

Houston Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> 1888

We the undersigned County Surveyor and City Engineer hereby certify that on the 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> days of Nov 1888, did make survey of the West Boundary Line of the City of Houston, Beginning at the N.W. Corner of the said city limits a Granite Monument 10" x 10" marked N.W.C. and established by E. Fairfax Gray City Engineer and filed for record in the County Clerk Dec 1874, in Book 13, folio 657, thence with a variation of N 90° 10' retraced the old line checking on all points as referred to by Gray to a 10" x 10" granite Monument in Mahan field marked N.C. thence to a stake in San Felipe road. Leaving temporary stakes at all prominent crossings, such as Bayous, Railroad, and principal streets, and find that said line as established by E. Fairfax Gray is substantially correct, and recommend its adoption, as per accompanying sketch.
