

Bill to Change the Appeal Process of Student Traffic Court

Whereas, The Student Traffic Court does not currently have enough time to properly address the amount of appeals submitted to the court, and/

Whereas, students electing to appear in person to the court consumes a large amount of the limited time the court has, and/

Whereas, the written appeal is usually adequate for the court to make a just decision regarding the citation, and does not usually require the student to appear in person, and/

Whereas, currently any further appeals must be proceeded directly to the Dean of Students, and/

Whereas, due process is of the utmost importance to the court, and/

Whereas, a three tiered appellant process will ensure that each student receives due process, /

Therefore, be it enacted by the Senate of the 45th Student Government Association of the University of Houston:

Section 1: Student Traffic Court should amend Section 7 as follows:

Section 7. Procedure for a Student with Proper Decal Who Has Received a Ticket

1. The student submits an appeal in writing.
2. The student can appeal the initial decision and elect to appear before the court.
 - a. If electing to appear, the student must be present at the hearing.
 - b. If the student does not show up the case will be heard on the basis of available evidence.
 - c. The student cannot be represented by counsel who appears in place of the student.
3. The student can appeal the decision of the court to the Dean of Students.

Section 2: Student Traffic Court should amend section 9 as follows:

Section 9. Appeals

1. An appeal can be submitted in writing on the appropriate form to the office of the Assistant Dean of Students within five class days of the court's decision only after the student has appeared before the court.
4. The decision by the Assistant Dean of Student is final and may not be appealed further.

SGA Resolution in Support of an E-mail Notification System for Traffic Citation

Whereas, traffic citations are placed on the outside of vehicles, and

Whereas, natural forces such as wind and rain can misplace or destroy tickets, and/

Whereas, students have complained that their tickets have been taken from their vehicle and as a result were unaware of their citation, and/

Whereas, traffic fines double after forty-eight hours, and/

Whereas, students must appeal all citations with-in twenty one days of issuance, and/

Whereas, due process requires that students are aware of their parking citation, and/

Whereas, the University of Houston uses the internet as their primary form of communication and every student is issued an e-mail address, and/

Whereas, issuing a citation on the vehicle and e-mailing the student will place the responsibility on the student to either pay or appeal the ticket/

Therefore, be it resolved by the Senate of the 45th Student Government Association of the University of Houston:

Section 1: That, the Parking and Transportation Department look into acquiring software that will support e-mailing students when their vehicle is issue a parking citation
