Dear Suffragist:

The Suffrage Bill has been set as the special order of the day for February 6, at 10:00 a.m.

And on the evening of the fifth of February, will you see that one or more telegrams, (night letters by wire get a special rate,) signed by prominent men in your town be sent to your representatives urging them to vote for Suffrage. Please see to this in person or appoint someone you know will do the work.

We are sparing no effort in our service to the Cause here. We are working day and night, in the face of many handicaps (lack of funds and an attack of Grippe being two serious drawbacks.) Will you not come up to the help of right and justice strongly at this time and contribute this work in the homes of our legislators, without which we cannot win?
