

To His Excellency, Governor James V. Allred
Austin, Texas

Sir:

After hearing fifty or more witnesses, we wish to report, provisionally, that we find that wages paid Mexican pecan workers in San Antonio are abnormally low, and living conditions are insupportable.

We further find that there was no evidence introduced before us that would justify police interference prohibiting picketing, or the assembling of strikers.

We heard both police, strikers and disinterested witnesses. In addition, before closing the hearing we invited both the police and the strikers to furnish further witnesses. Both sides declared they did not wish to suggest other witnesses or further testimony.
