"The Great Barrier Reef," filmed by underwater photographers Ron and Valerie Taylor, examines the vast empire of 2,000 individual reefs off Australia's northeast coast, built almost entirely by tiny coral polyp. And the film also examines the sealife that makes the 1,200 -mile-long reef its home.
