ENROLMENT,

IN CONFORMITY to an Act of the CONGRESS of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, entitled "An Act for the Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels to be employed in the Coasting Trade and Fisheries, and for regulating the same."

B. S. Parsons of the County of Galveston, State of Texas

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Act, and having sworn that *he is a*

he is a
Citizen of the United States, sole owner of the Ship or Vessel called the *Madona* of *Galveston* whereof *R. Samson* is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that *he* is a Citizen of the United States, and the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania* in the year *1847* as per Certificate of Enrolment dated at the Port of *Shildborough* on the *sixth* day of *August* - *1852* Numbered *Six (6)* properly changed hands, now owned by *B. S. Parsons*

and said Enrolment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has *one* deck and *two* masts, and that her length is *Seventy Nine* feet *Five* inches her breadth *Twenty one* feet *—* inches, her depth *Six* feet *Five* inches, and that she measures *Ninety Six and 11/98* Tons:

that she is a *Schooner* has a *square stern* *no Galleries* and a *Billit* head: And the said *B. S. Parsons* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given according to the said Act, the said *Schooner* has been duly Enroled at the PORT OF GALVESTON.
