Dear Mrs Cunningham:-

Will you please send me a copy of the letter written by Governor Hobby in reply to question of how he stood on suffrage when he made the race for Lt Governor in 1918. I want to use it to show that he is not just a recent convert to suffrage. Please let me have this as soon as possible as we want to start some literature to our country boxes as soon as we get thru with the Liberty Loan which ends today. We have some good organizations now in the different little towns and communities in Harris County that we feel will give us good results. A lot of work is needed in the country.

Have not heard from or of you lately but I know you are doing good work where ever you are and I hope you are taking care of yourself.

I suppose you know that my ~~name~~ husband has on the kahki. Which means that I am not on y "doing my bit" but giving up my best. If this cussed war would only be over- why did nt that quake that shook California hit Germany instead and get Hindenburg's line. Well we are going to win so- we may as well buckle down to work and sacrifice- I dont know what I am going to do without my partner but I will do my best to take care of my part. He looks very fine in the uniform every one says-

Wehn are you coming by to see us. The latch string is always on the outside. Will send you report Monday about the county- we sold over \$74,000 thru the woman's committee in the county precincts- which considering the sparsely settled country I think is fine. Our suffrage organization raised way over its quarter of a million that it set itself to do.

Please let me have copy of the Hobby letter at once if you will.
