ALICE PAUL, CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL WOMAN'S PARTY

Miss Paul is the demure little Quaker who in five years formed an organization of 50,000 women and raised half a million dollars for the passage of Federal Suffrage Amendment. She established the policy of holding the power in power responsible for the passing of the measure, made suffrage a national political issue, and is now demanding that suffrage be passed before the Senate recesses.

In calling for volunteers for the December 16 protest demonstration in Washington, Miss Paul said:

"It takes the protests of a few women a long, long time to accomplish what the protests of many women could accomplish instantly. Two women and two women protesting day by day are better than no women at all demanding justice for the women of this nation. But a thousand women magnify that demand."
