Washington Bureaucrats And Load Of American Jackasses Louse Up Our Foreign Relations

Truman Lives Up To The Code Of His Benefactor

The efforts of the national Congress to make atonement for a wrong against the people of a sovereign State and return property wrested from them by a ruling of a Supreme Court minority, have been voided.

Harry S. Truman of Missouri, acting under authority vested in him as President of the United States, vetoed a bill passed by a large majority of both Houses that would have restored the Tidelands to Texas which holds legal title to the property.

Appraisal of Mr. Truman's motives in taking this action must be tempered with a charitable consideration of his background and of the forces which brought him to public notice.

In vetoing the bill and thereby putting the seal of approval on a lawless act, Mr. Truman was proceeding under the only code of ethics it has been given him to understand.

One of the unwritten laws of gangland is that might makes right and the acquisition of property by force or theft is as valid within the purview of denizens of the underworld as any legally-attested transaction in a higher strata of human society which functions by moral principles and the written statute.

And so it is perhaps only fitting that a political career that had its inception in the environment of barrooms, pool halls and gambling dens, and which was sponsored by a man who trafficked profitably in the votes of his fellow citizens, and whose wardrobe included the striped garb of a convict, should come to an end on a note of defiance of the Constitution and the law.

American Mothers Face the Prospect of Bearing Sons Whose Ears Must Be Perpetually Attuned to the Drone of Planes by Day and the Whirr of Bombs by Night and Whose Uneasy Dreams Are Shot Through With Visions of Tragedy as Trade Winds Whisper a Warning of Another Heartbreak Ridge.

According to the Bible there shall be wars and rumors of war and since the first faint dawn of history nations have fought each other to the death over real or imaginary wrongs.

There are countries in Central Europe who have been fighting, off and on, for a thousand years and whose blood will continue to be spattered over the battlefield until the final curtain is rung down, regardless of how many billions of American dollars are funnelled into their treasuries.

It is only in comparatively recent history, however, that we have become committed to a policy of constant warfare and that the philosophy of eternal conflict has become the underlying principle which motivates economic thinking and political action in the United States.

The American economy has been geared to emergencies, wars and defense-spending so effectively by the last two national administrations that policies of government and platforms of the two major political parties are now dictated almost entirely by military considerations.

American resources, men and money have been poured into explosive areas of the trouble-spots of the world so extensively that qualified authorities on the subject warn us that under commitments already made, we will be fighting in one sector of the world or another for the next thirty years.

Except in the case of actual invasion, modern wars are declared by politicians for political purposes and to bolster the failing fortunes of regimes whose corruption and bungling have led their nations to the brink of ruin and threatened the continued power of their leaders.

Three times in three and a half decades, three presidents have led the United States into war and in no case was the peace and security of this country at issue until the meddling of our leaders brought about situations which made it impossible for us to keep out of the act.

World War I, World War II and the Korean War were initiated in direct conflict with the principles of the Monroe Doctrine set up by wise men as the basis of our foreign policy in an era when our leaders did not subscribe to the proposition that it was the responsibility of this country to interfere in every local brawl and internal squabble of nations all over the world.

"Our policy in regard to Europe . . . is not to interfere in the internal concerns of its powers . . ." were the immortal words behind our foreign policy from 1820 until 1913 and from 1921 to 1933 and which made the United States the greatest sovereign power on earth, universally respected, feared and admired by the whole civilized world.

Patriotism, love of country and a willingness to die in its defense if necessary should be instilled in all American boys from the cradle.

They should be reared by the philosophy that when their country is threatened or attacked, it is not only their duty to fight but that they should fight to win and not to lose, appease or play politics.

Instead, the younger generation has been infiltrated with propaganda seeking to blot out of their mind and heart all love of their own country and respect for its flag and to instill in them the treasonable philosophy of allegiance to conglomerate nations whose language they do not understand and with whose political, economic and social ideals they have nothing in common.

As a result of two internationalist administrations, we are either always recovering from war, engaging in war or preparing for war and youth's horizon is limited to a vision of a future in which they must either kill or be killed, or both.

Two decades of global-mindedness has caused the dove of peace to fly out the window and the vultures of war to hover in our darkening skies.

Senator McCarthy's Documented Proof Of Charges Makes His Detractors Look Silly

Senator Joe McCarthy of Wisconsin whose long fight to oust Communists from government has met bitter opposition from the same high officials who protected Alger Hiss from trial for treason, has a revealing article in the May edition of Cosmopolitan Magazine.

It presents documented proof that his charges against the red Foreign Legion directing State Department policy are true and the reading of it will lend encouragement to those Americans whose blood has boiled at the sight of the pack of political coyotes yapping at his heels on the Senate floor.

This substantive evidence makes liars and traitors of the politicians, editors, commentators and other perennial defenders of Communists who have joined in the conspiracy to smear his name and insures that "McCarthyism" will become a synonymous term with Americanism when the final chapter in the sordid story of our betrayal from within, is written.

No fair-minded, honest American can read the article and escape the firm conviction that Alger Hiss is the goat who is taking the rap and that other members of the sabotage ring which has operated in and through the State Department to sell us out to Russia, should be right there in a cell beside him.

We Have Sown the Wind and Are Reaping the Whirlwind

The spirit of resistance to authority which motivates the President of the United States in illegally seizing State and private property in violation of the Constitution, is the same type of rebellion which caused Korean prisoners of war to kidnap and hold as hostage an American general, which inspired convicts in Federal and State prisons to stage revolts and which impels labor union leaders to incite strikes against essential industry.

In Fort Worth a college student was quoted in the press as warning school authorities that if they would "go easy" on those who had staged riots a few days before, there would be no further trouble but,

Americans Warned of Human Rights

Members of the American Legion were warned at a meeting in Indianapolis last month that they must "become a vanguard in the great struggle to maintain America and American rights."

The warning was delivered by Past National Commander Ray Murphy of Iowa who is chairman of a special subcommittee of the Legion to look into the Covenant of Human Rights of the United Nations, and study its vast ramifications.

"It is clear, we think, that we can expect nothing from the United Nations by way of final and definite action which will not serve the aims and objectives of Soviet Russia" Mr. Murphy stated on behalf of his committee.

Although he made no recommendations for repudiation of the United Nations and the Covenant, Mr. Murphy said that a long and searching look into both should be taken by all Americans.

Regardless of the Name We Are Paying the Bill

While the Korean war is called a United Nations action, we are furnishing most of the men, suffering the greater share of casualties and paying all of the bills, both relief and military, Congressman Errett P. Scrivner said on the floor of Congress recently.

Mr. Scrivner pointed out that there has been spent for relief, aside from military expenditures of course, the sum of \$471,000,000. Of this amount all the other nations have contributed less than \$20,000,000, he stated.

"The public might just as well realize that the United Nations tag, which has been put on this war in Korea, and on the civilian relief is a misnomer," Mr. Scrivner said and added: "In fact it is United States relief and a United States war."

We had a mild case of hysterics at the announcement that when the Technical Cooperation Administration which operates the President's Point Four Program sent 35,000 hatching eggs to Iran to help combat Communism, they selected Rhode Island Reds.

Ghostly Apparition From Out Of The Past Invades The Sacred Precincts of The United States Senate

A ghost out of the past has come back to haunt a member of the United States Senate, who probably believed it was laid forever.

The telling of the full story, unfortunately, requires the airing of dirty political linen and reflects no credit on a boss-controlled area of South Texas where one of the old Spanish customs is the practice of voting Mexicans much in the same manner that sheep are run through a dipping-vat.

In the election of 1948, Lyndon Johnson of Texas was defeated in his race for the Senate by Coke Stevenson, but, having learned his politics from no less a personage than Franklin D. Roosevelt himself, Johnson didn't let a little thing like the voters' wishes stand in his way.

Five days after the polls had closed, George Parr, who is regarded as a modern Boss Tweed in the Spanish-American district of Texas, came up with a ballot box that had been "overlooked" whose number was 13 and which contained 202 ballots, all of which, oddly enough, were cast for Johnson with the exception of one which was generously conceded to Stevenson.

Since the election was extremely close, this changed the results and put Johnson over by 87 votes.

The deal was so obviously rigged that a Texas Federal judge granted Stevenson an injunction to prevent election returns from being certified until after a re-count of the ballots in the contested box.

Attempts to check on the vote in Box 13 of Jim Wells County, which was the one under dispute, were foiled when investigation proved that the box and three poll tax lists in that particular voting box had simply disappeared into thin air.

At this point Johnson's long service as a messenger boy for Roosevelt and Truman paid off.

The scene now shifts to President Truman who was speeding toward Washington on a streamline train and, thanks to the miracle of modern communication methods, he was able to get in touch by radio-phone with some of his appointees on the Supreme Court. His purpose was merely to have a social chat, of course, and while away the time in travelling and naturally no politics was discussed as that would have been unethical.

Next day, by coincidence, the Supreme Court, ordered the hearing in Texas stopped.

It was stopped. Johnson was seated as United States Senator and has been par-

ticularly active especially in uncovering corrupt deals. He has shown an unusual aptitude in putting the finger on crooks, who try to get by with everything up to murder.

But the number of the lost ballot box down in Jim Wells County, Texas, was 13 which is supposed to imply a jinx and perhaps that is why a ghostly apparition has now appeared out of the grave to louse up a serene senatorial mind.

Sam Smithwick was a Deputy Sheriff in Jim Wells County and was one of Boss Parr's hatchet men at the time of the disappearance of the ballot box and poll lists.

Later he became offended at the remarks of a radio commentator who criticised political ethics in that section and shot and killed him. In a trial held in another section of the State Smithwick was sentenced to prison for life.

Whether Smithwick had become stir-crazy during his stretch at the State penitentiary or whether a calloused conscience was finally aroused which caused him to want to start singing, we will never know.

Any way, recently he wrote and smuggled out of prison a letter to Coke Stevenson in which he told him he had information about the missing ballot box and poll lists and that he would tell him the full story if he, personally would come to his cell.

But he never told his story and the whereabouts of the missing ballot box returns to the realm of unexplained mysteries.

Before Stevenson got there, Smithwick was dead, having been found hanging from a rafter in his cell.

His death was officially listed as suicide.

The panic of March, 1933, was the "most senseless and most preventable in all history," Herbert Hoover has written in a national magazine in which he told of Roosevelt's part in bringing on the depression so he might have the privilege of claiming the credit for ending it. He never ended it until he got us in war.

"The Carnegie Endowment for International Peace" is in a new building in New York which faces United Nations headquarters, which is very fitting. Alger Hiss was the main architect of the United Nations and he also headed the Carnegie Foundation until he went to jail.

We need to arm this country to the limit, make our own defenses impregnable and restore our economy to its former security, stability and solvency so that we may regain the world supremacy which this nation enjoyed before the Monroe Doctrine was thrown into the scrap-heap along with the Constitution of the United States.

If the money that has been strewed all over the world, together with that which has been misappropriated, wasted and just plain stolen here at home, had been expended in our own defense, there would be no enemy on earth that we could not run out of the water, chase off the land and blast out of the air.

We are not re-arming the world to protect our own interests, regardless of how much propaganda has been showered on us to this effect. We are doing it because "it was planned that way" by sinister world forces who believed that Lenin knew what he was talking about when he said a quarter of a century ago: "England will expand herself into destruction; Germany will fight herself into destruction and America will spend herself into destruction."

Supreme Court Decision Inspires Gratitude For A Ruling Based On The Constitution

It seems odd when American people feel impelled to commend the Supreme Court for adhering to the Constitution of the United States in making their decisions.

This was the reaction of the American people to the ruling of the Court on the president's seizure of the steel industry and everywhere there were expressions of gratitude for the action of our highest tribunal.

The best thought seems to be that their decision was inspired by actual fear on the part of the justices that the American government in its original form was about to go out of business as a result, partly, of their decisions and that they realized it was up to them to rescue it from complete demoralization.

If their action is an indication of a trend back to Constitutional government, it is encouraging but there is nothing to indicate that this is true.

At the same sitting they made other decisions on "social" questions which would indicate otherwise.

Truman's Intense Hatred of Private Industry Increases

Harry Truman's bitter hatred and contempt of the American Free Enterprise System which began with his conversion to Socialism and which has become more pronounced as he advances even farther to the left in his political thinking, has reached new heights of frenzied expression.

In an address to the Electric Consumers Conference, he referred to public power companies as "following the Soviet and Fascist lines" because they oppose government ownership and operation of private business.

He threatened to have his new attorney general look into the situation and see if such companies are not violating the corrupt practices act.

Mr. Truman did not make clear whether this job will be undertaken by McGranery before he goes into his act in connection with cleaning up corruption in government or whether it will be postponed until after some of the filth has been swept from the administration's own front door.

The president's action in addressing the group of consumers was typical of the type of audience he selects in making political speeches.

He has no use for producers and does not consider they have a place in the American economy.

Texas Senator Resumes Role As Administration Defender

Senator Tom Connolly of Texas had reverted to type.

Before he decided that retreat was the better part of valor and got out of the race for re-election, he was engulfed by an economy wave which caused him to make some forceful arguments against wasteful spending and exorbitant donations toward bolstering European economy.

Then he went to Texas, looked the situation over and decided not to run again and since then he has been doing what comes naturally.

In the recent debate on the foreign aid bill he was back on the job as the defender of the Truman administration's policy in pouring money down the drain in Europe.

In elegant language that would have done credit to the Chief Executive himself, Connolly taunted his colleagues who wanted to make further cuts in the bill, in these words:

"Vote to eliminate the foreign aid bill entirely. Then you can go home and strut yourself before your constituents and say 'I saved \$7,900,000,000 and let the world go to hell.'"

Both Political Parties Command Large Following In Texas This Year

There were almost as many Texans who attended the Republican State Convention as were present at the State Democratic Convention this year, and the fighting and squabbling over candidates was of equal ferocity.

This is very encouraging as a sign that there may be two parties in this State hereafter, unless, that is, the Republican convention was attended by a lot of Democrats as in the case of 1928 when Democrats voted against Al Smith through religious prejudice and carried the State for the Republicans.

Later they drifted back into their own party and in 1932 voted the New Deal ticket and have been voting that way to a large extent ever since.

If that is their procedure in the present instance and they are only going into the Republican Party to vote for Eisenhower, then it means nothing at all, so far as the hope for a two-party system in Texas is concerned.

She Refuses to Contribute Tax to Foreign Governments

Another courageous American woman has defied the Treasury Department of the United States and its taxing policy.

Mrs. Irene Whetstone of Chicago takes the position that taxing the American citizen for the support of foreign governments is illegal and unconstitutional and has refused to pay her income tax.

For taking this position, she was sent to jail for contempt but at last report, was still determined to continue the fight she claims to have been waging for four years against corrupt tax practices.

We Can Do Nicely Without Any More Puerto Ricans

It is reliably reported that a shortage of planes for commercial transportation is threatened because so many of them are being used to transport more Puerto Ricans into New York to add to the hundreds of thousands left over from the last election.

They have proved quite an economic and moral problem to New York authorities as they have not only added to the relief burden but have increased the number of criminal activities in Manhattan as they waited around for time to vote.

They should be sent back to Puerto Rico where they belong.

They have not only shown that they make poor citizens whose ballot can be bought but their aim is so bad that they can't even be drafted into the army.

Another State Lawmaker Gets Us Told Off

This does not seem to be our day for getting compliments from members of legislatures.

The State senator from East Grand Forks, Minnesota, writes us and says that he appreciates the many, many fine things that the Roosevelt and Truman administrations have done and that he does not want us to continue to send him our "stinking scandle sheet."

Since we are a little short on formal education ourselves, it ill becomes us to criticize others for this shortcoming but we do hope that the senator is a better lawmaker than he is a speller.

Senator Mundt Proves Bloody Korean Conflict Unauthorized Even By United Nations

Senator Karl Mundt of South Dakota asked some fundamental questions about the United Nations of his colleagues in May of last year which have not been answered yet.

First, he wanted to know who put us into the war, second, what were the terms defining our military mission there and third, how are military leaders and the American public to know when the Korean war is over?

According to Senator Mundt, about the only thing that stands out in the general confusion attending this fourth most costly war in the nation's history is that there was no legal basis for our involvement in it.

A series of mystifying developments attending our entrance into the Korean picture, have been outlined by the Senator.

After North Korean forces invaded South Korea, on June 25, 1950, the Security Council of the United Nations adopted a resolution, calling for immediate cessation of hostilities, Senator Mundt said. This resolution also called on the United Nations Commission in Korea to make immediate recommendations of the situation and to observe the withdrawal of North Korean troops back to the 38th parallel and to keep the security Commission advised of the execution of the resolution.

This seems to have been the extent to which the United Nations meant to take a hand, at least until it developed whether or not this action was effective. Nowhere in the resolution was anything said about military assistance to the South Koreans.

Then Harry Truman jumped the gun two days later and without consultation, apparently, with United Nations representatives, announced to the press that he had ordered United States sea and air forces to Korea. Whether it was one of his alleged bourbon-charged in the case of the firing of General MacArthur Senator Mundt does not say nor even intimate.

The president then ordered the Seventh fleet to Formosa to neutralize the status of the Chinese Nationalists, the senator points out.

Finally the president reported to the United Nations Security Council what he had done. In the meantime a resolution had been introduced in that body, but tabled, calling for forces to repel the attack.

Oh, for the Wit To Understand

We try hard to keep abreast of contemporary political history but events happen so swiftly that our feeble mind becomes confused.

For instance, there was an outfit called ECA, or something, with somebody named Paul Hoffman as its head, which was charged with the responsibility of strewing billions of American dollars around over Europe to any bum who would hold out his hat and catch them.

It is our understanding that there was a time limit set by Congress on that particular spending agency and that it automatically expired some time ago.

Then out of a clear sky up bobbed another one just like it called the Mutual Security Agency with Averell Harriman in charge who took up the job of throwing money around where Hoffman left off.

What we would like to know is who opened the door and let this one in?

Where was any common horse sense displayed in discontinuing ECA and putting MSA in its place?

Was it, perhaps, a trick to fool the American people and make them think we had discontinued "economic aid" to Europe when in reality all we had done was to change the color of Santa Claus' beard?

When the Security Council learned what the president had already done, and only then, that body passed the resolution putting the United Nations into war, or rather putting the United States, mostly into war but calling it a United Nations war.

Later Secretary of State Acheson said the president had proceeded under Article 39 of the United Nations Charter but this Article, as Senator Mundt points out, is empowered to do nothing but make "recommendations". There are no mandatory commitments, no compulsions, no obligations upon any individual member of the United Nations collectively to take such action" Senator Mundt said.

At a hearing of the Foreign Affairs Committee on December 7th, 1950, Acheson admitted, in reply to questioning, that the Charter provided that before any action could be taken, as in Korea, the United States must work out a special agreement, develop the number of troops to be sent, the location, degree of readiness, and so forth, which must be approved by the Congress and that the president is not authorized to furnish any troops not approved in that agreement.

Copies of reports of this December 7th hearing have become almost extinct for some reason, Senator Mundt charged, and declared that it took three days even for him to find a copy.

"We find ourselves involved in a bloody war without an authorized action by Congress or a declaration of war" Senator Mundt said and cinching his argument that the United States forces are fighting in Korea without official authorization from any source, Senator Mundt quoted the record of official legislation passed in 1945 when the United Nations Charter was approved:

"The obligation of the United States to make forces available to the Security Council does not become effective until a special agreement has been passed upon by Congress".

In brief, the bloody conflict in Korea is being fought without authority, Senator Mundt proves by documented records, which answer his first two questions, but only time can give reply to the query as to when the American public will know that the war is over in Korea.

Seizing The Tidelands Is Part of World Plan

Governor Allan Shivers of Texas says that the seizure of the Tidelands, the seizure of water rights in the Santa Margarita River in California and the seizure of the steel mills are all part of a Federal pattern to nationalize industry.

It is more than that.

It is part of a world plan worked out on the other side of the ocean many years ago and which has taken shape under the last two national administrations.

The United States will take over all property and resources that it doesn't confiscate through taxation and then a world government will take over the United States.

The way things are shaping up, it is not only conceivable but very possible that the revenue from the Tidelands which has been used in the education of the school children of the State for many years, may some day be utilized in financing the educational systems of countries behind the Iron Curtain.

Senator Kneels at Mourner's Bench

A member of the United States Senate who voted for the adoption of the United Nations charter in 1945 has publicly asked forgiveness for his actions.

Senator Pat McCarran of Nevada stated during a hearing of a judiciary committee that he made an error in voting for this country to become a member of the United Nations which he would regret all the days of his life.

His remarks were made during a debate on the Bricker resolution proposing a Constitutional amendment which would protect American sovereignty and Constitutional rights against encroachment of the United Nations or any other international organization.

Senator McCarran's confession of error constitutes an act of statesmanship that is heart-warming to those of us who have never been able to understand how a patriotic, conscientious American like himself ever voted for it in the first place.

We hope that other members of that body will hit the sawdust trail, confess their sin and vote for the Wood bill which takes us clear out of the outfit.

Nation Is Suffering From A Surplus of Experts

It seems that our over-production of experts has caused a national shortage of potatoes.

If we could get a law passed placing an "open season" on experts with a bounty of one dollar per head and could liquidate that particular type of pest, many of our economic questions would be solved.

We can live down depressions, droughts, floods and other plagues which periodically assail mankind but a surplus of experts is a calamity which is difficult to survive.

A good slogan for the next few years would be "down with expert advice and up with common sense."

If the United States Senate should approve the United Nations Covenant on Human Rights, Constitutional safeguards would be eliminated in the United States, Senator Bricker said in defending his resolution in the Senate to protect American sovereignty from destruction by such organizations as the U. N.

He said we would not dare publish his letter, which follows in its entirety, together with our reply:

Dear Mrs. Darden:

For sometime you have been sending me copies of your newspaper and, frankly, I find it very interesting and enlightening, for it demonstrates quite forcefully that your kind of philosophy is on the run. This, in itself, is very gratifying, for it is reasonable to assume that your, and similar, attacks by others of your stripe, are the dying echoes of reactionism.

Perhaps you have refused to believe that millions of men, other than true descendants of those who landed on the Mayflower, have fought for this country and for the principles for which it, not you, stand; principles which include fundamental freedoms which you reactionaries would like to see deleted from the Constitution.

In your anxiety to eliminate any progressive governmental measures, you have forgotten that this country now stands practically alone, surrounded by a hostile world, and that every word of your smear paper is probably being used for propaganda throughout the world.

You are against Jews, Negroes, Mexicans, Catholics and probably against many minority groups, racial and religious; yet I suppose you loyally support the actions of the Ku Klux Klan, etc.

Why are you so opposed to a national Fair Employment Practices Act? Against Labor Unions? In short, what is your definition of "Americanism"?

I dare you to publish this letter, as is, in your paper; but, of course, you won't. You will end up by calling me a Communist or a radical Socialist, or some other favorite name, which is your only means of defense.

Dear Mr. Amador:

I will undertake to answer your charges in the order in which they appear.

You are correct in your assertion that my kind of philosophy is "on the run" and you might have added that it has been on the run for almost twenty years.

This is attested by the fact that corruption in our national capital has reached proportions never before attained since man first climbed down out of the trees and set the forces in motion which formed the pattern on which organized government is based.

It has been on the run since Constitutional government was abolished in favor of one-man rule; since the taxing power of Congress was abandoned as a medium of raising revenue and became an instrument for punishing or rewarding a citizen, according to his vote; it has been on the run since the custom was adopted of appropriating the substance of the thrifty and the strong and re-distributing it to the shiftless and the weak; it has been on the run since Washington experts decided to take the advice of Earl Browder and artificially fix prices of American commodities and repeal the natural law of supply and demand; it has been on the run since the Federal government entered private business in an attempt to throttle the American free enterprise system and set up a Socialist State; it has been on the run since ability, character and integrity have been discarded as essential attributes of our leaders whose perverted conception of political morality allows them to protect Communist traitors, operate the machinery of government in the interest of labor

unions and other minority groups and confiscate state and private property; it has been on the run since we began electing members of Congress who deliberately disregard their Constitutional obligation to impeach a president who violates every moral, legal and ethical principle on which our organic law is based; and it has been on the run since we took on the responsibility of supporting every dissolute and debauched government in Europe which has compelled us to run into debt to the tune of nearly \$300,000,000,000.

It is because my kind of philosophy is on the run, sir, that hundreds of thousands of Americans, including myself, are doing everything within our power to halt its progress before it is eternally too late.

I do not believe that the Mayflower is an issue in this discussion but I take the liberty of respectfully suggesting that those whose forefathers landed on the Plymouth Rock in broad open daylight are entitled to be classed as good American citizens as are also those whose ancestors may have reached here by swimming a river in the dead of night.

I have not forgotten that "this country now stands practically alone surrounded by a hostile world" and I have not forgotten, either, that we have arrived at this unfortunate impasse under the leadership of two global-crazy presidents who repudiated the Monroe Doctrine under which we enjoyed world eminence and universal respect, in favor of a policy of meddling in the internal affairs of every country on earth many of whom have been fighting for a thousand years and who will continue to battle between themselves long after we have exhausted our substance and resources in trying to keep them from each other's throats.

I am not against Catholics and have enjoyed lifelong friendship with innumerable members of that faith. I have constantly commended them as a group in their fight against Communism.

My antagonism toward foreigners is confined largely to those who hit this country running for office and start trying to wreck our form of government before they have learned to speak English.

As to the Ku Klux Klan, when it was a factor in my State I fought it with such resources as I possessed, which is a matter of record and can be verified.

If it is ever revived in the South, it will not be due to efforts of persons like me but because of the contemptible political carpet-baggers of the North whose unwarranted interference may bring it back into the picture.

My definition of Americanism, sir, might be described as the antithesis of the corrupt governmental practices I have outlined at the beginning of this letter, and in a return to a policy of government by law instead of government by whims of an underworld machine politician.

India Receives Huge Consignment Of American Newsprint While Domestic Users Hustle For It

Editors of American newspapers and other publications who have used their facilities to promote the philosophy of the Truman administration and who have been having to look to Canada and Europe for their supply of newsprint could acquire some interesting and valuable information by reading page 5967 of the May 23rd Congressional Record.

In a free-for-all discussion of the International Materials Conference, some illuminating facts were brought out by the various participants in the congressional pow-wow.

Plans for Setting Up United Nations Were Formed in Moscow

We were among the millions of saps who thought the United Nations was born in 1945 at San Francisco.

As a matter of fact, according to official records, it was set up in the city of Moscow at a Conference lasting from the 19th to the 30th of October, 1943. As early as 1941, it had been agreed by leaders of four nations, the United States, England, Russia and China, that such an organization would be set up and a declaration to this effect was made on January 1, 1941, but the movement was officially launched in Moscow in the Moscow Conference in October of 1943.

At the Moscow Conference to discuss the matter were Cordell Hull, of the United States, Anthony Eden, of England, and V. M. Molotov, of Russia. Also present at the Conference were Averill Harriman, United States Ambassador to Russia at the time and a corps of "experts," as well as various dignitaries from the three countries. The only Chinese representative involved seems to have been the Chinese Ambassador to Russia who was not present at the meeting but who was called on to sign the agreement after it was reached. Russian dignitaries were swarming all over the place, including Litvinov, Vishinsky, and other Soviet bigwigs.

This Conference discussed all the details pertaining to the surrender and disarmament of the enemy with which the four countries were then at war. Presumably it was decided at this Conference to divide

Communist Propaganda Flooding United States Postoffices

Senator Harry P. Cain of the State of Washington has introduced a bill in the Senate to deny second and third class mailing privileges to agents of Communist-controlled Countries.

According to Senator Cain vast quantities of propaganda material are sent by agents of foreign countries who take advantage of the United States mail service to infiltrate the people of this country with their ideologies.

Senator Cain has called the matter of the Postmaster General to the practice but was informed that this official has no statutory power to halt the traffic although he, too, said he regrets that the facilities of our postal service are being used for the propagation of Communist propaganda.

Senator Cain indicated that he hoped for majority support of the measure since it was assumed that all agreed that "Communist propaganda machinery ought not to be subsidized by the American taxpayer".

Senator Cain, unfortunately, will find that there will be disagreement with his measure for the effect of the propaganda which he mentions is reflected even in the body where he serves.

Trygve Lie, Secretary General of the United Nations was placed in that position in spite of the fact that a Canadian member received a majority of the votes necessary to elect but Gromyko, who was backing Lie, threatened a veto and Lie was named to the job, Mr. Woods states.

The congressman gives this interesting sketch of the life of Trygve Lie and his background:

"Trygve was a member of the Norwegian Labor Party, which was one of the first to affiliate with Lenin's 3rd International, though they afterwards withdrew from membership.

He also essayed the role of Benedict Arnold to his own country, by proposing on April 9th, 1945, the joint defense of Spitzbergen by Russia and Norway. This would have given Russia an ice-free bastion, within easy striking distance of Britain and this country; it would have dominated our pathway to Europe and Russia, and would have subjected Sweden to a cross-fire between Spitzbergen and Russia.

Lie spent a long time at Moscow with his pals, Stalin, Molotov and Vishinsky. He appoints all his Secretaries-General, of whom there are eight. Three of the eight are either Communists or Russian sympathizers.

Arkady A. Sobolev, next in line to Lie, is the Minister for War, Communications, and Information. All military and diplomatic affairs go to him first. Every movement of troops to Korea, or of guns and materiel, are reported to him. Sobolev is a Russian Communist, was brought up in Moscow under Stalin, and you should know what that means. I can't think of any better possible set-up for Stalin, who after all, is our real enemy in Korea."

There Is Something Wrong With This Picture

DECLARATION OF PRINCIPLES OF THE SOUTHERN CONSERVATIVE

The following principles on which the Southern Conservative is founded will appear in the paper from time to time:

Those of us who are responsible for initiating the Southern Conservative plead guilty to the charge of being hopelessly old-fashioned as we love our own country with a blind and passionate devotion, above all others on earth.

We find ourselves without the slightest desire to change our form of government to conform to foreign ideologies or to attempt to re-shape it in the Soviet mold.

We are convinced that those who founded this Republic framed the greatest instrument for the government of men ever devised by human mind.

We wish to deny, before it is made, the charge that we are subsidized by any special interests or that our undertaking is just another scheme dreamed up to attract the support of big business.

In our discussions of State and National issues, we shall show no more partiality to the Tycoons of Industry than we shall to the Czars of Labor.

In fact, we seem to remember that some of the biggest business men in the nation teamed up with labor union racketeers in playing ball with the New Deal when that economic atrocity was riding the crest and have continued to string along with its more vicious counterpart currently administering the government in Washington.

The courage, integrity and patriotism which must be commanded if the Republic is to survive will not be found exclusively among representatives of big business or leaders of labor unions.

It must be drawn from that vast group of average Americans who ask nothing of government except that it secure them in their inalienable right to work, to save and to keep a reasonable share of the fruits of their toil.

We are against the domination of government either by big business or big labor and we maintain that favoritism to either group on the part of a State or National administration is un-American, immoral and a flagrant abuse of power.

As to political affiliations, we acknowledge allegiance to neither of the two major parties.

As presently constituted, both are so shot through with radicalism as to render them incapable of resolving the serious problems confronting the Republic.

We acknowledge our indebtedness to the courageous and patriotic Coalition Bloc of sound-thinking Democrats and Republicans in both Houses of Congress which has prevented Communistic influences from complete domination of our Federal government.

We are opposed to the reckless squandering of the taxpayers' money by incompetent, irresponsible and improvident public officials and we contend that taxes should be levied for purposes of revenue only and not to punish the rich, reward the poor or redistribute the wealth.

We are firmly committed to the principle of States Rights and we hold that the people of any part of the United States are entitled to maintain their own social customs and traditions without interference from politicians seeking votes to perpetuate themselves in power.

We are unequivocally in favor of Free Enterprise as opposed to government ownership of business and insist on the responsibility of every American to seek to improve his social and economic condition through initiative, energy and thrift rather than leaning on the arm of government for support.

We concede to every man the right to work and the opportunity of profitable employment regardless of whether he does, or does not, belong to a labor union.

On the other hand, we claim for the employer the irrevocable right to hire and fire his employees without instructions from any government agency or intimidation by Federal Police.

We feel that at this crucial time in history, it is imperative that newspapers and other groups seeking to influence public opinion should exert every effort within their power to help preserve our republican form of government, our Free Enterprise system and American way of life. We shall exert all our energies to that end.

These are the sentiments of the SOUTHERN CONSERVATIVE and although ours may be only one small voice crying in the wilderness, we will fight for fundamental American principles, as we understand them, without apology to any man or set of men.

MY NIGHT

I have deeply appreciated all the wonderful letters which have come to me since Follow has gone to that particular canine heaven of tree-lined streets especially reserved to the little dogs of famous people.

I like to think that if the true story of his life were written, it would prove that he was perhaps more closely identified with the history of his time than most of his human contemporaries.

I do not believe, for instance, that any other dog can claim the distinction of having had a flotilla of war vessels reverse their course and turn back as they did in his case when he was found to be missing from the battleship on which he was traveling during World War II.

I have always resented the unfavorable publicity which this trivial incident inspired and it is my feeling that the reporter who broke the story was a Republican Tory whose purpose was to smear an innocent little dog for partisan reasons.
