

November 30 1964

A regular meeting of the Student Senate was called to order by President Fowler at 5 p.m. on Monday, November 30, 1964, in Room 230 of the Fred Heyne Building.

There was no objection to by-passing the reading of the minutes, so the minutes of the last Student Senate meeting, November 23, 1964, were approved as written.

Dean Yardley was given the floor to speak on the status of the Organizations Policy. He explained that the opinion of the Student Services Staff concerning the Organizations Policy was to accept the spirit of the proposal; however, some aspects of the bill were not entirely clear and showed some internal inconsistencies. Student Services felt that it was the duty of the President of the Student Association to appoint two or three people to meet with him to review and clarify these inconsistencies; then the Policy could be sent back to the Senate and become operative.

President Fowler appointed Richard Gaghagen, John Daigle and Bill Walker to work with Dean Yardley and asked that they submit the Policy back to the Senate in its changed form.

Clarence Eriksen asked Dean Yardley what the inconsistencies were. Dean Yardley explained that 1) in the Policy the Organizations Board is given general supervision over all organizations, but in the initial statement, certain of these groups are excluded; 2) there is question of where the groups should do their banking, and it is the opinion of the Student Services that the Board ought to exempt those groups who desire it but that responsible control must be kept as the University is responsible; and 3) there are verbal inconsistencies like the first one mentioned.

There were no committee reports.

New business:

Helen Cassidy introduced a Bill to Appropriate Funds for a Valentine Dance. President Fowler referred this Bill to the Fiscal and Governmental Operations Committee.

Judy Hoffman introduced a Bill for Student Association Participation in the Annual American University Intercollegiate Trutle International. President Fowler referred this bill to the Social and Spirit Committee.


Bill Walker asked the status on the Bill to Extend Library Hours. Dean Yardley reported that it would be necessary to get the appropriate people together to move in the direction that the Senate wishes more than just through the Cougar.

Richard Gaghagen reported that he had talked with Dr. Holley and that he was in favor of the extension; however, he needs funds to hire two more people to work from 10:00 to 12:00. This money comes from Dr. Allred and Richard Gaghagen said he would speak to him.

Betty Barnes introduced a resolution to express the opposition of the students of the University of Houston against the tuition increase. Judy Hoffman seconded and the resolution was referred to the Fiscal and Governmental Operations Committee.

Charles Hollinger moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded and the meeting adjourned at 7:35.
