Report of the President:

President Boates begin his report by noting the following message to the Senate.

A MESSAGE TO THE SENATE OF THE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON-  
UNIVERSITY PARK

My fellow students,

The use of student service fees in supporting a unit which does not have the support of the university community and is not required to meet the same expectations as other Student Service Units has reached crisis proportions. At the end of this year, the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at this university will possess a deficit in excess of \$4 million dollars; yet, University leaders are indicating that additional student service fees will be used in reducing the deficit.

The information provided in this message illustrates the growth of this crisis. Additionally, there is information indicating that this crisis is not limited to University Park. Finally, there is information enclosed which allows significant action to be taken by the student leaders at this university to attract public support in decrying the existence of the crisis to our public officials.

Your support of this initiative is absolutely essential. If this body does provide the leadership essential to preventing further attacks on the Student Service Fee, and subsequent decline in essential Student Services, nobody will. Either the Student Senate leads the way, or the students of the University will not be heard and will not be properly represented.

The choice is yours.
