Loss of Christian Ministers to Marxism Worst Blow Yet Suffered by the American Republic

Who'll Support Foreign Beggars When "Capitalist" Well Runs Dry?

If there is one thing that loose-lipped politicians do better than anything else, it is talk when they should be listening and that is exactly what Mr. Sam Rayburn was doing, in the opinion of many Texans, when he let go with a blast at "capitalists" in a recent speech.

The occasion was a meeting in Washington of the National Conference on International Trade which was called in connection with the spectacular campaign in behalf of the Foreign Trade program launched by the Madison Avenue boys who are self-admitted authorities on all subjects of national and world import and who have the process of packaged-thinking down to such a fine art that they can turn out copy on any issue with assembly line efficiency.

Rayburn's part in the colorful program was to deliver the principal address thereby bolstering the program with the prestige which goes with the office of Speaker of the House. In some way, he got his wires crossed and had himself billed for two addresses at the same time so a colleague was conscripted to deliver the inspiring message to the Washington group in his behalf while he journeyed out to the hinterlands to rally "bi-partisan" support for the program launched by Roosevelt and continued by Eisenhower and whose objective is to build up trade for other nations while destroying the industry of our own country.

In this speech delivered in Mr. Rayburn's name, "capitalists" were presented as being "potentially more dangerous than Communists" although one would think that the Speaker would have made a more effective comparison since nothing he has ever done would indicate that he regards the Soviets as any particular menace so far as we have observed.

An amusing angle to the Speaker's denunciation of "capitalists" stems from the fact that in these parts he is not exactly regarded as a pauper himself. There are many misguided characters hereabouts who regard his vast holdings of land, real estate and cattle, to say nothing of his top-bracket salary, as having all the makings of a "capitalist" as the term is generally understood. As he dashes around Washington in his shiny black limousine, Mr. Sam does not quite give the impression that when, and if, he ever retires from the job he will have to go on relief.

Also, it is difficult for many of his constituents to view him as an expert on the subject of "trade" since all his ideas of industry, government and economics have been acquired, not from experience, but from the vantage point of a soft berth on which he has reposed for what constitutes an average lifetime.

He has never produced anything except hot air, has never been an employer or met a pay-roll with his own money and has probably never done a full day's work since he was a boy in short pants on a Fannin County farm. The only implement he has ever used to make a living is his tongue.

Israel Putnam is said to have laid down his plow to go fight the British but Sam Rayburn laid down his plow to go shoot the bull.

More than half a century ago, he connected up with the public teat and has been sucking it without ceasing from that day to this.

In the matter of worldly goods, we are just about as far from a "capitalist" as it is possible to be since we are only one step from the poor house and two jumps ahead of the sheriff but we have a deep and abiding respect for capitalists and for the capitalist system which is the basis of our American economy. We resent it with every ounce of our being when fat-headed Socialists in Congress, or out, make dirty cracks about a system which enables these parasites to live in luxury as they bite the hand that not only feeds them but supports hordes of lazy foreign bums in whose interest they are so vitally concerned.

The heavy infiltration of the legislative, judicial and executive branches of government by the agents of International Communism during the past twenty-five years has resulted in weakening the Constitution, discrediting the Free Enterprise system and replacing basic American governing principles with National Socialism. As deadly as these assaults have been against the American way of life, they deal only with material things which can be overcome once we again elect dedicated American patriots to Congress and to the Presidency. But the conquest of thousands of Christian ministers of the Gospel by the forces of International Communism constitutes a body blow to Christian civilization from which there may be no recovery.

No matter how ominous the clouds that darken the horizon or how menacing the threat to the safety of an imperiled nation, the American people would still feel a heartening measure of security if the organized religious forces of the country were solidly lined up in behalf of the sound and invincible principles of government on which the Republic was founded.

Since the Dark Ages the test of a nation's greatness has been measured by the spiritual values of its people and by the strength, faith and courage of its religious leaders.

From the beginning of civilization, the Church has been a harbor in time of storm, a refuge in spiritual stress and an anchor when strife and conflict endangered the physical, moral or religious unity of a nation.

Along with love of family and loyalty to country, reverence for the Church and for Ministers of the Gospel has been the dominant emotion and guiding impulse of a majority of the American people and the strongest contributing factor in making the United States the recognized leader of Christian Forces throughout the world.

Those who laid the foundation of the American government were devoted, patriotic and God-fearing men with a song in their hearts, a prayer on their lips and a deep and abiding faith that they were building a Republic under the guiding hand of a Divine Creator which would endure throughout the ages.

As they labored to erect a structure as free from earthly frailties as it was humanly possible for a man-made institution to be, they were secure in their belief that this country, under God and with a form of government based on Christian principles and human freedom, would live eternally as a model Republic dedicated to the dignity of the individual and the right of the citizen to achieve his economic destiny by his own efforts.

In that period of the nation's glorious history, Communism was unheard of, there wasn't a Socialist in the land and no stronger defenders of the faith or more earnest champions of the American way of life or the Free Enterprise System existed than the consecrated men who delivered their inspired messages from the pulpit.

Although in the main they restricted their services to ministering to the spiritual needs of the people and held themselves and their sacred profession aloof from distracting and worldly issues, their loyal defense of Americanism once saved this country from atheistic Totalitarianism which now threatens the Republic on every hand.

Soviet Propaganda Is Freeing Our Criminals and Emptying Our Jails

One of the principal objectives of Communist propaganda in the United States is leniency toward all types of criminal characters and the release of thugs and gangsters to prey on the people of the American Republic.

Of course in the Soviet Union, it is a different story. Criminals are not only dealt with harshly there; they are not even given the benefit of the standards of justice which prevail in civilized areas of the world. Trial by jury is unheard of. When a crime is committed, and many times when a person is guilty of nothing more than thinking contrary to the Communist formula, such person is liquidated. Period.

The addition of women to juries has not helped; in fact, in many instances they are proving pushovers for the sob stories of criminal slob.

At the present rate of soft sentences, running concurrently, and of indiscriminate "not guilty" verdicts for arch fiends who kill for the thrill we can foresee the day when soft-headed juries will award medals, rather than prescribing the hot-seat, for the nation's criminal element.

Modern Republicanism Perpetuates Ruinous New Deal Tariff Policies

Every American who is concerned in the future of American industry and, consequently, the very survival of the Republic, should read the wonderful book "Mainline" by Honorable George W. Malone, United States Senator from Nevada, although the heart-breaking story told therein will not be conducive to their peace of mind.

"Mainline" is the saga of the betrayal of a sick nation in the early 1930's by the passage of the Trade Agreements Act — an Act which took away the market for American producers and gave it to foreigners. It was an Act in which the Congress abdicated its Constitutional right to levy tariffs and allowed non-elected personalities in the Executive branch to take over the responsibility. Ultimately this power to regulate American tariffs was turned over to a United Nations sponsored group of economists in Geneva who exercise supreme control over the destiny of American producers and manufacturers.

This Trade Agreements Act was instituted and passed by a Democratic Congress in 1934 when the New Deal zealots were running wild in their haste to get their crackpot theories enacted into legislation.

When the Republican party was returned to power in 1952, it was confidently believed that the Act would be repealed and that Congress would reclaim its abdicated rights in tariff levies.

Instead the Eisenhower administration has followed the identical policy of the New Deal crackpots and the President is now asking that the Act be extended for five years.

In the late Seventeenth Century, a sect of European Liberals and intellectuals known as the "Illuminati" advocated a form of World Socialism designed to destroy Christian principles and morals and to oppose Free Enterprise as a system of government.

This movement brought on the French Revolution and its next objective was the United States where a new Republic had lately been launched based on this type of economic system.

So effective, however, was the opposition of Men of the Cloth in this country to this godless ideology that it was beaten back before it could gain a foothold here.

In the years which have passed since then, however, the movement for World Socialism has been strengthened and rendered more appealing by its leaders who have cunningly invested it with spurious claims to Christian service and World Brotherhood designed to snare the gullible and less mentally alert members of the clergy.

This has resulted in misguided ministers from all over the world, including the United States, being drawn to its pagan and godless banner.

The century-old attempts of subversive world forces to capture the American ministry and to enlist church facilities and influence in spreading Communist propaganda received its greatest impetus at Amsterdam some years ago when religious leaders from all over the world were induced to meet in that city and formulate a New Social Order under the sponsorship of the World Council of Churches.

At that meeting a scurrilous attack was made on the American Free Enterprise System by implication when resolutions were passed lumping Capitalism in the same category with Communism and condemning both systems of government.

Their denunciation of Communism was, of course, insincere and intended only for propaganda and publicity purposes since the meeting was called by World Socialists and there is, of course, no fundamental difference between Socialism and Communism since both ideologies set up the State as Supreme and relegate the individual to the position of a mere cog in its vast machinery.

Beginning with that meeting, the movement has gathered strength and force in this country until today the National Council of Churches claims to exercise control over more than 40,000,000 Americans affiliated with the nation's various Protestant churches.

Its well-oiled Communist propaganda machine for One-World Government was so firmly established and was operating with such lethal effectiveness that it was years before it was recognized for the menace which it is. Today it offers a greater threat of destroying the American form of government and of wrecking the faith of the American people in a Supreme Being than the Soviet apparatus whose objective is the same.

Communism, as an ideology, does not tolerate a belief in God and its leaders have sworn to destroy all conception of a Christian deity in order to reduce the people to the proper depth of moral degradation where they will willingly accept this degenerate theory of a Super State to rule the world.

Why Christian ministers who have taken an oath to expound and uphold the Christian faith would surrender to an ideology based on atheism is a question which is beyond the ken of human understanding. But that they do is attested by the fact that the National Council of Churches, the largest organized religious group in this country, is on record as being in complete accord with practically every policy laid down by the Soviets for the announced objective of overthrowing the American government.

The most charitable conclusion is that in deserting the pulpit for the strange and alien field of world politics and economics they have ventured beyond their depth and have become so helplessly the prey of scheming world planners that they cannot escape without publicly confessing inherent weakness which induced them to succumb to evil temptations of which they had so often warned others.

Also, they are probably—like frail humanity from time immemorial—so thrilled by the unaccustomed feel of power and so flattered that their talents and theological influence are being employed to shape a new social and economic order that they have overlooked the fact that the policies involved are in direct contrast to the Christian principles to which they were committed when they took the sacred vows of the clergy.

No responsibility of Americans today is more pressing than that which demands that they drive preachers out of the political forum and force them back to the pulpit.

Otherwise, the threat to the continued existence of the United States as a free nation assumes alarming proportions for when the church succumbs to subversive doctrines and ministers of the gospel capitulate to a totalitarian ideal, one of the strongest bulwarks of the American economy is shattered and there is little hope for survival.

ADA Making Big Play To Capture The Democratic Party Machinery In Texas

Americans for Democratic Action are making an all-out effort to capture the Democratic Party machinery of Texas in 1958 with the objective of getting that State's support for a Socialist labor candidate for President in 1960.

ADA is working through a radical group in Texas known as Democrats of Texas, or DOT for short. This DOT is a hodgepodge of unionists, Negroes, and a scattering of rich and influential Socialists but they are active in all sections of the State and Conservatives realize that they have a fight on their hands.

ADA is said to be pouring money into Texas and is especially active in organizing Negroes in areas where the colored population is heavy.

The Presidential candidate who is expected to be the recipient of all this ADA activity is John Kennedy of Massachusetts who is so ambitious for the Democratic nomination that he is apparently willing to abandon all pretense of supporting Constitutional Government and is going all out in behalf of a Socialist Labor government.

On February 6 of this year he introduced S.B. 3244 in the United States Senate which is one of the most dangerous measures ever proposed in that body as it would completely destroy all State employment security systems and abrogate all existing State labor laws, including the right to work legislation now in effect in some States.

Kennedy was one of the Democratic members of the Senate Rackets Committee who is reported, together with his brother, Robert Kennedy, Committee counsel, to have sabotaged the investigation of Walter Reuther and his goons in the Kohler strike.

Dallas Business Man and Rancher Announces for United States Senate

Conservative Texans who have long bemoaned the fact that they have practically no representation in the United States Senate are reportedly overjoyed by the announcement of William A. Blakley of Dallas that he will run for the seat now occupied by Ralph Yarborough.

Mr. Blakley who is a business man and rancher, served four months in that job as interim senator following Price Daniel's resignation to assume the governorship of Texas. He was appointed by former Governor Allan Shivers and is known to hold sound views on issues of government.

It is the belief of the solid element of the State's citizenship that should Mr. Blakley be successful in his race, he would restore to the office a measure of dignity, stature and statesmanship which the post commanded when such men as Joe Bailey, John H. Reagan and Charlie Culberson represented the Lone Star State in that great office.

Consolidation Will Confer Vast Power on Soap Man

There has perhaps been no more alarming or disquieting event to occur in this country so far than the President's insistent demand that the Army, the Navy and the Air Force be placed under one-man rule with the Secretary of Defense given absolute power and authority over the fighting forces of this country.

This move for a solidified command of the three units is another phase of the stepped up plans for unification on all fronts, and is recognized as another long stride toward softening up the American people for One-World government or a part of "Operation Take-Over."

Opposition to the move by top-ranking military and civilian authorities who are fully informed of the potential danger to the national security in this proposed centralization of power in the hands of one man, is said to be at a high pitch in Washington.

However, since the President is quoted in the press as saying that he was going to bring it about regardless of what anybody thinks and since it is known that he is ready to throw the full force and power of his high office behind it, there is grave doubt that the opposition in Congress will be able to thwart his plan.

In the event he is successful in concentrating these three Departments of the Army, Navy and Air Force into one head, Neil H. McElroy, former executive of a Cincinnati soap company, will perhaps wield more power than any other American in the history of the Republic.

We saw the new Attorney General of the United States, William P. Rogers, on the Meet the Press program and the impression we got was of an eel slithering around in a bucket of lard. His replies to questions propounded by members of the panel were masterpieces of evasion and equivocation and his manner indicated plainly that he holds himself in high esteem. It will be a great day for this country if we ever have in that important office an outspoken, forthright American rather than an eely politician who talks all day and says nothing.

However, if Conservatives run true to form they will get several of their number into the race while the Reds, of course, will have only one entry.

Conservatives have the proper perspective on government and subscribe to sound principles but when it comes to political action, it sometimes seems as if they have holes in their heads.

Just How Stupid Can People Get When Selecting Speakers For Local Groups?

The agencies which book Communist Fronters and Fellow Travelers throughout the country are active twenty-four hours a day and unless a thorough investigation is made of speakers chosen to address local groups, subversive lecturers are going to increase rather than diminish.

The strange part of the proceedings is that the more questionable the record of a lecturer, the more impeccable his or her sponsorship. Those with Red leanings seem to have no trouble whatever in getting good people to back them, thereby giving them more prestige and investing their remarks with greater dignity.

For instance, Agnes De Mille has been booked to speak in Houston soon and is being brought there by the alumni of an Eastern College and while in Houston is to be entertained by prominent people of that city. While she is not speaking in a tax-supported school and a hall has been hired for the occasion, many school officials and teachers have been invited to hear her and no doubt will. The prominence of her sponsors also insures attendance by many who would stay away if they were familiar with her record.

Georgetown Sets Award-Giving Business Back A Hundred Years

Whatever honor that has attached to the granting of awards by schools to so-called "noted former students" has been greatly tarnished and such bestowal now means less than nothing following a farcical performance along this line by Georgetown University in Washington, D. C., recently.

A little two-by-four Judge from North Dakota whose only claim to judicial distinction lies in his deliberate violation of the Constitution and of the Bill of Rights, has been named as Georgetown's "most outstanding alumnus" and an award is to be presented to him on May First. (It should have been on April First.)

The name of this small-time legal misfit is Ronald N. Davis who attained the first public notice of his life by his un-Constitutional be-

The National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, as any informed person knows, was shown as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General of the United States in 1948.

Why persons who regard themselves as responsible citizens of the Republic would invite characters like this to address them when good sound-thinking Americans are available, is one of the unsolved mysteries of the ages.

Until local citizens begin making a thorough investigation of the speakers sent into their midst to spread propaganda, they have no right whatever to complain of the encroachment of Communism on American institutions.

There has never yet been a more unanswerable assertion than the statement of Thomas Jefferson to the effect that "that country is governed best that is governed least." All the troubles which beset this Republic and which threaten to destroy it stem from big government with so many agencies and so many employes and bureaucrats that they are falling all over each other's feet.

Disillusioned "One-World Citizen" Crawls Back Home

Garry Davis who, ten years ago, left the United States, renounced his citizenship and declared himself a "citizen of the world." has come crawling back asking that his citizenship be restored.

According to an Associated Press article on April 13, he had only eighty cents in his pocket when he left Naples, Italy after borrowing the money for his ticket home where he expects to be supported by his father in New York until he gets a job.

As contemptible a specimen as he is, one cannot but feel sympathy for this poor, misguided young man who is a product of the phony educational and political theories which have run rampant in this country for a quarter of a century and which have given half-baked young radicals spurious ideals, false values and phony logic concerning all the fundamental issues of life.

Davis will have to go through the same procedure as an alien to get back his citizenship but perhaps the incident will be a lesson to other dim witted young Liberals who have been given a low opinion of the American way of life by those entrusted with their education.

During the time Davis was wandering around in Europe trying to be a "citizen of the world," he was kicked out of a half dozen countries who naturally had no respect for a man who would renounce the land of his birth.

The Southern Methodist University Honors Former Daily Worker Editor

Reactions ranging all the way from shocked disbelief to downright contempt and disgust greeted the announcement that a dedicated Communist, John Gates, had been invited to address the student body of a supposed Christian institution, Southern Methodist University at Dallas, in April.

Protests from all over the State by friends of the school came in thick and fast when the decision to have Communist Gates bring his propaganda message to SMU was first made public, but there was no backing down.

The invitation was extended by the Student Center Forum, according to the press, but the president of the school backed them up one hundred per cent. They did cancel out the dinner which the brain-washed young Socialists had decided to give in honor of the former editor of the Daily Worker, but that was all the concession the school or the students made to public indignation over the disgraceful affair.

President Willis Tate dragged out the thread-bare argument of the Reds as justification for his incredible act in approving a Communist as speaker before students in what is regarded as a Christian institution. He said that to deny Gates the right to speak, and to deny students the right to hear him, would violate "academic freedom."

He insisted that the whole point in having Gates make his talk was that students might have the opportunity to question him and to compare Communism with our form of government, to the detriment of the former.

All of which stamped Tate as being about as familiar with Communist tactics as a turkey buzzard is with outer space and even less so for, after all, a vulture does operate in aerial surroundings and has first-hand knowledge of how to keep himself afloat while SMU's president would obviously be completely outclassed in any contest with Soviet propaganda.

This same argument is used by those who advocate teaching Communism in all schools. They contend that American youth would thereby be informed of this dangerous philosophy and in position to repudiate it. They totally ignore the fact that a heavy majority of our current day educationists are sympathetic to Communism and would present the subject to immature students not for the dangerous doctrine which it is, but as a perfect system of government which provides justice for all. This they can do in a thousand subtle ways and anyone who doubts that most of them would do it, is soft in the head.

And that is just what Gates did. He is a dyed-in-the-wool Communist highly experienced in projecting his message to the gullible and the Spiritually under-privileged and he no doubt gained converts among the addepatated young students at SMU whose already half-in-doctrinated minds are ripe for the plucking.

SMU is the institution, it will be remembered, which refused to invite the late great Senator Joseph R. McCarthy to address its students on the ground that he was too "controversial," thereby leaving the inescapable conclusion that on SMU's campus a Communist is not "controversial."

In refreshing contrast to the action at SMU was that of William V. Houston, president of Rice Institute at Houston who, when importuned by half-baked radicals on the campus to have Gates also speak at that school responded with an emphatic "no."

Conservatives Win Smashing Victory In Canadian Commons

Teachers In Integrated Detroit Schools Are Pleading For Protection

Charging that discipline has gotten out of control, leaders of the Detroit Federation of Teachers recently appealed for police protection in that city's forty-two high schools.

Presumably the Detroit Federation of Teachers is an affiliate of the American Federation of Teachers which, it will be remembered, went on record strongly in favor of the Supreme Court's ruling ordering integration of the schools which is causing all the trouble in Detroit, and in hundreds of other American cities, now.

Texas Counties Must Doll Up Jails For Fastidious Crooks

The Legislature of Texas, at its last session, passed a law setting a minimum standard for jails which is designed to convert the State's clinks hereafter into buildings which are more comfortable than a roadside motel and slightly less luxurious than Mr. Hilton's hotels.

Thirty per cent of the buildings must contain one-man cells, the law says, presumably on the theory that there may be fastidious criminals who do not want to associate with other hoodlums and who prefer a room to themselves. So far as we could learn there are to be no private baths and there is no maid service.

All this, of course, is in keeping with the spirit of the times. The big idea in the first place is to be lenient with criminals. The main thing is to get their convictions thrown out if possible and turn them loose to commit similar crimes. If, by chance, they are convicted, then the term should be as light as possible and there is always the Supreme Court if everything else fails.

For those who are unable to beat the law and must serve long terms, conditions of life should be made as pleasant as possible in the jail or pen which they honor with their presence in order that there may be no bad "psychological" effect on the prisoners.

We must be made wrong, or something, for we absolutely do not hold with the Communist belief that all criminals should be turned loose to prey on society. And in the case of cold-blooded murderers who kill for the thrill, all our sympathy is for the victim who ended up in the grave and there is not an iota left for the killer.

The only expense our plan would call for would be for oil to grease up the chair for vicious criminals who murder, rob and rape for sheer love of defying law and order, and who hold human life as of no more value than that of an animal in the jungle.

We Refuse To Shed Any Tears Over American Insult To Romania

The people of Communist Romania are reported in the press as being outraged because Washington has sent a Negro as United States Minister to that country.

It is an insult all right for the American government to send a Negro as a high-ranking diplomat to any country outside of those in Africa where the population is entirely colored, but, in the case of Romania, it is a well-deserved insult, and the Romanians deserve no sympathy whatever.

They willingly submitted to the Communist yoke and offered little resistance when Stalin annexed them as slaves of the Soviet and with the exception of a few patriots there, they have fitted right into the Communist orbit with a minimum of protest.

Here Goes Another One Of Our Fundamental Rights

The American people have seen their rights, liberties and freedoms taken away from them one by one during a twenty-five year reign of International Socialists in Washington but up until now, they have felt that they at least had control over their own persons.

Characteristic of the thirty-one Greek letter Sororities which constitute the National Panhellenic Conference, is a long history of loyalty to country and allegiance to God. We are voluntary associations. We are dedicated to the preservation of freedom of citizens to choose their associates, which is a freedom characteristic of civilized cultures, a freedom protected by the Constitution of the United States, and sustained by the courts of our country since the time of its founding.

"We, the members of NPC, agree that we have a responsibility to contribute to accurate and thorough knowledge about the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights and to know the ideologies destructive of our Country."

"If we can maintain those forces in a state of readiness for less than 1 per cent of the original cost each year—and I estimate that's what it will cost—it seems a good investment to me. Otherwise our whole investment inevitably goes down the rathole with the attrition of time," Walter said.

Dishonesty and Deceit of Supreme Court Is Becoming Widely Recognized

Why Senate Will Shy Away From Labor Rackets Law

The so-called "investigation" of the UAW strike against the Kohler Company in Wisconsin, with its resultant vandalism, bloodshed and wholesale destruction of private property might just as well never have been held so far as results are concerned.

The Labor Rackets Committee of the Senate worked together effectively in the investigation of the thugs in the Teamsters Union and in other gang-ridden units of the labor movement and uncovered shocking instances of theft, embezzlement and misappropriation of union funds on a mammoth scale.

But when it came to Reuther's hoodlums, the Moscow-trained racketeer was too much for the committee and succeeded in practically smothering it by talking it to death. The mere asking of a simple question by a member of the Committee set off a string of words of excuse and explanation which would run for fifteen or twenty minutes before the Detroit racketeer ran out of breath. His Moscow training came in handy.

As to securing legislation to correct the corruption in labor unions, it is the best thought in Washington that no such legislation can ever pass the Senate for a very simple reason. Reuther has financed so many senatorial campaigns that he practically owns, soul and body, enough senators to keep down any legislation sorely needed along this line.

This is an ugly picture indeed but when this session of Congress ends without any remedial union legislation, it will have been confirmed as an accurate one.

The sordid story of the perfidy and treachery of members of the Supreme Court of the United States in the integration cases back in 1954 is gradually dawning on the people of the country with the result that opposition to the Court's Communist-inspired policy of racial mixing in the schools is stiffening throughout the nation.

Some facts that were hazy and indefinite then are becoming clear now. For instance, the Court was asked to rule only in cases in five states — Virginia, South Carolina, Maryland, Kansas and the District of Columbia.

Because we had never had a Supreme Court in all history composed of men of the type on the present Court, it was easy for them to fool the people who had always trusted, not the members, but the Court itself and who had regarded it as an impeccable body of high class jurists dedicated to the Constitution and the law.

Accordingly, when the Court advanced the theory that it had the right to inflict its twisted, warped and distorted social views on the schools and that they were empowered to proclaim "the law of the land," they got by with it. The general public did not realize that no Court, including the Supreme Court, has continuing jurisdiction nor did they know that the Court can only pass on each case as it comes before them and that their decisions apply only to the case on which they have been asked to rule.

In the 1954 rulings, their jurisdiction began and ended with the five individual cases named above and could not legally be construed as applying to any other. It was when the Court was able to bluff the people into thinking it had the authority to issue a blanket ruling that the Communists jumped into the act and played up the situation for all it was worth.

Sniffing out the Reds on various school boards and in Parent Teacher groups, the Commies had several hundred schools "integrated" before local citizens could get their bearings and decide, on a course of action in keeping with the Rights of the States as guaranteed in the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution.

Even in two of the five original cases on which the Court ruled — in Virginia and South Carolina — the schools ignored the Court's findings and have never integrated and are not going to. Which proves that when the people of the various States have a little courage, backbone and determination to defend their rights there is not one thing the Supreme Court can do about it.

The citizens are wiser now and in many cases they deeply regret jumping in and integrating their schools merely because the Kremlin had ordered that this step be taken. We predict there will be much less hasty action on the matter in the future.

Soviet Propaganda Subtly Woven Into Mammoth Dallas Art Exhibit

From now until May 25, a mammoth art exhibit is being held at Dallas and the bulk of the showing is said to be magnificent. Scattered among the works of authentic artists, however, are Communist, atheistic and perverted offerings, always to be found on such occasions, and which constitute an effective part of Soviet propaganda, and a portion of their hideous plan to contaminate the minds and morals of mankind.

A comprehensive summing up of the subtle propaganda of the Soviets incorporated in the Art Exhibit has been made by Elizabeth Staples of Dallas which we reproduce herewith:

The exhibit, Religious Art of the Western World, currently filling the entire Dallas Museum of Fine Arts, is a very impressive collection. Chief space is allotted to paintings, carvings, altar pieces, and other items which reflect sincere, and sometimes sublime, religious feeling and imagination.

They range, in varying tradition, from Coptic through centuries of Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, Judaic, and Protestant expression. Whether primitive or sophisticated, these works are without exception lucid and honest. Their creators obviously did the best they knew how; even the mistakes they made are endearing, being rooted in a sort of earnest naivete, and laying the foundation (as we now know) for later art development. To view them is to be deeply moved.

Then we come to the wing wherein are housed modernistic representations of Religious Art. Here, the bottom has dropped out of sanity and sincerity.

Let's be specific, and inspect the nearly life-size statue, or effigy, of St. John the Baptist, by Kahlil Gibran. Executed in welded steel pipe, it's a standout in this maniacal collection for its projection of an egregiously corrupt idea. John the Baptist appears as a witless tramp, without enough spirit or personality to have antagonized Herodiade. Clearly, this is acrid, unjustifiable slander. The artist's position has been overstated, to say the least. And in modern art, overstatement (except in caricature) is theoretically banned. This piece is deserving of revision—probably into some good useful plumbing fixtures.

Another gem of effrontery is Salvador Dali's "Assumpta Corpularia Lapislazulina," or "The Bodily Assumption of the Virgin in Blue," which looks like fragments of wall-to-wall freehand drawing combined with bits of photography and a hatful of heterogeneous other scraps, glued to gether indiscriminately. Wild beasts populate the four borders; you may read into them what significance you choose. At center, the Virgin's distorted, elongated body apparently contains a foreshortened, adult Son on the Cross, ready to emerge from her womb. This I submit as the ultimate in vulgarity, and I warn that prolonged con-

templation of this outsize painting may lead to mental imbalance.

Equally offensive is the huge canvas by Abraham Rattner which purports to depict The Last Judgment. Its composition is distinguished by wheels, spots, triangles, streaks, jagged lines, with severed hands and eyes afloat in livid chromatic limbo. Would that it were indeed the last of its dynasty—but, never fear, the palette will again be hurled at unprotesting canvas, perhaps with even greater vituperation, in the future. This sort of thing does not end with "The Last." Forever, there is more.

Behold injury added to insult, in a not-so-large (but large enough) canvas labeled "Crown of Thorns," by Alfred Manessier. The outpouring of this craftsman's psychotic subconscious conveys pain even unto torture. I object, however, to his defining the suffering as that caused by a crown of thorns. Quite as explicit would have been, "Kinetic Study of Colors Assaulting Blurred Vision of Barfly Being Ejected from Bowery Saloon." Close evaluation of this riotous raid on the paint tubes convinces one that the thing was first perpetrated as secular art, later given a sacred twist because—who knows?—it might ride to glory on a wave of religious fervor.

Among many horrendous offerings, the Crucifixion theme is recurrent. In earlier paintings and statues we see the cruel truth treated with sympathy and reverence. Here, in contrast, grotesque, irreverent attitudes prevail. Each Crucifixion is more sneering than its neighbor, more eager to prove the subject a derelict, a degenerate, who merited death on the cross and to hell with it. Those are strong words; I deplore using them; yet language mild and polite will not describe these inhuman, revolting manifestations of the uninhibited atheistic spirit.

A malicious force is rampant in the world today, determined to crush all beauty, law and order, individuality, goodness, sobriety, rationality, and honor. The ruthless power works overtime to stamp out the cumulative achievement of civilization, to infiltrate and eradicate esthetics, government, education—all the values that make life worth living and provide a reason for being.

Here, in this mad, grim section of an otherwise respectable and admirable exhibit (a section which no doubt is merely a beachhead, designed to be magnified, next time, into something truly weird and still more defiant of logical interpretation), here blows the foul breath of dedicated communism, slyly on the job to degrade, confuse, and finally destroy the American mind—which is the Kremlin's declared objective.

In essence, this bold attempt to foist upon a gullible public a slew of monstrosities in the name of legitimate art, must properly be seen and catalogued as just one more strand in the tapestry of a worldwide plot. For this is not art. It is sheer propaganda.

25 Years' Violation of Constitution Is Responsible For Nation's Plight

Because business men and industrial leaders have been so intimidated and browbeaten by those who are supposed to be their public servants in Washington, they have, by and large, become as timid as field mice and are afraid to call their soul their own.

It is for this reason that an exception to the rule is so refreshing. When a business executive remains alert to what is going on in the nation's capital and does not hesitate to speak his piece when the situation warrants, he commands the respect of his fellow Americans everywhere.

Mr. A. G. Heinsohn, Jr., head of the Cherokee Textile Mills in Sevierville, Tennessee, is such a citizen and it can never be said of him that he remained silent or cowered in the corner when the occasion called for some plain talk to fuzzy-brained members of Congress.

Recently a sub-committee of the House Agriculture Committee, headed by Victor L. Anfuso, Democrat of New York, was moved to this profound observation:

"Most American families are not eating as much meat as they would if retail prices were lower or their incomes were higher."

This was too much for the Tennessee industrialist to take so he wrote a communication, copies of which were sent to all members of the sub-committee mentioned. Mr. Heinsohn wrote:

Your committee's findings that more meat would be eaten if prices were lower or incomes higher is so self-evident as to be on the juvenile side. Meat prices, and all other prices, are high because Congress has destroyed the purchasing power of the dollar by plunging us into ruinous debt. Incomes are low because Congress has imposed upon us the confiscatory taxing system recommended by Karl Marx for our self-destruction.

Civil Rights Group To Set Up Gestapo

Psychiatry May Be Useful In Curing Juvenile Delinquency But A Leather Strap's Good Also

The wave of juvenile crime and vandalism by teen-age gangs has become so widespread and alarming that police officials in many cities, including some in Texas, are setting up special details to combat this type of law violation.

It is a tragic and heart-breaking situation but we don't see how we could have expected to avoid what has happened in view of the examples which have been set before these youngsters.

Their brief span of life has been lived in the shadow of wholesale corruption on the part of those chosen to govern us; they have seen labor union thugs bash a strike-breaker's brains out with a blackjack and escape punishment for their crime; they have, in many cases, learned in school that discipline is not important and that a pupil's own desire should decide his course of study, if any; they have been given first-hand lessons in crime over the radio, by television and in the movies; they have had sex information showered down on them from all sides; too often have they absorbed the impression from teachers and preachers that our form of government and way of life is all shot, that minorities are oppressed, that private industry is an evil institution, that patriotic devotion to their own country, pride in their race and personal fastidiousness in the selection of their associates are weaknesses that unfit them for citizenship.

The impact of this immoral instruction and Socialist hog-wash on immature minds and undeveloped intellects has been more than they could assimilate, especially if they did not have the proper parental training and background to resist it, and the result is that we have turned up a generation with more than its full quota of young ghouls who are headed straight for disaster, if not for the electric chair.

Primarily, of course, the blame lies with the parents or guardians for on them, and on them alone, rests the responsibility of formulating the character of our children.

Those who shirk this sacred duty and leave it to educational and religious leaders, of the current variety, are more than likely to have a brace of young radicals turned back on them who will demonstrate their recently acquired distaste for our "Capitalist" economy by going out and shooting up the town.

There is no classroom, pulpit or social agency on earth which can replace a mother's knee as the shrine where children once knelt and where human character was molded, Christian principles instilled and respect for decent behavior implanted.

Realizing the temptation to those of us of the older generation to look back with nostalgic longing on the days of our own childhood and view them through rose-colored glasses, we have tried to summon back in memory that period in our life and contemplate it in its proper perspective.

Taking into consideration a small rural community with limited advantages, restricted communication facilities and no propaganda at all, as weighed against Cosmopolitan centers today with the luxuries of radio, television, movies, space ships, atom bombs and hot rods, we still contend that human nature is the same and that fundamental principles are eternal in their applications.

We probably had as many stinkers, per capita, then as we have today and we are convinced that our cussedness, although expressing itself in a different form, was undoubtedly just as obnoxious as some of the current juvenile misconduct.

Possibly, also, we had frustrations, libidos and complexes in those days but if so, we didn't know them by those names and neither did our parents.

The difference between the two widely-spaced generations was not in the tendency of juvenile minds to resent authority and kick over the traces, but in the forthright and effective manner in which the situation was met and dealt with.

When a young upstart got out of hand, started throwing his weight all around over the place and performed like a hellion generally, he was not taken to a psychiatrist, placed on a couch and tested for his psychological reactions to some post-cradle experience or incident.

Instead, he was escorted to the woodshed, a leather strap was judiciously applied to strategic points of his anatomy and laid on until his frustration had evaporated into thin air, his libido had melted like the morning dew, his complex had gone up in the smoke from the seat of his pants and he was more than ready to begin acting like a civilized human being again.

It was as simple as that and maybe that Judge in an Eastern state who recently suggested the re-instatement of the public whipping-post for taking care of these young hoodlums has hit on the right answer to a serious national problem.

We Wonder If Alger Hiss Is Next On SMU's List

After having invited Communist John Gates to address the students of that institution, the Southern Methodist University seems to have thrown all caution, dignity and discretion to the winds in such matters.

On April 8, the Perkins School of Theology which is a part of Southern Methodist University, had none other than Negro Ralph Bunche to address their group. Later Bunche met with students and faculty on the Southern Methodist University campus and the manner in which addle-pated females cooed and gushed over the Negro is said by observers present to have been a sight calculated to make the angels weep.
