Somewhere in New Guinea  
27 March 1944

Dearest Inez,

Yesterday I received your letter of March 14th, the first since one I mailed Feb 18. I think you handled the bank business okay—I thought I had told you about that, but later wrote you. I gather that you had not received the letters I mailed at our only stop over here. Nor evidently had you received my cablegram. I was glad to get your news, of course and very thankful that you ~~were~~ were all well.

I don't think Andrew and I are in the same sector at all—yet. He is located in Central Pacific Area and we are in the Southwest Pacific Area. Some day, however, we may get together. I'd like to see him very much.

Some of the mail seems to be coming in rather quickly, so I'm hoping that mine will improve. If you ever send a package overseas again, be sure it is registered, to prevent loss enroute. I know of nothing that I need now, however, so I'm not hinting. Our food is plentiful and although as varied as in the States, it's good enough. Hard work makes for an appetite
