The Senate met at 7:10 p.m. in Oberholtzer Hall in Dining Room 3 and 4, and the President called the meeting to order.

The Vice President and twenty-one Senators were present, with the following Senators absent: GLEN ADAMS, BUTCH GREENE, and SUSAN LOGAN.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President GAGHAGEN reported that the Executive Committee met Monday at noon to consider the Committee reports.

The President announced that the Constitution of the Houston Council of Colleges was approved but added it was with reservations. A Bill of Rights and several amendments need to be added but will be done at a future date. The council decided it was best to adopt it now so it can begin to function.

The President asked for two senators to volunteer to attend the Student Life Division Department Heads meeting on Tuesday at 10 a.m. in Room 113 R. Mike Baker and Richard Poston said they would attend this meeting.

President GAGHAGEN commended Senators DRISCOLL and HANCOCK for the fine job they have been doing every Tuesday on "Student Association Forum" on KUHF Radio.

COMMITTEE ON RULES & JUDICIARY

Mr. DRISCOLL, Chairman, reported that his committee recommends that Miss TRUEHEART who was ill be excused for the 24th of October Senate Meeting.

Mr. DRISCOLL reported that the committee interviewed Mr. Taylor and Mr. Kohler of the Election Commission. The Chairman of the Election Commission is going to prepare a report listing the problems and give several suggestions for further revision to the Election Code.

COMMITTEE ON STUDENT LIFE

Miss TRUEHEART, Chairman, reported that her committee recommends that the Senate approve the nominations of Karen Amdur and Lowry Davison to the University Calendar Board.

The Committee recommends that the Senate postpone consideration of S. 23 (Urging the University Center Policy Board to Designate an International Lounge in the University Center) until the appropriate Policy Board committee, which is also discussing this suggestion, completes its report to the Board. Their report should be ready for presentation to the Board in a couple of weeks, and available to the Senate the same week, prior to the Board meeting, so that the Senate could still present the Board with a statement of its position on this Resolution and the desirability of such an International Lounge.

COMMITTEE ON STATE, NATIONAL, & INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

(In absence of Mr. GREENE, President GAGHAGEN gave the report of the Committee.) The committee recommends that the Senate approve the nomination of Larry Doherty as Director of Sound Off.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. HANCOCK moved to accept Miss TRUEHEART's excuse of absence for the 24th of October Senate Meeting. The motion was seconded and was approved unanimously.

The next order of business was the approval of Lowry Davison and Karen Amdur as members of the Calendar Board. After considering the candidates, the Senate voted unanimously to approve them.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. THIEL introduced S. 23, which was referred to the Committee On Fiscal and Governmental Operations.

Next Mr. THIEL introduced S. 24 (A BILL TO AMEND THE UHSA ELECTION CODE) which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Judiciary.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

President GAGHAGEN announced that the Lettermen will give a concert Wednesday at 8:00 in Cullen Auditorium. Tickets are on sale in Room 206 Cougar Den.

President GAGHAGEN also announced that the Presidents Forum will be held Wednesday at 12:00 in Room 136 Ezekiel Cullen Building. Dean Yardley will represent President Hoffman because Dr. Hoffman has to attend a meeting in Austin. The Lettermen might be present at this meeting.

Vice President MATTERN announced that the Committee on Fiscal and Governmental Affairs will meet Wednesday at 2:00 p.m. in Room 212 Cougar Den.

Mr. DRISCOLL announced that the Committee On Rules and Judiciary would meet directly after the Senate meeting.

Mr. O'QUINN moved to suspend Rules in order to introduce an additional bill. The Senate voted to suspend the rules and Mr. O'QUINN introduced S.25 (A BILL TO AMEND THE ELECTION CODE TO ESTABLISH A BALLOT BOX IN THE COLLEGE OF LAW). It was referred to the Committee on Rules and Judiciary.

President GAGHAGEN announced that Jack Heisler had been appointed as Legislative Assistant to the President. Larry Price was appointed Administrative Assistant to the President.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. THIEL moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion was agreed to; and (at 7:35 p. m.) the Senate adjourned.
