children Mahala, Peter Washington,
and Milly. Also a lot of ground
in the town of Nacogdoches, adjoin-
ing the lot on which is situated
my fathers residence (Judge Clark's)
and due West thereof, a more par-
ticular description thereof may be seen
in a deed from James I. Bryan and Mary
Ann Bryan executors of Simpson Shep-
herd to my husband Richard S. Walker
recorded in Book N pages 144 & 145 Nac-
ogdoches County records. - Also a
family carriage, and pair of brown
carriage horses, and a buggy. -
The property herein set forth, to-
wit the slaves, Aleck, Henry, Ellen
and her children, the lot, car-
riage, buggy and horses, have
been acquired by me as my Sep-
arate property by deeds of con-
veyance from my husband afore-
said, setting the same apart from
our Community estate as my sole
and Separate property, which deeds
are duly recorded in Nacogdoches
County records of deeds, to which
reference is made.

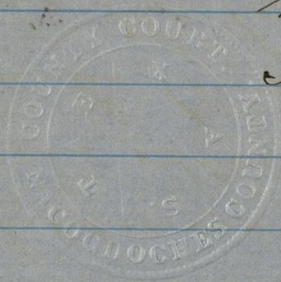
