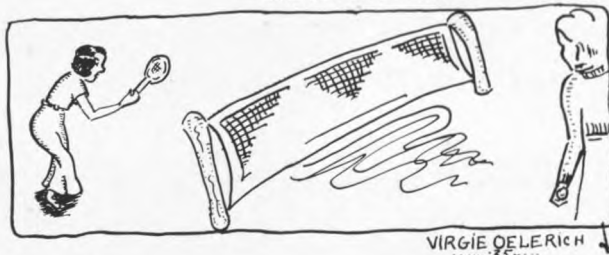
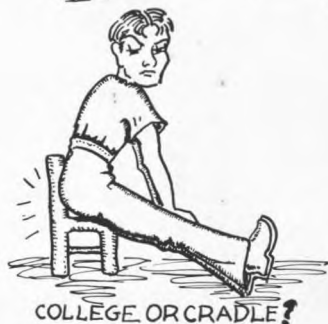
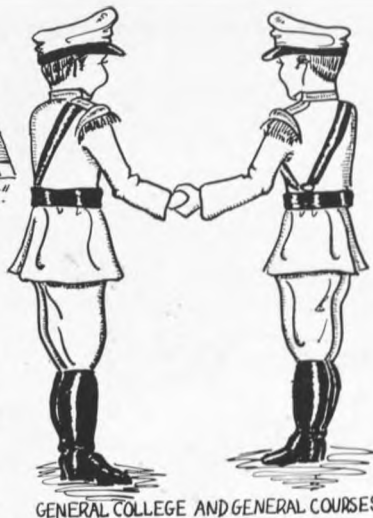
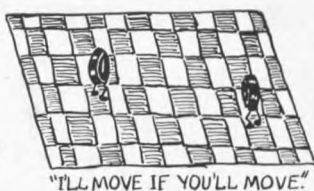
#### AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF A DIME

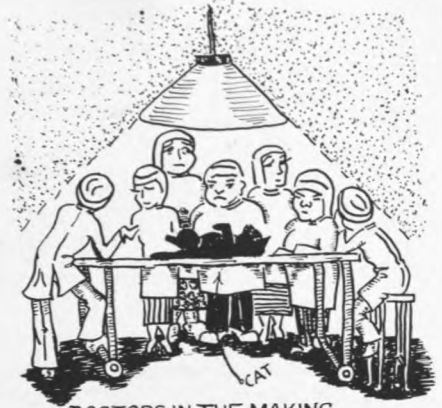


