Dear Sir:

This owns receipt yours of October 30th from which I note the position regarding grades for curbs and sidewalks. If you fail to get prompt action on this I will take it up with the Mayor or the Commissioner in charge on your request.

I further note that the location of the North line of the building is determined by the rear driveway and the other points which you mention.

In making a study of the prints the following points occur to me as needing further consideration:

FIRST: Eliminating all bed locations shown when such are set parallel to rather than at right angles to the North and South walls, changing the partition in one case (if permissible) to provide for two beds so placed, of course, when crowded conditions demand additional beds will be added.

SECOND: The name having been determined, it should show on all titles.

THIRD: Gravel walk should extend to Holman Street. Walks should be 5' or not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ '.

FOURTH: I am not sure that I understand your plan about opening and screening the North windows and would like further light on this point.

The above are my only and final suggestions. When corrected the plans should be submitted to city officials by Judge Moore and yourself for approval and securing appropriate agreement covering the points raised in previous correspondence, particularly in my letter to Judge Moore dated September 17th, following which plans and specifications may be submitted to contractors for estimates and the


