He stated that without conceiving of innovating an executive action, which had been placed before Mr. Levrija [?] against his sister, the marquise, and, in accordance with what has been prearranged, in the judicial decree that has been made known to her, she acknowledges the 11 receipts that have been brought forth, as well as 8 receipts for this year. However, she cannot account for 1 of another 20 receipts because it is unsigned. The other 7 receipts are signed by my sister because she was responsible for determining their content, which Mr. Manuel Escalera filled out at her discretion and I did receive the 100 pesos stated in each of the 7 receipts that were filled out in accordance with her comments. The stated amounts in the pension fund that should have been activated on my behalf were already established according to the right of succession in the will of my late grandmother, the Madame Countess of San Mateo. Each year, my sister had paid me two thousand pesos, during which time she either made full or small payments, which were less than the prescribed 166 pesos and silver coins. There were other months when she did not pay me at all. On the contrary, according to the stated terms of the arrangement and what I am presently authorized to receive each year, the aforementioned two thousand pesos may restore the civility and the harmony that my sister and I had while also avoiding a quarrel with her. Thus, it has been [Page 2] necessary for me to request the amounts she should give me in the manner outlined, that the three other receipts that . . . [incomplete sentence?].
