

A regular meeting of the Student Senate was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by President Fowler in Room 208 of the Fred Hayne Building.

Bill Walker moved to accept the minutes of the meeting of February 22, 1965 as written. Judy Hoffman seconded and the minutes were approved.

Jack Hardig gave a treasurer's report as of February 26, 1965.

PPresident Fowler suggested that someone submit legislation for a Student Association Banquet; and legislation for 264 for 12 delegates to the TISA convention.

President Fowler suggested that some sort of committee be set up to act as an election committee to contest any violations of the coming election. This committee could make recommendations to the student court.

Committee reports:

1. Fiscal and Governmental Operations. The committee reported out favorably Senate Bill No. 29 (officer's salaries). Bill Soffar moved to accept the committee report. Bill Walker seconded and the report was accepted.

2. Student Life. Bill Walker asked to have Dr. Mary Allen Goodman at the next meeting to report on the Bill for Cultural enrichment of the Less Fortunate Children.

The committee felt that students should have more to say on the Student Life Committee which was proposed by Dean Yardley. The recommendation for this committee had been submitted to the Faculty Senate and the President of the University and had been approved by both. But the committee asked that the Senate send back a recommendation to have more students on the committee. The committee was in favor of the bill with the condition that there be preferably 6 students instead of 3 and that

the chairman be elected from the group itself and would not vote. Charles Hollinger moved to accept the committee report with the conditions as stated by the committee. Bill Soffar seconded and the report with conditions was accepted.

Old business:

1. Bill no. 29 (officers salaries)

a. James McClendon asked why the salaries were being raised. Charles Hollinger explained that they should be increased as there is no other source of outside salary available to the officers. In this way the officers are left with more time to devote to their office.

b. Bill Walker moved to call the question on the bill, was seconded and the motion carried.

c. Bill No. 29 passed unanimously.

2. Richard Gaghagen called attention to Article III, Section 2 of the S. A. Constitution in answer to the article in the Cougar regarding the amendment to the constitution on the term of senators coinciding with that of the President. This section reads:

"The President and Vice President of the Student Association shall be elected by the members of the Student Association and serve concurrently with the Senate.

New business:

Bob Brackman moved to appropriate 400 for a S.A. Banquet. He was seconded. Jim Smith moved to bypass committee. Bill Walker seconded but the motion failed and the bill was referred to Fiscal and Governmental Operations committee.

Bill Walker moved to approve the appointment of Senators Hewitt, Smith and Mattern as an election committee. John Daigle seconded. The committee is to follow the election and make recommendations to the Student Court. Jim Smith was Named as Senior member of the committee. Judy Hoffman asked that meetings be open and posted.

Bill Soffar moved to amend the motion to read that all meetings of the committee be open to anyone and the Senior member be employed with the power to conduct the meeting. John Daigle seconded and the motion passed.

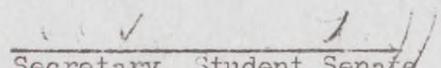
The original motion to approve the appointment of the committee members passed.
