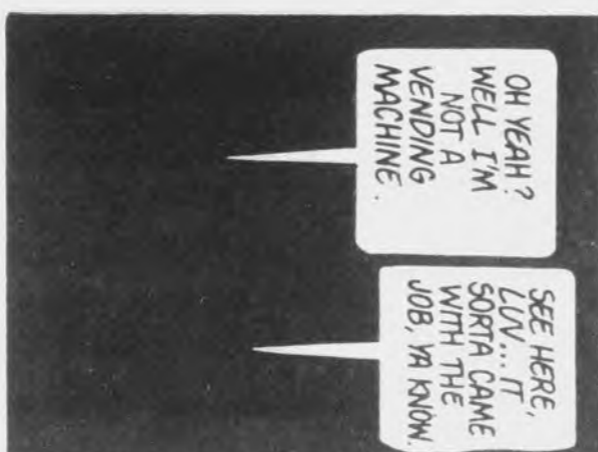
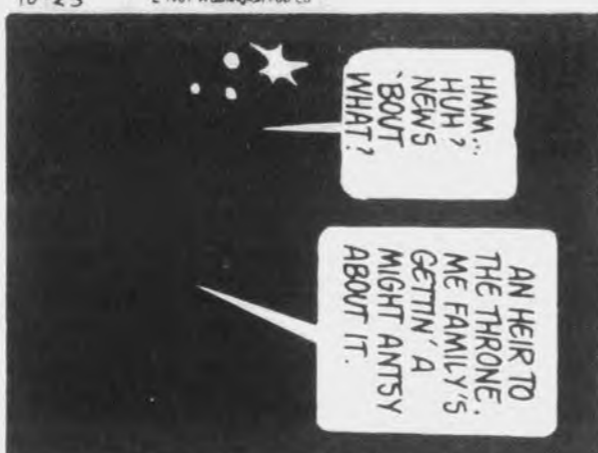

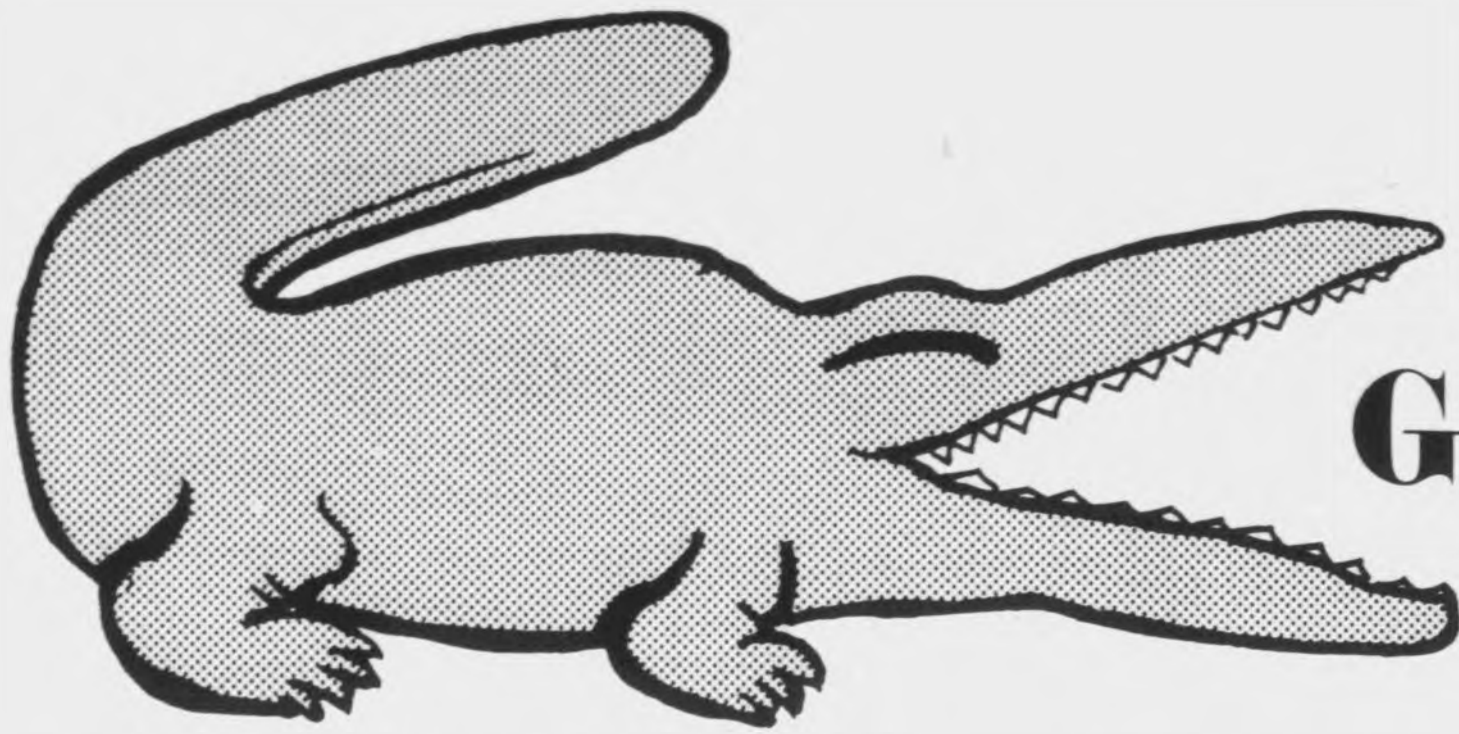

# Marching band hears new drummer

The University of Houston's first-year marching band director, citing growing apathy among members of the Cougar Band and continuing ridicule from university students, decided yesterday to adopt a Nazi format for the band in order to enforce discipline and school spirit among "disgruntled members who have subversive ideas" about what the band should be doing.

"This will mark my complete takeover," band director Gregory Talford said to a stunned Cougar Band at Thursday's practice. "Bill Moffit is no longer. I am your shepherd and you are my flock. All hail the new chief baton."

Moffit was UH band director for eleven years before deciding to take a similar position with Purdue University on Aug. 3. Talford was selected to replace Moffit after serving three years as Western Michigan University's band director.

Talford then told the gathered band members what would be required of them in the immediate future.

"My faithful Kamerads, who have understood mein dream from the very start of mein leadership, will give Sie new uniforms, replacing das morsche Dreck of die past. These uniforms will give Sie prride to be a Coogarr, what ve say Stolz.

"Das uniforms will rezemble dat Texas A um M, yah? But ve vill have bands on zi arms that spruce up it good, mit symbol of Coogarr purity and loyalty, yah."

"Mein countrymen," Talford continued, "No more nasty words about mich. Ve have like enemy...dat of bad Musik. Ve vill make verbanen von Volk dat nein befolgen (follow)."

Talford then showed the band the new step it will use during the halftime show. It closely resembled that of the

Nazi goose-step, and some of the huskier band members apparently had trouble raising their legs high enough to please Talford. Talford pointed these members out to his "lieutenants," who quickly took them to a room in Melcher Gym.

It was rumored that these band members were forcibly moved to the Baylor School of Medicine for tests.

Talford's declaration had

Dr. Robert Jobe, associate director of the UH School of Music, unconcerned.

"I always knew Greg would turn out to be the inspired leader that he is now," Jobe said. "We selected him for his well-organized mind and his steady hand. The band's discipline was slacking off a little before Bill (Moffit) left, and Greg had some trouble getting them in line when he

first came on. But things are beginning to improve. These kids will know who's boss."

## Woman wins lawsuit versus national insurance company

Austin (AP) — The wife and mother of a man who died after tying a rope around his neck to increase his sexual pleasure while masturbating are entitled to his accidental death insurance benefits, the Texas Supreme Court ruled Wednesday.

Kathern Tommie, the wife, and Edith Jones were co-beneficiaries of Jerry Lee Tommie's \$120,000 group policy with Connecticut General Life Insurance Co.

A Collin County trial court and Texarkana Court of Civil Appeals ruled in their favor, and the Supreme Court upheld those rulings Wednesday.

Connecticut General had argued that the death of Tommie, 33, was the result of a self-inflicted injury or disease.

While Mrs. Tommie was out shopping, according to court records, Tommie dressed in her wig, bra, panties and night gown and

looped a nylon exercise rope around his neck, which was protected by a pad. Tommie placed the other end of the rope over the top of a door and tied it around his left foot.

With his foot and the use of pulleys he was able to increase or decrease the pressure of the rope on his neck.

Medical testimony at the trial said the object was to increase the intensity of the orgasm during masturbation by reducing the supply of blood and oxygen to the brain.

It appeared, the appeals court said, that Tommie blacked out or otherwise lost his balance and the full force of his 200 pounds jerked the rope, killing him. The jury ruled the death an accident.

In affirming the jury verdict, the appeals court said there was "abundant evidence" that Tommie "aside from his propensity to unusual sexual practices, was a well-adjusted, happy individual who was looking forward to the future, and that he did not intend to commit suicide."

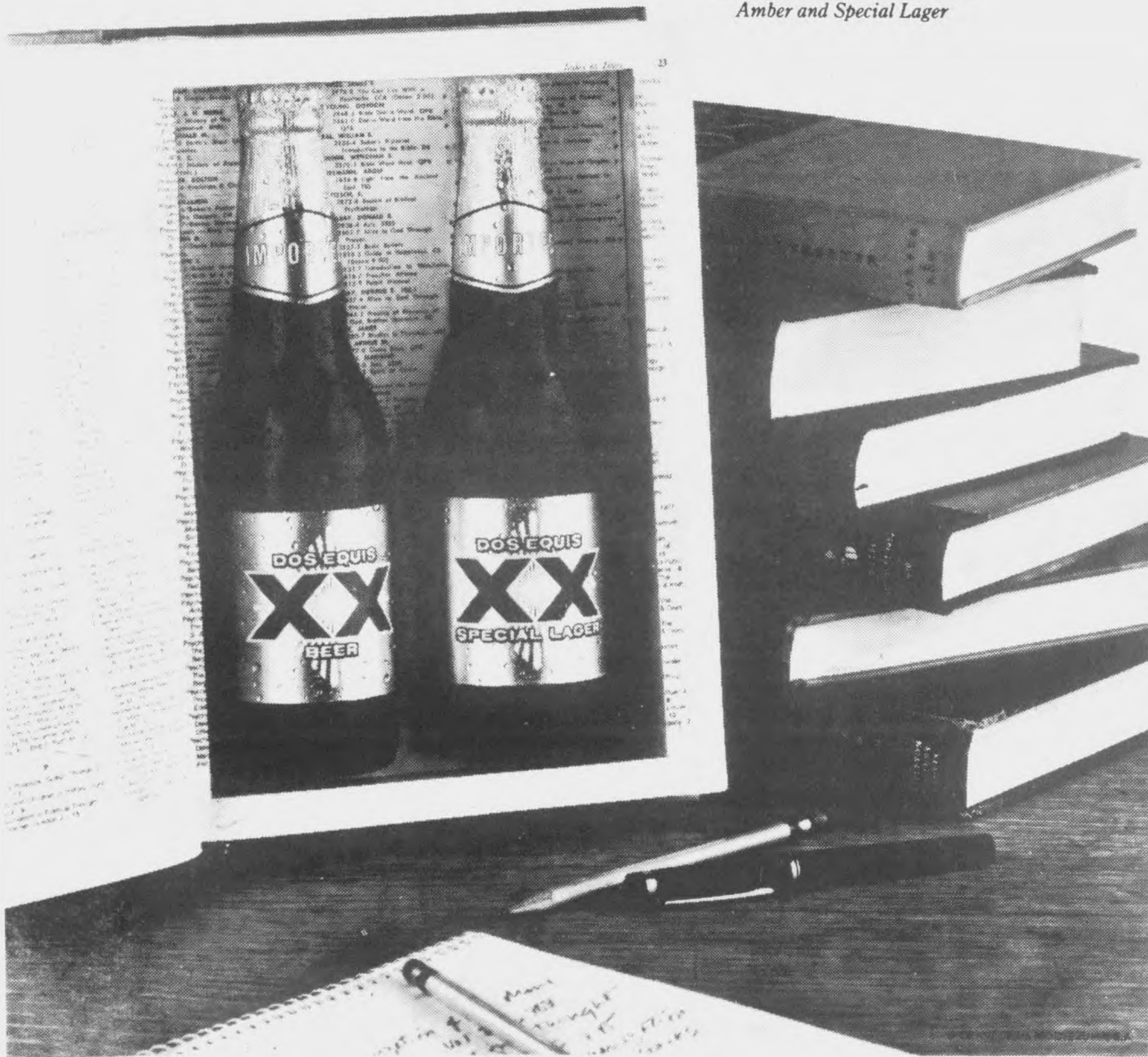
Although medical testimony described Tommie as having "transvestite tendencies," the appeals court said, he did not have a "disease" in the "medical or ordinary sense of the word."

# UHPD to begin impounding people who illegally stand

As of Nov. 2, 1981 all persons found standing in unauthorized areas will be impounded by the UH Police Department.

UHPD officials cite hampered accessibility for handicapped students as well as blockage of fire escapes and building stairways as the reason for the action. John Miller, assistant chief of police, said, "Students have got to realize that just because this is a university doesn't mean they can start standing around anywhere they want to."

All impounded people will be taken to UHPD headquarters located in the Stadium Annex Building.

Relatives of the confiscated individual must show proof of ownership by either a birth certificate or drivers license before their loved one will be returned. The next-of-kin will also be required to pay a \$5.00 improper-standing-around fine. Any person left unclaimed over 30 days will be turned over to the University Center for public auction.

Police spokesman Dennis Buffington said, "The UH Physical Plant is planning to have a new racks out as soon as possible to accommodate the various shapes and sizes of people who were previously standing around illegally."

Buffington also feels the policy could help curtail the current rash of people thefts. "When the people are out in public view they are less likely to be stolen," Buffington said.

Officer Daniel Okabayashi said, "About two people a week are stolen, mainly from the Moody Towers and the Library."

Officer Glenn Albright commented, "They tend to take people that are easily accessible so they can make a quick get-a way. They then usually strip the body and sell the parts."

Buffington encourages all people to help reduce thefts by having some identification engraved for free. "Just bring your body over to the Stadium Annex," Buffington adds.

Detective Terry J. Welch said, "Most people are ripped off between lunch and supper; that's noon and six p.m., for those who don't eat."

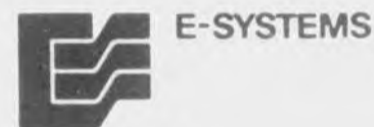

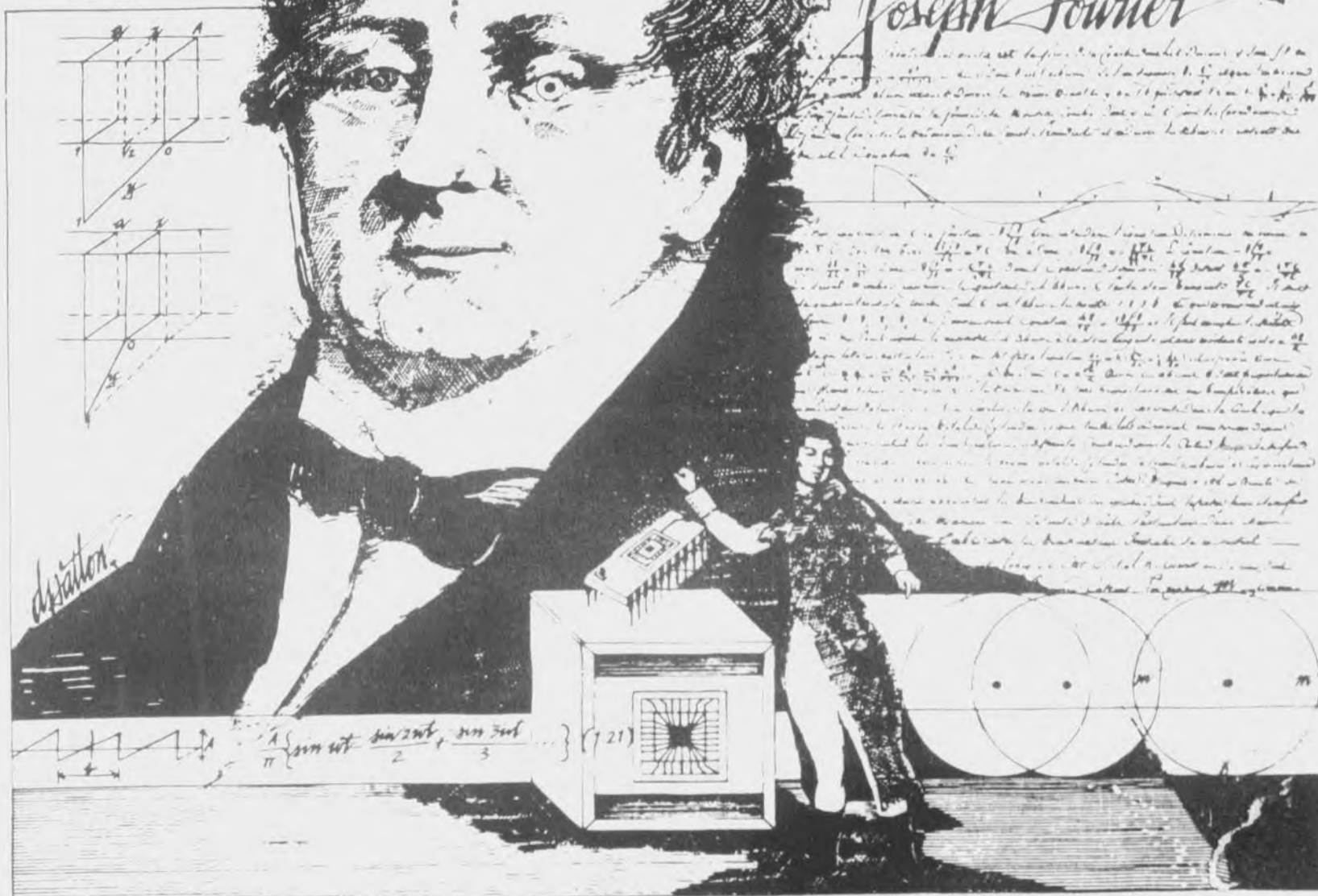

# Yaney leads coup on SA Senate floor

The UH Students Association was taken over last night in a military style coup by SA president Steve Yaney along with his three lieutenants; Mark Gibson, Barry Norwood, and Nat Adams.

In a communique delivered to the Cougar offices by Director of Information Norwood, Yaney

declared himself the new "Great White Father" of UH students and should from now on be treated as such.

The communique read in part, "More than anything else, UH students need guidance and love. I have taken the burden of decision-making out of their hands, leaving their minds free to hear my message. I will from

now on be in charge of their hearts, minds and souls, and income as I well should be."

At dawn, the bodies of former SA vice president Tony Esparza, and ex-senators Don Atherton and Carl Chanin were found hanging from the Tower of Cheyenne in front of the M.D. Anderson Library. Stapled to their chests were notes that

read, "Counter-revolutionary pigs."

When asked why the three were executed Yaney said, "They were all three fine students, good guys. I personally liked all three. But there was just no place for them in the new government."

The coup occurred at a special meeting of the SA senate called by Yaney. Former Speaker of the Senate Robert Lusk said,

"He told us he was calling the meeting to congratulate us for acting like grown-ups at the last senate meeting. He was going to shake all our hands. Everybody showed up."

Lusk related that at exactly 7:15 p.m. the four showed up. They were wielding the college transcripts of each senator. They told us if we didn't cooperate, they'd show the records to our relatives. We had no choice. We had to cooperate."

They were then all herded into the center of the room and addressed by Yaney.

Yaney said, "Don't get me wrong, I like you all and think you're nice people. But let's face it, who needs you?"

According to Lusk, Yaney told them if they behaved like good little boys and girls, the transcripts would be locked up. "If any of you step out of line, you will be spanked by

my newly appointed Master of Discipline, Nat Adams," Yaney was reported as saying.

Steve Scholl, Todd Fine, Dennis Feters and Kent Nunez of Program Council are being held in a makeshift holding tank in the unfinished area of the UC underground. Yaney announced, "As of last night, Program Council has been disbanded. Some of its former members are being deprogrammed and will be released as soon as the process is complete. These are nice boys, and they all come from good families. They just got a hold of some bad drugs somewhere along the line."

Yaney announced that in the future, channel six would run 24 hours a day, its programming limited to Jimmy Stewart movies. "Stewart's my favorite," said Yaney. "I like him, he's great." Adams asked, "I'm a lot like Stewart, don't you think?"

Students were asked how they felt about the coup. Eighty-five percent answered, "What's Students Association?" Ten percent said, "Who cares?" The other five percent could not be found and their parents have notified the police of their disappearance.
