## "Changing Times" spotlights DPMC lab foreman

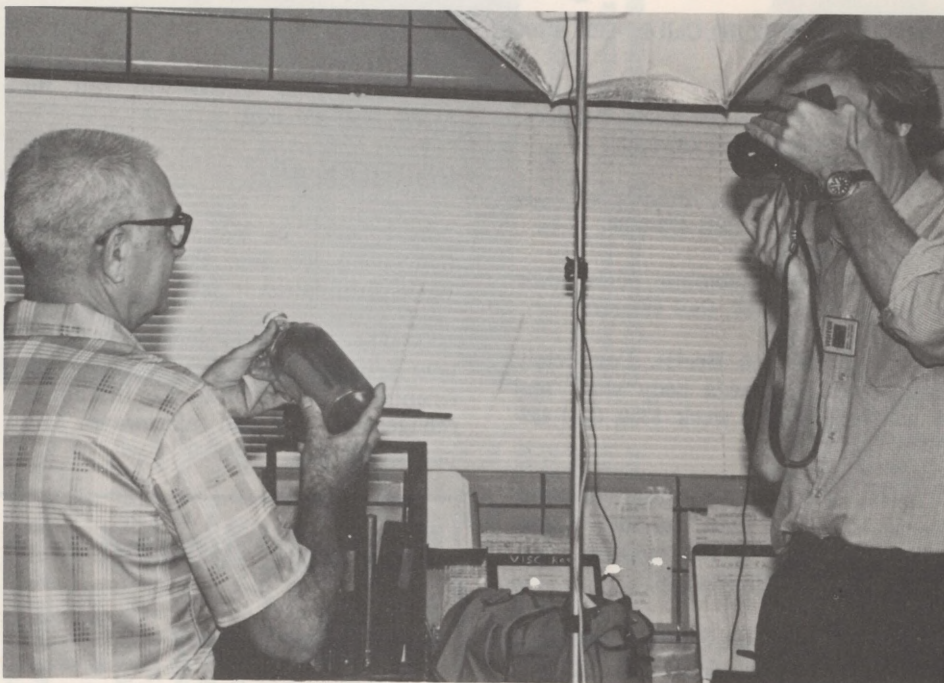
"I find the whole thing very interesting," said Nowak, a foreman in the Refinery Lab. "It sure is a good way to break the routine."

Why the spotlight? Nowak is one of 40 people selected from across the country by *Changing Times* magazine to be featured between its covers. These personal profiles are designed to show a vast cross-section of the magazine's audience.

"I've been a subscriber for more than 10 years, but when they called the first time for the interview it went right over my head," Nowak said. "But I decided why not? If they were going to call, I might as well listen."

## Safety Recognition Award Catalog updated

DPMC field groups and support groups recently honored for their safety performance are now using a new Safety Recognition Award Catalog, offering a wider assortment of gifts for those groups earning the award.

A pecten certificate is awarded to each field group in the Complex completing six months without an OSHA recordable injury, and to each support group completing 12 months without an OSHA recordable. The pecten certificates can be redeemed for gifts from the award catalog.

The Safety Award Program, which began one year ago, adopted the new award catalog July 1. It is basically the same as the previous one, but it offers more gifts, and the chance to accumulate certificates — something that wasn't possible with the old catalog.

The new catalog is divided into books; the gifts in Book 1 require one certificate for redemption, Book 2 two certificates, Book 3 four certificates and Book 4 six certificates. You may redeem your pecten certificate as soon as you get the award, or you can wait until you have accumulated the necessary number of

certificates for the gift of your choice. For example, if you've saved two certificates, you can select two gifts from Book 1, or one gift from Book 2 or continue to save until you have enough certificates for a gift from Book 3 or 4.

The new catalog includes gifts like power tools, sporting equipment and home furnishings. In fact, the biggest problem with the new award catalog may be deciding on which gift you'd like. From time to time, the catalog selections will be updated by dropping unpopular items and adding new ones.

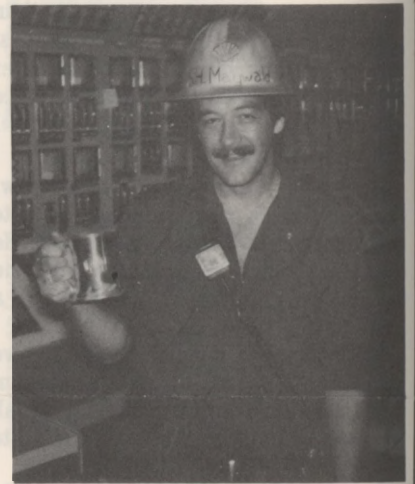
