

The meeting was called to order by Speaker Bill Hensley at 8 p.m. Following the invocation the minutes were read and approved.

Committee Reports.

Monetary and Fiscal.

House Bill #3, Optometric Society revised to total \$425.73.

House Bill #4, Tau Epsilon, revised to total \$112.37.

House Bill #5, American Society of Civil Engineers, revised to cover the expenses of five delegates reducing the total amount to \$30.

Certification and Installation.

Larry Newman was appointed new chairman. Applications were given to new representatives elected from the classes.

Social, Education and Development.

Sue Friedman, chairman, stated that plans for the year include election platforms, Cougar Christmasland, a clean-up the den campaign, and a "Welcome to the U of H" sign.

Process and Procedure.

A resolution to amend the House Rules will be introduced by Parliamentarian Allen Segal.

New members were sworn in and a division of the House was called for by Clerk Carolyn Langford.

Announcements.

Dean Ebaugh complimented Student Government with the success of the Homecoming festivities.

Old Business.

Robert Goodwin, Scabbard and Blade, moved that House Bill #2 be taken from the table. Motion passed. Then Robert moved that Sam Goodner read House Bill #2 for Scabbard and Blade. Motion carried. Sam also answered questions during discussion. Following discussion it was moved that the bill again be tabled. Motion failed. The chair was turned over to Mike Weingart, Speaker Pro-Tempore. A vote was then taken on the main motion which failed. A recount was called for and the motion again failed.

House Bill #3 was read for the second time for the Optometric Society by Morris Webb. Motion for passage carried.

House Bill #5, American Society of Civil Engineers, was presented for the second reading by Bobby Wilson. Motion carried for passage.

New Business.

Mike Weingart announced that all conventions be registered with the secretary of Student Government as soon as possible, preferably by the first meeting in December.


Sue Friedman presented the first reading of House Bill #7 allocating \$2,000 for engaging lecturers for the University.

Fred Doehring, Chairman of the Process and Procedure Committee read a bill for changing the by-laws. This bill amended the by-laws to include a provision for amendment of the Constitution. Fred moved that the House Rules be suspended to consider the change as the bill was not in the proper form. Motion passed. Fred then moved passage of the bill. Bill passed unanimously.

It was announced that bills in the future would be re-submitted if they were not in the proper form as set up by the House Rules adopted in 1961-62.
