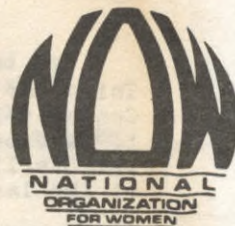

This year NOW gave the Susan B. Anthony Award to the Austin Rape Crisis Center. They perform a really vital function in Austin, and we're happy to have been able to offer them this recognition. Lobby Day on the 13th was pretty successful. People showed up from across the state in large numbers ... except from Austin. Those of us from Austin were so few, we all went to the Capitol in my car. I am, however, trying to point out how desperately we need to show the Legislators that we do exist. This is of course a plea to write letters. Letters are very, very important. I understand how hard it is to provide us with your body, but I don't see any reason for not writing letters. If we lose the ERA, and that possibility now exists, it will be our fault; we will have lost it all by ourselves. The opposition is not that strong in numbers, but they are vocal; we are helping them by not doing anything. So please write, and get your friends, family, and mothers to write.

Membership Renewal

If you are a member who joined before October 1974, NOW is the time to renew your membership; your three-month grace period expires in March. Austin NOW is active in many ways - among them, fighting the ERA rescission effort, fighting sex discrimination in the school system, lobbying for an affirmative action plan for the city government, etc. To continue these activities, we need your continued support, financially and by your active participation.

If you are not yet a member, NOW is the time to join. If you wish to attend the State Convention, you will save money by joining and pre-registering for it by March 1. If you share our goals, please join NOW - we need your support.

Membership dues are \$15/year regular, reduced to \$7.50/year special for students, retirees, and others who can't afford the \$15. Dues include national as well as local; it is required that chapter members also be national members. Dues paid between January and September cover through December of the year in which they were paid; dues paid between October and December cover through December of the following year.

Membership in NOW is open to all who share our goals of full legal, social, economic, and political equality for women in the U.S. Members receive the local and national newsletters, and are eligible to run for office and to vote in the chapter elections, held annually in December.

The Austin NOW Newsletter is published monthly. It contains news of the chapter's activities, and also a summary of feminist news around Austin. Non-members may subscribe to the Newsletter, at a cost of \$3/year (25¢/copy). Free 3-month trial subscriptions are available upon request.

Austin NOW Business Meeting Summary

February 5: Voted to award the chapter's Third Annual Susan B. Anthony Day Award to the Austin Rape Crisis Center.

February 19: Voted to invite all five Travis County Legislators to be guests of the Chapter at the State Convention's Legislative Luncheon.... Voted to reduce the price of our feminist pendants to \$4.50 and \$5, and to sell matching earrings for \$4.50.... Voted to give \$25 of the profits from the Maria Isabel Barreno reception to the NOW International Committee, and to give the remaining \$50 to Texans for the ERA.... Voted to have chapter stationery for Austin NOW designed and printed by Sterling Kwik-Kopy. It will cost about \$40.... Voted to get a post office box at the Northeast Station rather than waiting for one more centrally located.... The President moved to change the chapter by-laws so that the president cannot succeed herself/himself. Current by-laws limit elected officers to two consecutive terms in any one office. Opposition was expressed to the amendment; further consideration and discussion was recommended.... Discussed providing a Chapter phone in the President's home if the Women's Center does not soon obtain an answering device.... Jeff Friedman has asked to speak to us; voted to invite Bud Dryden also, now that he has announced candidacy for Mayor too.... Voted to set up a Program Committee. Anyone interested, please call the President.... Voted to turn Austin NOW's newspaper clippings over to the Secretary, who will put them in a Chapter scrapbook.... Voted to order T-shirts displaying the official International Women's Year symbol. The Chapter will sell them for \$5 each. Ordered 12 each in the two available color choices: navy with red, or powder blue with royal blue. Hope to have them by the Convention.... Voted to insert the minutes of the business meetings in the Newsletter, even if it requires adding an extra page.

Susan B. Anthony Day

Austin NOW joined other Texas NOW members on February 13th in celebrating Susan B. Anthony's birthday by lobbying for the ERA at the State Capitol. The day's festivities included a reception in the Governor's Room at the Capitol. (We're moving up; last year, it was in the Lt. Governor's Room.) And NOW President Donna Walker-Ashworth accepted a Proclamation of Susan B. Anthony Day from the City Council.

Austin NOW capped its day by awarding the Third Annual Susan B. Anthony Award to the Austin Rape Crisis Center in a ceremony at the Capitol. Lee Donaldson, Director of the Rape Crisis Center, and Laura Brookshire, President of the Board of Directors of ARCC, accepted the award on behalf of all the ARCC volunteers. Austin NOW salutes the Rape Crisis Center for its service to the women of Austin, and offers our continued support.

A word of thanks for our publisher, Lee Sterling. Due to a misunderstanding, printing of the Award was not ordered until the morning of the 13th. He printed it in time for the noon ceremony, delivering it to the Capitol himself. Lee - you're a doll!

AISE Sex Discrimination Study

Austin NOW is joining with WEAL (Women's Equity Action League), the AWPC (Austin Women's Political Caucus), and the Women's Law Caucus in a study of sex discrimination in the Austin Independent School District. Areas to be studied are: employment, counselling, curriculum, and athletics. The first meeting of the coalition group will be Thursday, March 13, at 7:30 pm at the Austin Women's Center. The meeting will be chaired by Kay Bieberdorf and Dr. Paula Latimer, who worked on similar WEAL studies in Dallas and Waco. The goal of the Conference is to draw up short-term and long-term plans of action for stimulating governments to incorporate women in policy-making levels and to include programs for women in their development plans. Texas State NOW By-Laws

- I. **NAME:** The name of this organization shall be the Texas State National Organization for Women, to be known as the Texas State NOW.
- II. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of Texas State NOW shall be to further the purposes and policies of NOW in the state of Texas, and to:
 - 1) Establish a vehicle for coordinated state action;
 - 2) Foster understanding by exchange of information and ideas among NOW members in the state of Texas;
 - 3) Assist the growth of membership and new chapters in the state; and to
 - 4) Facilitate coordination between chapters in the state of Texas and the national NOW office and national NOW officers.
- III. **MEMBERSHIP:** The membership of Texas State NOW shall include all national members of NOW residing in the state of Texas, which includes:
 - 1) Members of Texas NOW chapters, duly chartered by national NOW;
 - 2) Members of convening chapters, which have applied for a provisional charter within the state;
 - 3) Members of convening groups, which have an officially recognized convener, but which have not yet applied for a provisional charter;
 - 4) Members at-large residing in the state, but not affiliated with any Texas chapter, convening chapter, or convening group.
- IV. **STRUCTURE:** The structure of Texas State NOW shall consist of:
 - 1) The elected officers:
 - a) The State Coordinator
 - b) The State Treasurer
 - c) The State Fund Raiser
 - d) The State Legislative Coordinator
 - e) The State Communications Coordinator
 - f) The five State Membership Coordinators
 - 2) The State Council, which shall consist of:
 - a) The ten elected state officers;
 - b) One delegate elected from each chapter, convening chapter, and convening group;
 - c) Elected delegates to represent unaffiliated members at-large from each area of the state (as designated in the first planning conference) in proportion to the percent of the NOW at-large population in each respective area based on current state membership statistics. Each area will be entitled to at least one delegate, regardless of the percentage of its NOW at-large population.
- V. **STATE CONVENTION:** A State Convention of all Texas NOW members shall make policy to carry out the purpose of the Texas State NOW;
 - 1) The State Convention shall meet no less than once every eighteen (18) months. The State NOW Council shall fix the exact date and place of the convention and give the chapters and members at-large (including convening chapters and groups) at least ninety (90) days notice thereof;
 - 2) The State Convention shall elect state officers. A caucus of unaffiliated members at-large shall be called at the convention to elect at least one delegate from each area in proportion to each area's NOW at-large population;
 - 3) Policy set by the State Convention shall pertain only to Texas NOW members and shall be consistent with policy of national NOW where such policy is stated;
 - 4) Quorum rules will be established when a state membership list is available. Voting and discussion in plenary sessions shall be limited to duly registered NOW members.

VI. STATE COUNCIL: The State Council shall serve to implement policy set at the State Convention and facilitate action between conventions:

- 1) The State Council shall meet at least once every six months at the call of the State Coordinator, or no less than twenty percent (20%) of the elected delegates to the council. Members of the council shall be notified of the time, place, and date of the meetings at least three (3) weeks in advance;
- 2) A quorum of the State Council shall consist of a majority of chapter delegates, convening chapters, and groups. Meetings of the council shall be open to all NOW members;
- 3) The state officers shall be voting members of the council, except the State Coordinator who will vote only in case of a tie;
- 4) The State NOW Council shall function according to the following guidelines:
 - a) The Council shall not duplicate the functions of the chapters;
 - b) The Council may recommend, but all program action is taken by the chapters;
 - c) Chapter policy is made within the chapters;
 - d) The State NOW Council shall serve the chapters.

VII. STATE OFFICERS:

- 1) Election: The state officers shall be elected at the State Convention to serve between conventions. They may serve no more than two consecutive terms. They shall be elected as a result of self nominations. They shall be elected by a majority of duly registered attendees present and voting, and they shall take office at the end of the State Convention during which they were elected.
- 2) Duties of the Officers:
 - a) The State Coordinator shall be the titular head of Texas State NOW; shall preside at the State Convention, and call and preside at meetings of the State Council; shall be the official spokesperson for the Texas chapters and members in circumstances not inconsistent with national NOW and chapter guidelines. The State Coordinator shall serve as the official state contact person and liaison between Texas State NOW and Regional and National officers of NOW; shall assist the Regional Director in the formation of new chapters; shall keep track of the status of chapters and members in the state of Texas; and shall facilitate the exchange of information through the publication of a state newsletter.
 - b) The State Treasurer: shall receive and disburse all funds held in common by the chapters and members of the Texas State NOW; shall prepare an annual budget of such funds to be approved by the State Council and voted upon at the State Convention; shall issue annual financial statements in cooperation with the State Fund Raiser to the membership and interim financial statements to the State Council at its regular meetings; and shall submit records for audit on an annual basis.
 - c) The State Fund Raiser shall work with the State Treasurer on projected state budget; shall work with individual chapters, convening chapters and groups to assist in local and statewide fund raising; shall develop statewide resources for funding from individuals, business and industry; shall coordinate with NOWLDEF at state level for chapter and state projects.

- d) The State Membership Coordinators, five (5) shall be duly elected by their respective area groups. The five Coordinators for Membership shall be responsible for maintaining current membership lists of NOW members throughout the state of Texas, by area and by affiliation status (chapter, convening chapters and groups); shall be responsible for coordinating area delegate at-large elections to conform with area delegate at-large requirements; shall act as state referral officials for all membership inquiries received by National and State NOW; and shall maintain contact with NOW membership coordinators in other states.
 - e) The State Legislative Coordinator shall serve the Council and Convention in an advisory capacity to recommend legislative policy and priorities, serving as liaison with NOW's National Legislative Office as well as with other women's groups within the state of Texas with similar guidelines (BPWs, LWVs, TWPCs, etc.); and shall prescribe any activities which might serve to facilitate coordination of chapters and members in achieving national and state legislative goals.
 - f) The State Communications Coordinator shall see that a record is made of official business of the Convention and Council meetings and that this record is disseminated to the chapters and members at-large within one month of the Convention or Council meetings; shall maintain a roster of State Council members; and shall be responsible for a state newsletter.
- 3) Vacancies in State Office: When a vacancy occurs in a state office between State Conventions, the State Council shall elect a replacement to serve until the next State Convention.

- VIII. NOMINATIONS FOR STATE OFFICERS shall be made by the person wishing to run (self nominations).
- IX. FINANCES: The State NOW organization shall be financed through voluntary contributions from chapters, depending on their size with the suggested guideline of one dollar (\$1.00) per paid member, and such additional funds as the elected State Fund Raiser may obtain, including NOWLDEF project funds.
- X. PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY: Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.
- XI. AMENDMENTS: These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those duly registered NOW members present and voting at the State Convention, provided that the amendments shall have been submitted in writing to the members at least four weeks prior to the Convention.
- XII. RESOLUTIONS: State Resolutions will be voted upon by the duly registered NOW members present and voting at the State Convention (2/3 of attendee members), provided that the resolutions are extensions of and/or in accord with National NOW Resolutions.

Sexuality Workshop II

The Second Sexuality Workshop sponsored by the Austin Women's Center will be held on Saturday, March 1, from 10 am until late in the afternoon. The topic is "The Female Body and Sexual Response." The morning session will be a Self-Help presentation by the Women's Health Organization (WHO in Austin). It will include a discussion of Myths and Facts about the Female Body; Breast Examination; and Self Cervical Information. The afternoon session will begin with a panel discussing their personal sexual response, with small discussion groups afterwards. Lunch and refreshments will be on sale at the Center. (The Women's Center Board is asking for donations of cookies to be sold that day; The Silver Fox will cater sandwiches for lunch.) A 75¢ donation to the Center is requested for admission. As before, the workshop will be "Women Only" to permit open discussion in C-R format.

Texas NOW State Convention News

As most of you have heard by now, the Texas NOW State Convention will be held in Austin on March 7-9, at the Sheraton Crest Inn, First St. at Congress. The Convention will feature sixteen workshops, and an address by National NOW President Karen DeCrow. If you wish to attend the Convention, please pre-register at once. Pre-registration for NOW members is \$5 through March 1; thereafter and at the Convention it will be \$10. (Non-member registration is \$20.) In addition, the Legislative Luncheon costs \$4.80; sale of Luncheon tickets closes March 5. Child care during Convention sessions will be provided only for those requesting it during pre-registration. Out-of-town members who wish to stay in the home of an Austin NOW member must also notify us by March 1. Send pre-registration money and requests to Sue Rickett, Texas NOW Treasurer, 10021 Childress Drive, Austin, TX 78753.

We anticipate some difficulty in confirming NOW membership status during registration. We expect to have a copy of the national mailing list for the state; however, it is not always up-to-date or completely accurate. It will speed your registration if you will bring some proof of membership status: membership card, a recent issue of Do It NOW, or your cancelled check for dues. Note: under national by-laws, 1974 members are considered as members in good standing through March 31, 1975.

Proposed Changes to Texas NOW By-Laws

The following changes to the Texas State NOW By-Laws were proposed by Dallas County NOW. They will be discussed and voted upon at the State Convention. A copy of the current by-laws will be available at the chapter meeting on March 5th; or call Sue Rickett or Donna Walker-Ashworth for details of the original by-laws.

IV. Structure:

- 1) delete c) The State Fund Raiser and f) The five State Membership Coordinators
- 2) a) substitute the four elected state officers for the ten elected state officers; c) delete from each area of the state (as designated in first planning conference) in proportion to the percent of the N.O.W. at-large population in each respective area based on current state membership statistics. Each area will be entitled to at least one delegate regardless of the percentage of its N.O.W. at-large population. replace with c) At-large delegates shall meet together at the state convention and elect one delegate for every 50 at-large members in the state.

VI. State Council:

- 2) substitute --A quorum of the State Council shall consist of a majority of chapter delegates, convening chapter delegate, convening group delegates, and state officers. Meetings of the council shall be open to all N.O.W. members.

VII. State Officers:

- 2) Duties of the Officers b) State Treasurer delete in cooperation with the State Fund Raiser; add In addition, the Treasurer shall develop statewide resources for funding from individuals, business, and industry; shall coordinate with NOWLDEF at state level for chapter and State projects. e) delete paragraph describing job of State Membership Coordinators. (Ed. note: Our copy lists this as d); also, they have implicitly deleted paragraph c), which describes the office of State Fund Raiser.)

IX. Finances:

delete State Fund Raiser and substitute State Treasurer
