## A. A. HANDRICK DIES

A. A. Handrick, 57, died Tuesday in a local hospital. He had been in ill health for some time. A veteran of over 31 years with Shell at the time of his retirement from the Refinery in August 1961, Mr. Handrick was a long time resident of Deer Park.

Much of Mr. Handrick's Shell career was associated with the Refinery's Lubricating Oils Department. At the time of his retirement he held the position of Operating Assistant. Previous to that he had served as a Shift Foreman and an operator in the department. His service with Shell dated back to March 1929 when he joined the Company during the construction of the Houston Refinery.

Born in Winchester, Texas, Mr. Handrick attended schools both there and in Houston.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon, April 9, at 2:30 p.m. at the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church on Pasadena Boulevard in Deer Park.

To his family from his many Shell friends an expression of sympathy is extended.
