

Beepball World Series starts Friday

The action at Houston's first Beepball World Series starts at 8:30 a.m. Friday when former Astro Bob Aspromante throws the first ball.

That will launch three days of fun, excitement and fierce competition at Sportsman's Park in west Houston on Jones Road near Highway 290 and FM 1960. The fifth World Series to be played, it will draw teams from Kansas, Arkansas, South Dakota, Minnesota, Illinois, and New Mexico as well as Dallas and Fort Worth. All games will be free to the general public.

While Friday's first round of competition will start at 9 a.m., a second round will begin at 1 p.m. Two rounds of play will again be held at 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Saturday—as well as a 4 p.m. game which will decide which team will wind up in third place.

Which teams will emerge as first and second place winners? That will be determined Sunday by competition which begins at 9 a.m. The winning teams will be honored at an awards ceremony later that day.

World Series festivities also will in-

clude a 6:30 p.m. barbecue and 8 p.m. dance Saturday at the Ramada Inn Northwest, headquarters hotel for the participating teams.

Sponsored by Shell, the World Series will be conducted largely by volunteers from the Complex and other Shell locations. These volunteers will serve as umpires and also will handle other duties such as transporting players and registering them.

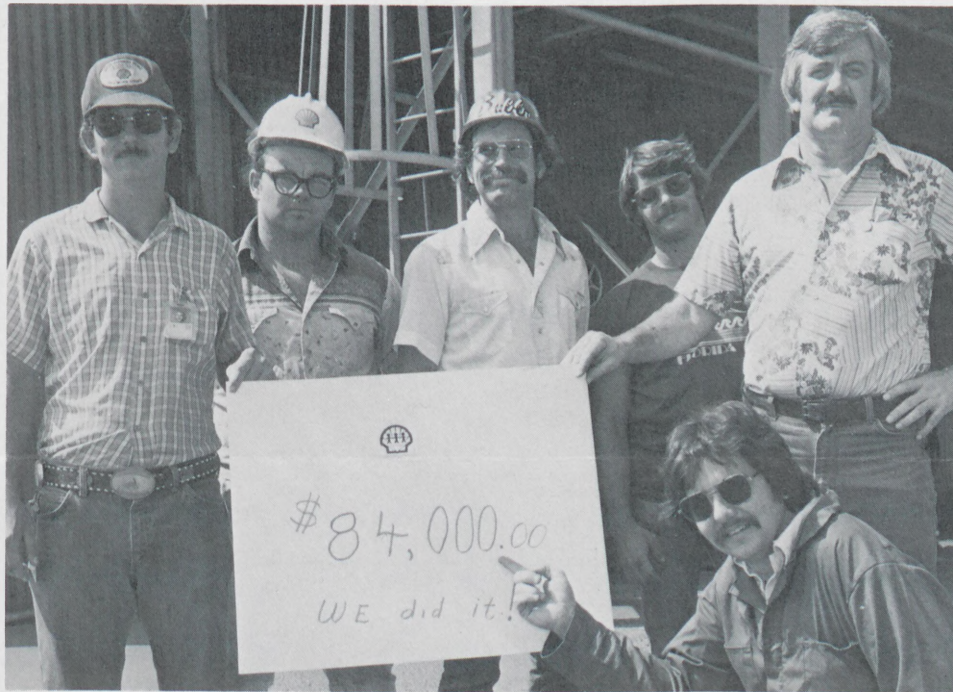
Programs for North employees will be held at the North Cafeteria, while programs for South personnel will be presented in Room 116 of the South Administration Building.
