

My dear Governor Allred:-

In response to your telegram dated  
February 19th., relative to the arrest of sixty four Mexican  
Citizens.

Wish to advise that under date of February 11th., 1938  
some 111 persons of Mexican extraction were arrested by this  
Department. Of these sixty four or more proved to be Mexican  
Citizens. They were all charged with violating either our State  
laws or City ordinances.

The Attorney for the Mexican Consulate General called  
upon me and demanded their immediate release. I refused to comply  
with his request but offered to allow him to sign all their bonds  
which he refused to do. After considerable discussion he arose in  
a very irritable mood and left saying he would swear out a writ  
which for some reason or other he failed to do.

Some of these defendants have been fined in Corporation  
Court, some acquitted, others await trial in the County Criminal  
Court.

Hoping this will be the desired information, and if I  
can be of further assistance to you do not hesitate to communicate  
immediately.
