Dear Sir:

1st: Mr. Sullivan and I had a conference with the Mayor this noon and he is pleased with the plans as prepared and is quite sure they will meet the approval of the Council.

2nd: The tentative draft of contract was satisfactory to him.

3rd: It developed in the conversation that he is under the impression that the building is to be equipped by you, and Mr. Sullivan is under the impression that you are not to equip the building and has not taken such into account in estimates that he has made. He thinks the full \$75,000.00 will be taken up in completing the building according to his plans.

The Mayor stated that he did not want to make the impression that the City will not equip the building; that, in fact, he thinks the Council will do anything that you request in the premises. His statement with reference to this is simply to convey his understanding at the present time.


4th: Mr. Sullivan says that he can on short notice
