Dear Sir:

I made an appointment with Mr. Maurice Sullivan yesterday and went over the ground plan sketches and elevations with him, making certain suggestions about location and construction to better conform with the ideas in view.

Mr. Sullivan will now proceed to revise both and after doing so resubmit. As I will probably be away when such are resubmitted, I would suggest if Dr. Slaughter can spare the time to do so that he review the plans before they come to me and submit any suggestions which he has to offer based on his experience and knowledge of the requirements, the plans and Dr. Slaughter's letter to then be forwarded to me for further and I hope final consideration.

In connection with the above, it will, of course, be kept in mind that my knowledge or experience regarding hospital requirements is limited. I would expect that before the final plans are completed the best available authority on the question of technical and practical requirements for hospital service be secured from some local source competent to give best advice. I have particularly in mind the location of the heating system, the lighting fixtures, the wall covering, size and location of operating room, dining room, kitchen, etc.

I understand from Mr. Sullivan that no provisions are made in hospitals for laundry service, hence take it that all that would be required in the basement would be the heating and refrigerating plants.
