In January, 1930, Joseph Stalin made this pertinent observation.

"The present development of Bolshevik action in the USA has been prepared at Moscow with the greatest care. The Revolutionary Crisis has not yet arrived in the USA, but there are already numerous indications which lead us to believe that it is near. The Third International has enabled the Communist Party in America to reach a stage where it can actively prepare the masses for future revolution."

In spite of this and scores of other public warnings of Bolshevik plans against the USA, Roosevelt recognized Russia four years later and the advancement of the Soviet cause in this country since then is history.

"Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, more than any other man of his generation, has opened the public's eyes to that greatest danger to the nation — the black hand of Communism which is casting its shadow over the world" — Ray H. Jenkins, Knoxville, Tennessee, committee counsel in Army-McCarthy hearings.

We wonder how many intelligent Americans think that Wayne Morse could do a tonsillectomy, Sherman Adams remove a gall bladder or Sam Rayburn perform a Caesarean section?

This sounds like the ultimate in absurdity and it is but it is no more ridiculous than the belief prevalent in many circles that we should have Socialized Medicine in this country and that the medical profession should be controlled by Washington politicians.

Every time bureaucrats have ventured into extraneous activities having to do with private endeavor, they have fouled up the works like they did with the railroads in World War I, but they hold stubbornly to the conviction that they can do a better job of running a business or a profession than those who have spent a lifetime on the job.

The subject of Socialized Medicine is being kept alive by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare which is influenced largely by Rockefeller internationalists who wouldn't mind adding doctors to the other groups they control.

Under existing Federal law contributions and donations to organizations engaged in educational, charitable and other non-political activities are tax-exempt. Taking advantage of this provision are scores of organizations which are not only political but subversive since their objective is to abolish Constitutional government in this country and set up a National Socialist State. One such group has had twenty-eight officials connected with it who have a combined record of 351 Communist Front affiliations. Was it intended that the tax-exemption privilege should be abused in this manner?

No one under the sun knows how many billions of dollars the Treasury Department of the United States is losing by extending tax-exemption privileges to organizations and groups whose fraudulent claims to educational and non-political activity enable them to escape a tax burden which honest Americans must pay or go to jail.

A request by a taxpayer to the Treasury Department for a list of the preferred Americans who enjoy such tax exemption will be answered with ambiguous explanations and double-talk but the taxpayer won't get the requested list.

We have the names of 250 such Americans whose organizations are tax-exempt but this does not include the tax-free foundations, cooperatives and other groups and publications who are getting a free ride in the matter of income taxes in staggering amounts which must be made up through heavy assessments against other Americans who have not been so favored.

The list in our possession was taken from a book published by the Foreign Policy Association in 1953 titled "U. S. Citizens in World Affairs" and although these 250 organizations to which we refer are allowed to hold out the advantage of tax-exemption to their contributors, not one of them is committed, in their published literature, to the preservation of the American Constitution and Bill of Rights or to efforts for perpetuating the American form of government.

Below are just a few scattered illustrations of hundreds of organizations who have been granted Federal tax status, although those who head such organizations have been officially cited as belonging to Communist fronts.

"League for Industrial Democracy", Dr. Harry W. Laidler, executive director. This LID makes no attempt to conceal its subversive activities and openly asserts that it "exchanges information with the Fabian Society of Great Britain". In 1932, the Commissioner of Internal Revenue attempted to get its tax-exemption privileges withdrawn in a lawsuit titled Weyl vs Commissioner, 48 Federal, (2nd) 811, but the League won the case and has continued to operate under tax-exempt status. The Reece Committee of Congress, in its official report last year, recommended that the Bureau of Internal Revenue move again to have the tax-exempt status of LID revoked.

The LID was originally the "Inter-collegiate Socialist Society" set up to promote Socialism among college students. After it changed its name to LID, its official publication "Revolt" boldly announced: "The League for Industrial Democracy is a militant educational movement which challenges those who would think and act, for a new social order based on production for use and not for profit. This is a revolutionary slogan. It means that members of the LID think and work for the elimination of capitalism and the substitution for it of a new social order, in whose building the purposeful and passionate thinking of student and worker today will play an important part".

Dr. Harry W. Laidler, its director, is shown in official reports of the Un-American Activities Committee of the House of Representatives as having belonged to two Communist fronts, the American Student Union and the Consumers National Federation and as a signer in the Golden Book of American-Soviet Friendship. Laidler is a life-long Socialist and has spent all his adult years in efforts to convert the government of the United States into a National Socialist State.

As honest, patriotic Americans rush to meet the April 15th deadline each year and hand over their tax money to avoid penalties, the

English Girls Balk At Degrading Practice In American Air Force

League for Industrial Democracy hauls in tax-exempt dollars in contributions earned or accumulated under the operation of the American free enterprise system which the LID is exerting its efforts to destroy. Is it the intention of the Treasury Department to extend tax-exemption to those who would dismantle the American form of government and replace it with a Socialist system?

"The Fellowship of Reconciliation", A. J. Muste, national secretary. A Report of Hearings of a Special Committee on Un-American Activities, 75th Congress, page 364 says: "The Fellowship of Reconciliation is the fountain-head of a planned movement in the United States to destroy the patriotism of the American people". It is a branch of the International Fellowship of Reconciliation which requires that its members must work for the radical reorganization of society and replace the Capitalistic system with collective ownership.

A. J. Fuste, its national secretary, is a veteran Communist front having been listed as affiliated with such officially cited subversive organizations as the American League Against War and Fascism, Greater New York Emergency Conference on Inalienable Rights, Consumers National Federation and the National Mooney Council of Action.

Those who contribute to the Fellowship of Reconciliation may deduct such donations for income tax purposes. Does the Treasury Department feel that such organizations as this should be granted the tax-exemption privileges intended only for "educational" and similar movements?

"American Council of Learned Societies", Mortimer Graves, administrative secretary. Graves was sponsor of a dinner dedicated to American-Soviet Post War Relations given under the auspices of the American-Russian Institute cited by the attorney general of the United States in 1949 as a Communist front. He was associated with the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, Inc. declared by the attorney general in 1944 as subversive. He was chairman of China Aid News, cited as the official organ of the Communist front Committee to aid China. In the Record of the Cox Committee Hearings, page 544, Committee Council Keefe read a further long list of Communist fronts with which Graves was affiliated.

Those who contribute to the American Council of Learned Societies are privileged to deduct their donation for income tax purposes. Does the Treasury Department approve its tax-exemption policy being granted to organizations of this type?

"American Friends Service Committee", Henry Cadbury, chairman. Once a respected organization representing the Quakers, this outfit is now a propaganda apparatus which sends Socialists and left-wingers all over the country to address religious and educational groups. Many of these speakers are authors of books and publications openly plugging for the banishment of the free enterprise system and the adoption of collectivism as a national policy. One of the Friends' lecturers, a Negro, was sent to Pasadena, California, to address the local branch of the American Association of University Women. After expounding his "social" theories to the AAUW ladies, he was arrested on a morals charge when he was found at three o'clock in the morning in a parked car with two white men.

Henry Cadbury, chairman, has been shown as belonging to such officially cited Communist fronts as the American Rescue Ship Mission, and the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties and as being affiliated with the Conference on Peaceful Alternatives to the Atlantic Pact which, according to the House Un-American Activities Committee, was instituted by Communists.

Contributors to the American Friends Service Committee are entitled to deduct their donations for income tax purposes. Is the Treasury Department in accord with the principles which the Friends use their tax-exemption privilege to promote?

"The Phelps-Stokes Fund", Dr. Channing Tobias, director. Tobias, a Negro, has been affiliated with so many Communist fronts that it would be difficult to name them all, including the Committee for the Foreign-Born, American Committee to Save Refugees, American League for Peace and Democracy, Conference on Constitutional Liberties in America, Council on African Affairs, National Committee to Abolish the Poll Tax, and many others. He signed the petition for abolishing the Dies Committee and was editorial adviser of the Communist publication "Protestant".

Contributions to the Stokes-Phelps Fund are deductible for income tax purposes. Does the Treasury Department believe that it was the

intention of the tax-exemption provision to aid such organizations as this?

"American Association for the United Nations", Clark Eichelberger, executive director. This particular outfit perhaps leads all others who enjoy Federal tax-exemption in the number of Communist Fronters associated with it. Eichelberger has been affiliated with such officially cited Communist fronts as the American Youth Congress, the Committee for Peace Through World Cooperation, and is listed in the New York Times of October 10, 1941 as having asked help for the Russians. Also he was a character witness for Alger Hiss and testified that Hiss' reputation for loyalty, integrity and veracity was "excellent" (New York Times, January 17, 1950, page 12)

In addition to Eichelberger, twenty-eight persons who have been at one time or another connected with the American Association for the United Nations, either as members of its board or in otherwise promoting its aims, have been named in the March 15, 1955, edition of the American Legion's "Firing Line" as having been affiliated with from three to thirty subversive groups each.

Their names, with the number of their Communist affiliations are: Henry A. Atkinson, 7; Roger Baldwin, 18; Bruce Bliven, 18; Henry Sloane Coffin, 5; George S. Counts, 13; Bartley C. Crum, 10; Joseph E. Davies, 5; the late John W. Davis, 4; the late Albert Einstein, 23; Stephen Duggan, 6; Dorothy Canfield Fisher, 14; Edgar J. Fisher, 6; Margaret Forsyth, 8; Frank P. Graham, 16; Philip C. Jessup, 5; Robert W. Kenney, 30; Dorothy Kenyon, 21; Thomas Mann, 21; G. Ashton Oldham, 6; G. Bromley Oxnam, 14; James G. Patton, 4; Arthur Upham Pope, 18; Richard B. Scandrett, 5; Guy Emery Sipler, 28; James T. Shotwell, 4; Channing Tobias, 20; J. Raymond Walsh, 22. In 1949, Alger Hiss was a member of its Board of Directors but he didn't have any Communist front citations. He was just sent to prison for perjury in connection with stealing government documents and delivering them to a Communist spy ring.

These twenty-eight persons who at some time since its beginning, have been officially connected with the American Association for the United Nations have, between them, a combined total of 351 affiliations with Communist fronts. Still, this AAUN is able to tell those who contribute to it that their donation is exempt from Federal taxation. Does the Treasury Department know the Communist front record of the personalities who direct the affairs of the American Association for the United Nations, contributions to which are tax-exempt?

The above are only a half dozen out of hundreds of such organizations who are able to operate because of the leniency of the Treasury Department in allowing them to solicit support with a promise that such donations will be tax-exempt.

This unhealthy state of affairs poses questions which must someday be answered and a situation which Congress must correct or else we must concede that in order to get exemption from the payment of taxes, a group, organization or publication must practically advocate the overthrow of the American government and its replacement by a collectivist state.

Many of the organizations who have been given exemption on the ground they are "non-political" maintain lobbies in Washington and are registered as such and undertake to influence legislation by the Congress of the United States.

Even the CIO which boasts millions of dollars in its campaign chest has this notation on its listing in the book "U. S. Citizens in World Affairs": "Dues are deductible on income tax returns". By what stretch of human imagination can the CIO be classed as being "educational, charitable or non-political".

Aside from the fact that the granting of this exemption to organizations making fraudulent claims to get it, is a blot against the integrity of a government agency, it is grossly unfair and discouraging to organizations, groups and publications operated by loyal Americans who are denied this privilege.

We, for instance, would like above all things to be regarded by the Treasury Department as an American worthy of the privilege which they so readily grant to others who make no pretense of such loyalty to their own country and its institutions as we profess. It would be wonderful to hold out to possible contributors the same promise of tax-exemption which organizations like those discussed herein are entitled to offer.

But we refuse to become associated with any subversive group in order to become eligible for this favor, if that is what it takes, and there is no power on earth which could induce us to qualify for this privilege by repudiating the form of government of a Republic in which we were so signally honored by being allowed to be born on its sacred soil.

Executive Has No Constitutional Say-So in Legislative Enactments

Sometime ago, it was announced from seemingly authoritative sources that the President and the administration would not oppose the passage of the Bricker amendment, this time.

This proposal would prevent treaties and executive agreements from overriding the Constitution of the United States and was defeated by the White House in the previous session of Congress.

Those who announced that the President would go along this time had apparently reckoned without presidential advisers who have the last say in such matters although they are not elected by the people, and it turns out, are not even selected by the President. (In the Reece investigation of tax-exempt foundations, it was developed that "Economic Advisers" are continuing, regardless of who is president.)

Why there should be any concern over whether or not the President or the Secretary of State should approve this measure is, of course, baffling to those who do not understand the new conception of the functions of the three branches of the American government.

Under the Constitution which supposedly still rules, the Congress is entrusted with legislative acts such as the Bricker amendment and the Executive has no authority whatever to interfere.

On this basis, proponents of the Bricker amendment should go ahead and pass it.

It's not Done With Mirrors But by Lots of Hard Work

Sometime ago we received a communication from an official of a mid-western State Bar Association, giving us his reaction to the Southern Conservative.

"It is hard for me to describe the appeal your paper has for me and why I look forward so eagerly to it from month to month. My secretary is instructed to bring it to me on arrival and I read it from the first page to the last. I am wondering what school of journalism you attended as I am curious to know which one could teach a person to write as you do."

We never attended any school of journalism. That is one handicap we have never had to overcome. We have been so busy throughout the years writing for a living that we never had time to quit and go to school to learn how. This probably accounts for our escape from the unhappy fate of becoming a "liberal" and proves that poverty is sometimes a blessing in disguise.

We write by ear and say what comes naturally and especially when discussing the political confidence men in Washington who are selling the Republic down the river.

There is never intended to be anything personal in our editorials and our criticism is directed against the official behavior of those who get themselves elected under false pretenses—who make their campaign on a sound platform and then discard it like a dirty shirt as soon as they cinch the job.

Thurman Sensing of the Southern States Industrial Council of Nashville, Tennessee, has given as clear a definition of "Federal Aid" as we have ever heard expressed: "It is just as if a doctor said to his patient 'You need a blood transfusion. I am going to take some blood out of your left arm; I am going to put it back in your right arm. I will spill some in the process, but I am going to give you a blood transfusion with your own blood'".

Time Is Due for A Showdown On Overlapping Authority

If the American people had not become hardened to similar performances in recent years, they simply could not believe a story in the press about the refusal of the White House to allow a member of its staff to honor a request that he testify before a Congressional Committee.

A Senate subcommittee investigating operations for the 1953 refugee relief act let it be known that they would call an assistant to the president, to appear for questioning in connection with the hiring and firing of the Corsi character by the State Department.

The presidential assistant's name is Maxwell Rabb — changed from Rabinowitz — and as soon as the investigation started, he took off for a vacation in the Virgin Islands.

On his return the committee requested him to appear for questioning but was informed that the White House felt that Rabb should not testify and that he would not appear. Attempts by the committee chairman to talk to Rabb by telephone failed.

The time is long overdue for a showdown on just how far the White House, representing the executive branch of government, can go in thwarting the will of Congress, the legislative branch, duly elected by the people of the United States.

Senator Wayne Morse of Oregon has let it be known that, although he was elected on a Republican ticket, he will run next time as a Democrat. What in the Sam Hill difference does it make what he calls himself? He's a Socialist, pure and simple, and so are both of the major parties and he can flop from one to the other without changing his mind on any issue or surrendering any beliefs he may have held. He should quit kidding himself, however, that he is making any change when he switches from one to the other. All he is getting from such rotations is a little exercise.

The Conference of Southern Governors meeting in Nashville, Tennessee, recently passed resolutions which insisted that crippling strikes by labor unions against the telephone company and the L. and N. Railroad be brought to an end. Their suggestion for doing this was for both sides to get together and "arbitrate." Calvin Coolidge, as governor of Massachusetts, stopped a strike in Boston in one day and he didn't do it by passing resolutions. He just let the strikers know what would happen if they didn't get back to work and that was that. What on earth has happened to us that no similar display of courage and common sense on the part of high officials is ever witnessed any more?

According to J. Edgar Hoover, during 1954 a major crime was committed in the United States every thirteen seconds. His report covered only crimes committed by individuals against other individuals and there is no record of the crimes committed against the Republic, the Constitution and the American people by those elected to protect and uphold our institutions and the American Way of Life. That record is one that can't be compiled until it is too late and there will be no point in compiling it then.

The winners were announced on a recent Sunday night and some female in Maine, color not stated, received the trip to Paris for suggesting that a Negro should be president of the United States and the one she named has been noted for his sympathy for Communist movements during his entire adult life.

We don't know who the judges were but if allowed three guesses as to their ideological and political leanings, we could give two of them back.

Retired Army Official Conducts Poll by Mail

Many high army officers who incurred the wrath of Washington if they expressed apprehension for the welfare of this country while in the service, have tried to make up for it after retirement.

Lieutenant Colonel John L. Hitchings, retired, of Southport, Florida, is giving his full time to a convention-by-mail campaign in order to give his fellow Americans a chance to express their preference for a candidate for president next time whom they believe would preserve the sovereignty of the United States and restore Constitutional government in this country.

It is his hope that sufficient interest can be developed in the presidential conventions in 1956 that the nomination of a left-wing, internationalist will be prevented.

He has been carrying on his mail campaign for many months and announces that 62 per cent of those who have voted have favored William E. Jenner of Indiana. Others selected as being presidential material are Governor J. Bracken Lee, General Douglas MacArthur, Senator Joseph R. McCarthy, Honorable Clarence Manion, Senator John W. Brickner and others.

Some one sent us a cartoon without indicating the paper from which it was taken in which a dizzy blonde approaches the man at the Tax Division window and says: "Couldn't I just send my tax directly to France and eliminate the middleman?" Which shows she wasn't so dizzy, after all.

Organized Vandalism Terrorizes South As Officials Fail to Halt CIO Strike

(As we go to press it is reported that the strike will be ended following an agreement between both parties and the reign of lawlessness brought to a close. — Editor)

The tragic results of the paralyzing strike of CIO unions against the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and the Louisville and Nashville Railroad in property damage, loss of wages to workers and demoralization of public services cannot be estimated.

The strike has been in progress for approximately two months and during this period vandalism, violence and sabotage has run riot with duly elected officials apparently helpless to step in and put an end to the criminal acts which, if committed by any group other than a labor union would be dealt with through all the resources of the law.

Dynamitings and bridge burnings were among the devices employed by the strikers in efforts to enforce their demands and in one case, a four-year-old daughter of a minister in Birmingham was covered with debris from her damaged home when a bomb was exploded nearby. The blast had been set off to destroy a telephone company building containing expensive equipment and the fact that it buried a small child beneath plaster and broken glass was of small concern to those responsible for the atrocity.

On the other hand when one of the strikers was accidentally killed during the rioting engendered by the strikers themselves, a great

hue and cry went up and the "liberal" press which had been editorially silent on the outrages attending the affair up until that time, went all out in headlined mention of the unfortunate death of the striking employe.

Service was not only disrupted on the L. and N. Railway but on another railroad in Birmingham, trestles were set afire with gasoline, thousands of telephones in Atlanta, Birmingham and other places were put out of commission through the injury of cables by gunfire.

When appealed to for action the governor of Alabama said he planned to ask the Legislature to "pass a public seizure law." The governor of Tennessee offered large rewards for "seven instances of property damage in the telephone strike" but nobody called out the militia or took other proper steps to stop an insurrection against the public peace and safety.

Meantime, in Washington, Walter Reuther said that the workers were merely carrying on a campaign to "win a decent contract," with never a word of regret for the loss of life, property damage or sabotaging of the utilities which serve the public and which were threatened and intimidated by organized banditry on the part of a favored class which neither state nor national authorities seem able to control.

Maybe We Should Give Benedict Some Sort of Posthumous Medal

Another Three-Year Probe Should Now Be Undertaken

The Department of Internal Revenue spent three years and the Lord only knows how much of the taxpayers' money investigating Senator Joseph R. McCarthy to see if he had cheated the government on his income tax returns. They did this at the demand of notorious Communist sympathizers both in the Senate and out who will stop at nothing to divert attention from the Communist apparatus in this country and to circumvent its exposure. Because of the Wisconsin senator's effective fight against Communist rats, his enemies worked every possible angle to have him discredited and had pinned all their hopes on this final trick of sticking him with income tax evasion.

This three-year investigation of Senator McCarthy has been over for some time now and the net result of it was the disclosure that he had not only not evaded the payment of income taxes, but that the Treasury Department owed him \$1,056 instead. Ordinarily this would make a person's detractors feel rather silly but McCarthy's enemies don't blush easily, and have very thick skin.

During these three years devoted to an investigation of Communism's bitter enemy in this country, no attempt whatever has been made by the Treasury Department to investigate certain Friends of Communism in the United States. These are scores of tax-exempt groups who hold this privilege on the spurious theory that they are "educational" organizations when, as a matter of fact, they are as guilty of trying to overthrow the American government as the Communists themselves. Tons of literature distributed by them throughout the years will reveal to the Treasury Department that their "educational" activities consist in plugging for the abandonment of Free Enterprise and substituting National Socialism, surrender of American national sovereignty to a one-world government, promotion of the Socialist theory of state control of production and distribution, government ownership of utilities and practically every other crackpot theory which is the very antithesis of Constitutional government.

No grander service could be rendered this Republic than for the Treasury Department to start a three-year investigation of those phony "educational" tax-exempt groups who are enemies of the American form of government and whose escape from the tax burden imposed on others, is the last word in discrimination and favoritism to a selected few.

Reds in National Education Association Says Ex Chief

Benjamin Gitlow, formerly one of the active Communist Party Chieftains in the United States who later repudiated the party and rendered valuable service to investigating committees in Washington charged that Communists have been very active in the National Education Association.

Mr. Gitlow made this statement in a press interview to a Houston Chronicle staff member preceding a meeting of an Anti-subversive Seminar held in that city by the Americanism Committee of the American Legion recently, at which Mr. Gitlow was a speaker.

The former Communist said that the Red's interest in the NEA is part of a "conscious program to recruit teachers into the party and then have them use their positions for the purpose of indoctrinating students."

Mr. Gitlow made it clear that the rank and file of American teachers in the NEA, however, are good loyal Americans and that it is the active minority to which he referred,

In the early days of the Republic there was only one person in the United States who was regarded as a traitor to his country and his name was Benedict Arnold.

Now we read testimony of a Major General J. F. Carroll before a Congressional investigating committee in Washington who revealed that since 1949, the United States Air Force was compelled to drop 241 officers and enlisted men from its personnel because there was a serious doubt of their loyalty to this country.

In addition 913 civilian employes were fired by the Air Force for the same reason, during the same period of time.

This makes a total of 1154 of probably disloyal persons in the Air Force alone and that is only one segment of the American Armed Forces.

Also, these figures do not take into consideration the vast and unknown number of Americans in civil life who are working like beavers against their country and trying to overthrow the American government by incorporating it into a world state through the medium of the United Nations, or the Atlantic Union.

Maybe, after all, we were a wee bit harsh on old Benedict. Perhaps we should revise history and take his picture down from the Hall of Infamy. After all, he didn't do anything much except throw in with England against this country and since this no longer is regarded as a crime and since the defense of all foreign countries at the expense of our own is considered sound foreign policy, it seems sort of unfair to keep the old boy's image on the black list.

The guy was just born too soon.

For putting a foreign country's welfare above that of the United States in 1780, he escaped hanging by taking a powder and skipping the country.

For doing the same thing today, he would probably get elected to Congress.

Example of efficiency as practiced by the Army and the Navy: During 1951, 807,000 pounds of canned tomatoes were shipped by the Army from California to New York. During the same period, the Navy shipped 775,000 pounds of canned tomatoes from New York to California. This information, along with hundreds and hundreds of similar acts of criminal stupidity, was developed by the Hoover Commission in its investigation of government operations. The Hoover report didn't say so, but the shipments of tomatoes probably passed each other on their trip from coast to coast.

While they are at it, we wish those who are analyzing Einstein's brain would try to find out what makes those who benefit from the bountiful blessings of this Constitutional Republic, turn against it at the first opportunity and join up with those who are seeking to destroy it. There are hundreds of thousands of this type who are allowed to run at large in this country and this information should be helpful in evaluating their motives and aims.

Republicans Will Try to Rescue Party From Internationalists

A news story came out of Chicago sometime ago that makes sense.

Following a meeting of twenty-five hundred real Republicans from thirty-two States, it was announced that similar meetings would be held in forty-seven other States and an all-out effort exerted to get the Republican Party back in the hands of Republicans.

Speakers included Senator George Malone of Nevada, Senator Joseph R. McCarthy of Wisconsin, Governor J. Bracken Lee of Utah, Kit Clardy former Congressman from Michigan and others.

If a similar movement could be generated by real Democrats, there is a possibility that both major parties could be purged of Socialism and the people once again given an opportunity to vote for Americans concerned in the welfare and security of this country instead of internationalists whose allegiance is distributed around over the four points of the compass.

The Republican Party, of course, has more men of presidential stature than the Democratic Party. From the day Roosevelt became president, any outstanding Democrat who stuck his head up was mowed down because that supreme egotist wanted no competition. As a result most Democrats performed as robots and all they could say was "yes" and "me too." McCarran was an exception of course but he is gone. Senator Harry F. Byrd of Virginia is a person of superior attainments but of course he has a black mark against him for having trotted along and voted for the "censure" of McCarthy because of his fight on Communists. Strom Thurmond of South Carolina is another big man and, so far, is uncontaminated through association with the Socialists who now control his party.

Among Republicans there are a dozen or more who could be counted on to restore dignity and prestige to their party if trusted with leadership including Senators George Malone of Nevada, William F. Knowland of California, Everett Dirksen of Illinois, Joseph R. McCarthy of Wisconsin, William E. Jenner of Indiana and several others, including Governor J. Bracken Lee of Utah.

If the American voters fool around and do nothing to reclaim the two major parties from internationalists and one-worlders, they deserve anything that happens to them as a result of this criminal negligence.

'If You Can't Beat 'Em Join 'Em' Is India Policy

In Dallas recently there was held an Asia Town Hall Meeting where visitors from the Far and Middle East discussed Communism.

One of the speakers, G. Ramachandran of India, gave that country's recipe for coping with Communism which so nearly parallels methods of "combating" Communism employed in this country as to merit attention.

Mr. Ramachandran's views so closely duplicate those of Eleanor Roosevelt that it might have been the old girl herself speaking. In brief, the Indians propose to do away with Communism by putting its policies into effect. That's largely what we have done here. "We in India are determined to wipe out Communism by taking the wind out of the Communists' sails rather than outlawing them," Ramachandran said with an air of conviction which indicated that he actually believed in the drivel he was handing out. "We are doing this by a concerted joint effort of the national government and the people to effect a program of social reconstruction."

Another fallacy voiced by the visitors was an idea which has no basis in fact but which widely prevails in this country also. This was a pronouncement by Musa Nasir of Jordan that "Communism flourishes under ignorance, poverty and political discontent."

Acceptance of that theory means ignoring the record which shows that in the United States, there is less Communism in the so-called "illiterate" states with low income than in the heavily populated areas where universities and other institutions of higher learning are thickly clustered and where most Communist cells first sprung up on college campuses.

Also the large and flourishing colony of Reds in the United States which blossomed during Roosevelt's administration and whose numbers have steadily increased under two successive regimes, are not cursed with poverty and are not ignorant.

Any one who had the impression that just because the life of the FOA was terminated, that agency would go out of business have another thought coming. It was merely transferred to the State Department and the giving away will go merrily on. Old agencies of government never die—they just change their name and keep right on.

This Kind of Thinking Should Be Done in Halls of Congress

These Are the Ones Who Instruct Nation's Youth

Recently we heard a teacher of government in a local institution of learning assert in a public gathering that Alger Hiss had nothing to do with setting up the United Nations at San Francisco. The man was perfectly sincere, too, and obviously believed what he was saying.

Sometime ago, the Association for the United Nations began issuing propaganda along this line in order to make the American people forget Hiss' part in setting up that monstrosity. Hiss had been put in the penitentiary for libel in connection with his acts of treason against his country and, understandably, his role as architect of the U.N. had to be played down. It was doing the United Nations no good, fast.

So the Association for the United Nations put out propaganda sheets to its list of one-worlders around over the country including pink college professors who refuse to clutter up their minds with facts and who save wear and tear on their own brain by letting professionals think for them. This propaganda was accepted at face value by its recipients who have been passing it on to other gullible suckers.

Alger Hiss was the Secretary General of the United Nations at San Francisco, having been agreed upon for this job at Yalta in a secret session of Stalin, Hiss and the dying Roosevelt. He was selected to fly the Charter to Washington where, to their eternal disgrace, the Senate ratified it. He was the first United States Delegate to the United Nations in January 1946, having been chosen because of his "valuable" service in setting up the world organization. Later he was a delegate to the London Conference of the United Nations. All this is in the official records but a good quick way to look it up is to refer to "Who's Who" if a copy can be found which was published before Hiss' name was blotted out. Our copy is for 1949-1950 and its information on Hiss is furnished by Hiss himself, as in all cases of those whose names appear in Who's Who.

The poor stupid dears who have been pressured into thinking that Alger Hiss merely went along to San Francisco to make reservations and carry the luggage had better look up the official facts in the matter before they advertise themselves any further as complete fools and dopes.

That spiritual leaders hold steadfastly to the teachings of the Bible and avoid pitfalls of world government and world Socialism.

That all mayors proclaim September 17-23 as Constitution Week and the continuance of September 17 as Constitution Day instead of changing it to Citizenship Day as advocated by one-worlders.

They Dropped His Name but Still Promote His Ideals

We have copies of the letterheads of the American Association for the United Nations, Inc., the group which is composed jointly of soft-headed idealists and plain subversives all working for the objective of bringing about a world government through the medium of the United Nations. Eleanor Roosevelt is one of the big wheels in it.

On these letterheads in 1947 was the name of Alger Hiss, big as life, but on the current ones he has been deleted, of course. When he was sent to Lewisburg, Pa., penitentiary for perjury in connection with his acts of treason against his country, they dropped him like a hot brick.

The ones remaining on the list, in many cases, are no better than Hiss, but they haven't been caught.

Between the end of World War II and 1947, we gave Russia \$426,000,000 of American taxpayers' money. No report is available to these same taxpayers, so far as we can learn, as to how much, if any, of it was ever paid back. Since that same date, we have given more than \$52,000,000,000 to all foreign nations. And our own treasury is in the red approximately \$281,000,000,000. We must have men of extraordinary financial genius handling public money or we couldn't pull bloopers like this and still keep the door open. The Rockefeller Empire would topple if it were conducted on such a fantastic principle.

A Marxian Socialist in Stockholm Dictates Way of Life for Americans

Gunnar Myrdal is a Swedish Socialist who has spent his life trying to advance the social and economic doctrine laid down in the Communist Manifesto. He lives at Nyangsvagen 155, Applevikan, Stockholm, Sweden.

Americans who never heard of him and who can't even pronounce the names of the street and the suburb in which he lives, may be surprised to know that he is responsible for uprooting century-old traditions in the United States, instituting an entirely new way of life for millions in this country, and that he directly influenced official action of one branch of the American government.

In 1938 the Carnegie Corporation of New York, which pays no taxes into our Federal Treasury because their activities are "educational", commissioned him to make a study of the American Negro "problem" and instructed him to make a report of his findings.

This he did in the form of a book called "An American Dilemma". For this project, the Carnegie Foundation paid \$250,000 tax-free American dollars.

Up until that time we had no Negro "problem" and our principal "dilemma" lay in how to keep the degenerate ideologies of educational sewer rats in foreign universities from seeping into American institutions of learning and polluting these fountain-heads of knowledge.

In this book—paid for, remember, by an American Foundation enjoying tax-exemption privileges extended it by the Federal Treasury—Myrdal made one dastardly

attack after another on the American form of government, our institutions and way of life.

He painted the Constitution as having been "conceived in considerable suspicion and fear" and as being "impractical and ill-suited to modern conditions". He sneered at the cultural traits of Americans and charged them with "a relatively low degree of respect for law and order". He referred to the original Constitutional Convention as a "plot against the common people" and predicted that if Americans are "brought to be a law-abiding people" this country may yet become a "progressive commonwealth".

Was this contemptible detractor of this great country and its institutions denounced by leaders of public thought for his vile and slanderous attack against the greatest form of government ever devised? Were his depraved Marxian views repudiated as unworthy of consideration by the administrators of a Constitutional Republic?

Tragically, the answer is no, in both cases.

New Way Is Sought to Punish American Anti-Communists

The Most Dangerous Facet Of the Communist Conspiracy
