Van Der Rohe, 83, Famed Architect, Dies in Chicago

Chicago (UPI) — Ludwig Mies Van Der Rohe, 83, internationally known architect and former director of the Bauhaus School of Design, died late Sunday after a long illness.

Van Der Rohe began his career in 1907 in Berlin. His projects and buildings in the 1920s established his prominence among leaders of modern architecture.

He was director of the Bauhaus from 1930 to 1933. In 1937 he left Germany for the United States to become director of the school of architecture and plan-

ning at Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago.

Among his outstanding designs are the master plan for the IIT campus, apartment buildings on Chicago's Lake Shore Drive, the Seagram building in New York City and the recently completed new national gallery in East Gerlin.

The architect designed the glass-walled Cullinan Hall wing of Houston's Museum of Fine Arts, which was completed in 1958, and also had completed plans for a second phase for the museum which would double the existing space.
