I am replying to your letter addressed to the Director of Admissions of the Houston Junior College since the Houston Junior College is a Division of the University of Houston.

In answer to your question as to whether Negroes are admitted to the University of Houston, I must reply that to date none has been admitted. The subject of desegregation is a matter of active study on the part of our Board of Governors, but no action can be expected in time to change our admission policies for the fall, 1958.

May I point out to you, however, that we have in Houston an excellent sister institution, Texas Southern University. As a state institution for Negroes, it has tuition much lower than ours, the University of Houston being a privately supported institution.
