The Senate met at 7:08 in Oberholtzer Hall in Dining Rooms 3 and 4, and the meeting was called to order by the President.

THE SENATE JOURNAL

The minutes were approved as reported.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President GACHAGEN reported that the President Forum will be held next Wednesday, November 9, in Room 136 E. Dr. Philip Hoffman will be present for discussion on current topics and to answer questions from members. President GACHAGEN urged all presidents of campus organizations to attend or to send a representative. In addition, on the night of the same day the Lettermen will be performing in the Cullen Auditorium. This group is sponsored by Student Association and tickets for the performance are on sale now in Room 206 Cougar Den.

President GACHAGEN reported that S.R.6 will come before the Senate tonight, and he urged the Senators to adopt the resolution in its present form. The Houston Council of Colleges began last spring and this body needs the support of its member student governments before it can be productive. Their primary project now is the Student Discount Program. Once the Council is set up, someone can then propose a Bill of Rights to the Constitution, or make any other changes that seem necessary.

The President then asked all the newly elected Senators to stand and take the oath of office. The following Senators were sworn in:

REPORT OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON STATE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Mr. GREENE, Chairman, reported that the Committee met on October 31, 1966. The Committee members present (other than the Chairman) were the following: SAXE (Education), SAXE (Technology), and PICKLE.

The Committee interviewed Mr. Kim Quee Young, and Mr. Robert Brownstein for appointment as Co-Directors of the International Students Division of the Department of National & International Affairs, and Tom Morey as Director of Department of State Affairs. Also, S.R. 6 was discussed.

The Committee recommends S.R.6 favorably with no changes. The Committee recommends the nominations of Kim Quee Young and Robert Brownstein as Co-Directors of the International Students Division and Tom Morey as Director of the Department of State Affairs.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

After considering each candidate recommended by the Committee On State, National and International Affairs, the Senate voted to confirm the following people: Tom Morey, Kim Quee Young, and Robert Brownstein.

Next, the Senate considered S.R.6 after Vice President MATTERN gave the first reading of the resolution.

Mr. DRISCOLL said that he thought the resolution to be a unique and very good idea and urged the Senate to vote unanimously for it, and that now was not the time to amend its constitution.

Mr. ADAMS asked if any kind of resolution could be presented by the Senate.

The President replied that if a Senator wants to amend the resolution, research should be made to present a strong resolution--one which will show leadership from our university.

Mr. THIEL said that the Houston Council of Colleges has waited this long to ratify their constitution another week will not matter.

Miss LOGAN replied that the Council only meets once a month and if the Senate delays another week on the resolution, the Council will be delayed for another month.

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences moved the previous question, and the motion passed. Senate Resolution 6 passed.

Miss LOGAN moved to discharge S.18 from Committee. Miss LOGAN said that there should not be further delay on considering the bill and the Senate should take action tonight.

President GACHAGEN said that AWS has asked for more time on this bill, and the Fiscal & Governmental Operations Committee had requested more time so that they can hold a general meeting for the benefit of all interested persons and also to further research the bill with other colleges.

Mr. WOOD moved the previous question and the motion passed. The motion to discharge S. 18 from Committee failed. Miss LOGAN requested that her vote be recorded as negative.

NEW BUSINESS

Miss TRUEHEART introduces S.R.7 (A RESOLUTION URGING THE UNIVERSITY CENTER POLICY BOARD TO DESIGNATE AN INTERNATIONAL LOUNGE IN THE UNIVERSITY CENTER) which was referred to the Committee On Student Life.

Mr. GREENE announced the Committee On State, National & International Affairs would meet after the Senate meeting.

Mr. ADAMS announced that he would hold a Constituency meeting after the Senate meeting.
