

UNDERGROUND SENTINEL--When the 635-mile long, 40-inch Capline pipeline is buried beneath Midwest soil, it won't be forgotten. One of the ways of keeping in touch with the huge pipeline is through sensitive monitoring devices attached to this eight-foot section of pipe. This pipe section will be placed in Capline near Memphis, Tennessee, and will provide a constant source of information on the condition of the line. Shown here checking out the various instruments attached to the pipe section are John Brown, Lab Assistant, and Tom L. Stewart, Engineer, both of Shell Pipe Line Corporation's Research and Development Laboratory. Shell Pipe, one of eight owners of the line, is presently supervising construction, and will operate the line for the owners when Capline goes into operation in the fall of 1968. Capline will transport crude from the Southern Louisiana-Gulf Coast region to Central Illinois.

WEEKLY SAFETY TIPS

Cold weather presents plugged line problems. When opening these lines remember to-

1. Wear proper gloves.
2. Protect your face with shield or hood.
3. Wear slicker suits to protect your body.
4. Wear boots or overshoes to protect your feet.
5. Do not have control valves open full.
6. Break any piping slowly.
7. Have bleeder lines secure so they will not swing or kick when plug is released.
