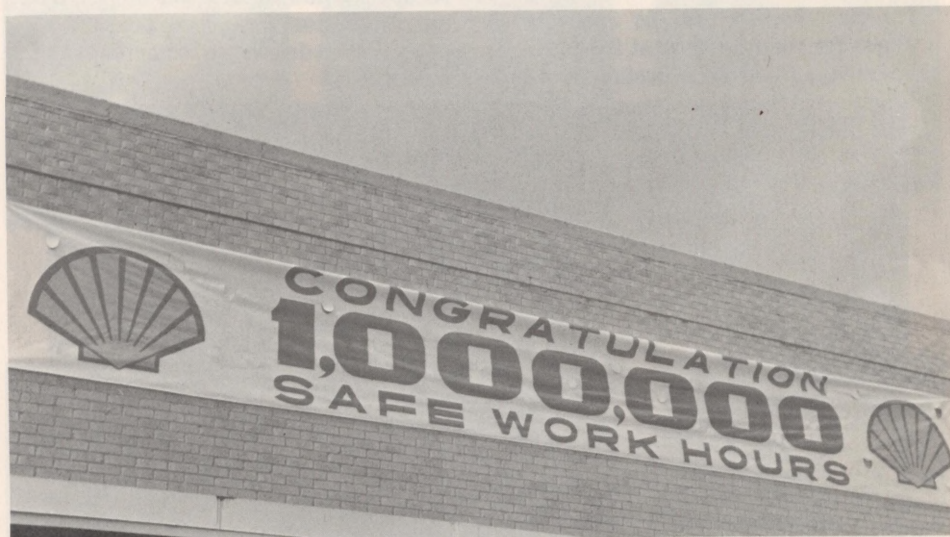
Signs of DPMC safety are plentiful

The most visible reminders of the one million safe hours reached by DPMC North are the congratulatory banners dotting the Complex—such as the one shown on the right.

But there will be other reminders—safety prizes which are now being offered to DPMC North personnel. Among these are a two-gallon safety gas can, a five-pound home fire extinguisher, a smoke detector, a life jacket and an Igloo Playmate cooler.

However, the recognition of DPMC's outstanding safety performance—which included the attainment of two million safe hours by the Complex earlier this month and the reaching of one million safe hours by DPMC South in March—goes far beyond the Complex.

The National Petroleum Refiners Association (NPRA) recently recognized DPMC North and DPMC South for reducing (Occupational Safety and Health Administration)



recordable incident rates by about 35 percent from 1978 to 1979. Recordable injuries are defined by that federal agency as requiring medical attention of more than simple first aid.

The NPRA also recognized DPMC North for having fewer than two

recordable incidents per 200,000 hours worked during (calendar year) 1979.

In addition the NPRA recognized safety records at the chemical plant and refinery at Norco, the Ciniza Refinery, the Odessa Refinery and the Wood River Refinery.

Miller reassigned to Head Office

Dr. David Miller, DPMC medical director, is leaving the Complex Monday to work at Head Office—but his absence will only be temporary.

Marnoy, who only recently went to work for Shell as a regional medical director after being involved in private medical practice in New England for several years. Marnoy was reassigned from Head Office to the DPMC last Monday to learn firsthand about Shell's medical practices at a field location.

Miller, who has been at the DPMC for six years, said he is looking forward to returning to the Complex.

He added that he feels the DPMC medical facility is "one of the best in the area" because management has made it possible to upgrade Complex medical facilities—by supporting such programs as construction of the present dispensary, expanding the medical staff and increasing the availability of nurses' training.

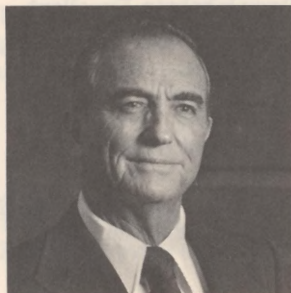
Stock split approved

Meeting in Tulsa recently, Shell Oil Company shareholders approved a two-for-one split of the company's common stock, which is expected to be effective June 6.

At the same meeting, company directors increased Shell's quarterly stock dividend by 17 percent, from 60 to 70 cents a share. The increase is payable June 16 to persons who were shareholders of record on June 6 on a pre-split share basis.

Shell shareholders received a dividend of 60 cents a share in the first quarter of 1980 and \$2.10 a share during (calendar year) 1979.

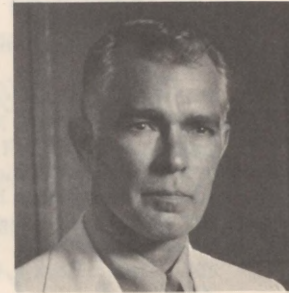

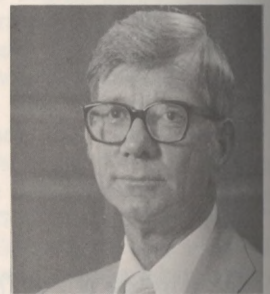
