notes

- - - - -

- I. All counties are divided into voting precincts. All voters living in a precinct vote at the small polling booths. In a sparsely settled county, several small villages may be in the same precinct. A large town or city will include a number of precincts. It is the smallest unit of political organization, - the one that comes directly in touch with the voter and is hence the most important.

- ii. On locating a Suggragist in each town; The women of your organization will probably know some feminine live wire in each community. A trip through the county to call on these women, and secure their promise of co-operation in advertising meetings would be valuable.

- iii. News Stories.

Find out the kind of cuts your local papers can use and notify the state office.
Write your story out in full and if possible have it typed.
Take copies to each paper and the local correspondent of the city papers, if possible vary the stories. Remember the newspapers want local news and names.

- iv. Finally:

On arranging for your campaign remember the organizer or speaker has but human strength and that she probably finishes your campaign only to begin another. She can and will speak twice a day or even three times, but save her strength between times. If you can arrange for her entertainment considerable expense can be saved the state organization.
