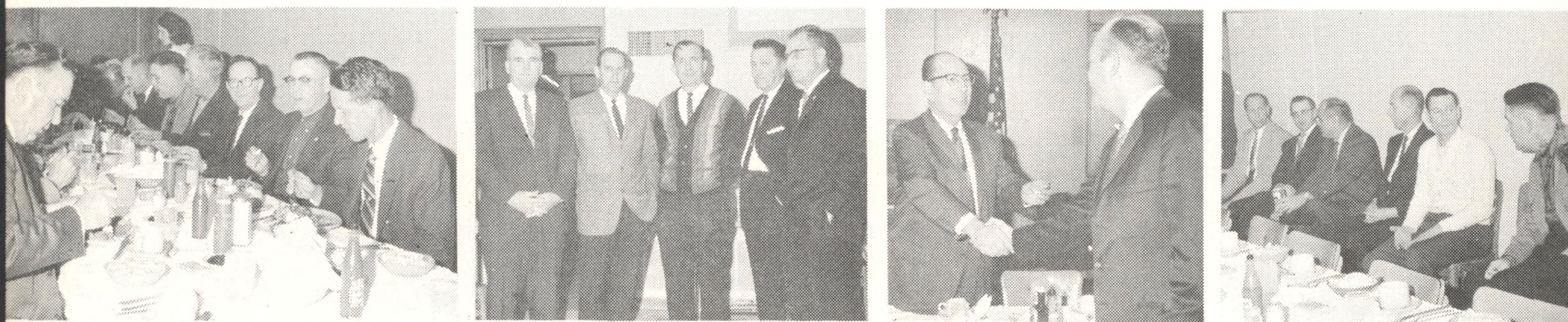

HOUSTON AREA E. & P. DUE TO GET NEW VICE PRESIDENT: E. G. CHRISTIANSON

J. E. Clark, Executive Vice President of Shell Oil Company, has announced that E. G. Christianson, General Manager of Information and Computer Services, New York, will be nominated Vice President, Houston Exploration and Production Area.

Since September, 1962, the Houston Area has been managed by Porter Bristol, Vice President, Midland Exploration and Production Area, who has maintained headquarters in both Midland and Houston. Mr. Bristol will resume full time duties as Vice President, Midland Exploration and Production Area about March 1.

Bristol served previously in Houston between 1944 and 1951 as Division Manager and later as Production Manager. He then was transferred to the Tulsa Area, where he became Vice President in 1954. He was appointed Vice President, Midland Area, in 1958. Bristol has been with Shell since 1930, when he graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a B.S. degree in petroleum engineering.

Ed Christianson joined Shell in 1938 as an Exploitation Engineer at Houston, after receiving his Bachelor's degree in mining engineering from the University of Wisconsin. He served in several assignments as an

Exploitation Engineer in Texas and Louisiana. In 1953, he was transferred in the same capacity to the Company's Head Office and later that year went on assignment in the Hague. Christianson was named Chief Exploitation Engineer for the Denver Area in 1954, and then returned to the New York office where he became Manager, Economics Department, Exploration and Production. In 1962, he assumed his present position.
