

March 12, 1962

The meeting was called to order by Speaker Bill Hensley at 8:30 p.m. The minutes were approved as read and the invocation was given by Mike Weingart.

### Committee Reports

#### Certification and Installation.

Eight new members were accepted into the House.

The Clerk, Carolyn Langford, moved that those members with excessive absences be suspended from the House. Motion passed.

#### Monetary and Fiscal.

House Bill #18, Cougar Rifles, amended to \$20 for transportation.

House Bill #17, American Society of Mechanical Engineers, approved as presented.

House Bill #19, Cheerleaders, approved for \$877.60.

#### Social, Education and Development.

Sue Friedman, chairman, stated that although \$300 was allotted for Cougar Christmasland expenses, \$119.37 will be returned to Student Government.

#### Process and Procedure.

Chairman Fred Doehring announced that the new House Rules would be read during the business session. He also commended and thanked Allen Segal, Parliamentarian, for the help that he gave in preparing the new Rules.

#### International Student Relations.

No report.

#### Executive Committee.

1. T.I.S.A. report. It was the opinion of the committee that the University should remain a member of T.I.S.A., but that we should play a larger role in the organization. Sue Friedman will function as coordinator for T.I.S.A. for the U of H.
2. A movement for a school flag has been started, and as soon as preliminary approval is received a bill will be presented.
3. The Speaker commented on the procedure used in passing the cheerleader's bill through the House. He asked that more discretion be used in the future.

The clerk reported that a mistake had been made in swearing in Carolyn Terry. Motion was made that she be removed until her credentials come through. Motion passed.

The Speaker announced that a joint session of the House and Senate will be held on April 2, 1962.

Bennie House, President of Alpha Phi Omega, presented the problems surrounding Shasta II. They include 1) erection of a cage on campus for her, 2) the cost of food, and 3) the possibility of incorporating costs for her expenses in the Student Government budget.

OLD BUSINESS

House Bill #17 was presented for the second reading by Dorrance L. Ganter for the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. Motion was made for passage. It was moved that the bill be amended to include only five people. The amendment failed. Vote on passage of the main motion also failed.

House Bill #18 was presented for the second reading by Frances Gaudiano. The bill was to send the Cougar Rifles to a National Rifle Association meet. Motion for passage carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Gayle Smiley moved that a recess be called to have HOUSTONIAN pictures taken. Motion carried.

Fred Doehring introduced the new House Rules. It was moved that the reading be suspended until the next meeting. Motion passed with a 3/4 vote.

House Bill #20 was presented by Bob Pfister for the American Law Students Association.


House Bill #21 was presented for the Stock and Stolon Club by Mordecai Schecter.
