Besides giving a thorough groundwork in general civics it lays down for the newly-enfranchised woman certain principles upon which to base her judgment of public issues and candidates. It tells what citizenship *means*, and how to *use* it as an effective instrument to accomplish results in the federal, state and local government.

Mrs. CARRIE CHAPMAN CATT contributes a valuable chapter entitled "Passing the Federal Suffrage Amendment" in which she outlines the arguments for Woman Suffrage as a necessary war measure, and points out the peculiar fitness of the approaching climax to forty years' effort of American women at a time when they are proving by splendid service to the State that they are worthy of the highest trust; when men are waking to the fact that true Democracy to be defended abroad must be practised at home.

Suffrage clubs throughout the country and the many women's civics clubs which have succeeded them in woman suffrage states, will find **THE WOMAN CITIZEN** especially adapted to use as a handbook for club study and discussion.
