Dear Sir:

1st: Very impressive ceremonies were held on the 19th, and it was a pleasing and interesting program to all those present. Mr. Paddy delivered his able address in an impressive and pleasing manner. I.M. Terrell, on behalf of the negroes, made an interesting talk that was appropriate.

2nd: The papers did not do justice to the occasion in the write-ups, though I called in on Thursday a reporter from each paper and gave them appropriate data, stating to them that I was doing so in order that they might have the information in advance and be in position to report the event, asking them to give publicity in their Friday issues as to the occasion and report the program as it took place following the ceremonies.

3rd: We are having a Committee meeting this afternoon, at which time it is expected to outline the plan of having the negroes proceed with their effort to provide maintenance.
