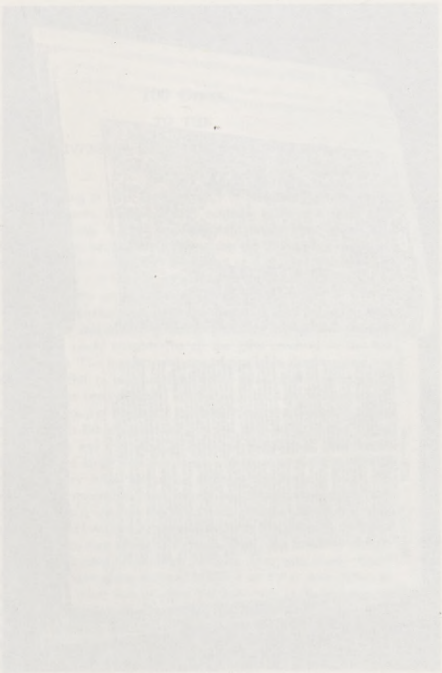
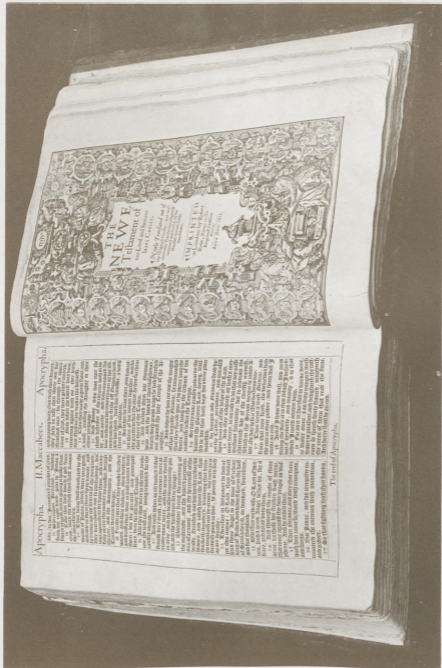

100 GIFTS
TO THE
UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON LIBRARIES

Since its beginning in 1934, the University of Houston has been building library resources. It will certainly continue to do so as long as it exists as a university. A great deal of public money from local, state, and federal sources has gone into developing the University's collection of books and related materials. The object of such expenditures is to help the students and faculty perform their functions adequately as well as to add to the general store of scholarly knowledge.

Beside purchased materials, however, the libraries have benefited from books and money given by generous friends and patrons. No one catalog could possibly list all the gifts received in the last thirty-four years. The number and size of available display cases has limited this exhibit to one hundred items. Making the selection of what to show has been difficult, but we have tried to pull together a representative group of books and material from a representative group of donors. In this list are included old and new books, books added over thirty years ago and some added since the first of 1968, books which are part of large gifts and those which are single items, books of great monetary value and some ordinary trade items which are neither rare nor expensive. Most faculty and departmental gifts have been excluded, but we have included both student and faculty gifts through the use of two John Fitzgerald Kennedy Memorial Fund items.

There were two ideas in showing these one hundred sample gifts to the University of Houston libraries. One was to say thank you to all who have given material whether or not it was shown in this exhibit. The other was to point out how very important private support is to a university library system. Without the donors, the books in this catalog would not have been available to our students and faculty. We hope other people will be encouraged to deposit old books and documents in a comparatively safe refuge or to contribute toward

the purchase of the constant flood of needed materials to supplement always limited state appropriations.

Some gifts have been so varied in nature that, to give any idea of their scope, several items have been selected. The Friends of the Library, for instance, through the years have procured both large collections and outstanding single items. The Rockwell Fund Inc. and the Rockwell Brothers Endowment, Inc., have presented a number of the most beautiful items in the Bible collection in memory of James W. Rockwell. Mr. Benjamin Clayton provided a substantial sum to establish the William B. Bates Collection of Texana and Western Americana. Through the joint gift of Mrs. Joseph W. Evans and Mrs. Alice Evans Pratt the Joseph W. Evans Bibliography Room provides an extensive collection of national and trade bibliographies. Mrs. Evans is also responsible for an impressive gift in the Revolutionary War field. The Houston Assembly of Delphian Chapters and the Vale-Asche Foundation have made notable gifts. The Bayard Turner Gross Dudley Memorial Music Library, begun by Mrs. Ray L. Dudley, has been enhanced by many gifts from many people. Miss Ima Hogg, by giving both musical scores and her memorabilia from the turn-of-the-century concerts, has contributed both to the field of music and of cultural history.

A bouquet, then, to all our donors, past, present, and future. Please accept our heartfelt thanks. The eight cases in the Exhibition Hall and the nine in the Special Collections Room on the eighth floor represent a substantial contribution in varied fields to the University of Houston libraries. For each of these gifts the administration of the University, the library staff, the students, and the faculty are indeed grateful.
