Toward the latter part of next week. I hope to get out two outlines of work. - one for towns having camps and one for the towns not having camps. Sorry that is not ready right this minute, but lack of funds for printing and material hamper us daistyacefully!

In the meantime, may I suggest that a membership canvass to get in all of the sympathizers (men particularly) would be a good thing. And planning for the meeting we spoke of when I was there, - as to this meeting, I find I can place Mrs. Speer (who is an older woman than Miss Engle) in Hunts-ville on the seventeenth or eighteenth, if you wanted her, while it may be the first of August before I can get Miss Engle in this part of the state. As I stated when in Huntsville, there will be no expense attached to Mrs. Speer's coming.
