Dear Sir:

It has once again come to the attention of the Austin Branch of the International League for Peace and Freedom that the most fundamental civil rights of American citizens are being flagrantly disregarded and trampled underfoot by the officials of the City of San Antonio whose duty it is to protect these very rights.

We refer specifically to the prohibition of peaceful picketing and the illegal arrests (without preferment of charges) in the present strike of the Pecan Shellers Union, affiliate of the Committee for Industrial Organization.

We most strongly protest this infringement of rights duly accorded every American citizen by laws on the Federal statute books, and desire assurance from you that there shall be no further infringements of this nature.

Copies of this letter have been forwarded to Governor James V. Allred and Congressman Maury Maverick.
