


## *Foreword . . .*

## *Tribute . . .*

**H**AILED today as the fastest growing division of the University of Houston, the General College has shown great progress. The first classes were held in Spetember, 1934 in the Educational Building of the Second Baptist Church. In 1935 classes were moved to the South Main Baptist Church. Dr. W. W. Kemmerer is the director, assisted by Mr. Murray A. Miller.

Introducing a new type of education, the work of the General College is grouped into four divisions, including in their scope the major branches of human knowledge. These divisions are designated as follows: the Social Sciences, the Biological Sciences, the Physical Sciences, and Language and Fine Arts. The purpose of the broad divisions is to bring together in their true place the naturally related but academically dissociated studies that compose the usual college curriculum.

The Faculty of the General College is composed partly of professors who have classes in both the day and night branches of the University and partly of full time General College professors.

This annual pays tribute to those professors and students who were pioneers in this new field of education. **PIONEERS!** *Our hats are off to you.*







WITHOUT a doubt the most prominent and active club in the General College. The Music Study Club has provided a source of universal appeal that has never yet been equaled in the Day School.


Meetings are held once a week. Following the business session a musical program is given. The programs are presented to the students in an interesting fashion.


## RED MASQUE PLAYERS

Listed among the clubs social functions were a dance and a picnic.


